### Java Stopping: May 31 to be Rt. 66 Java Stop's Final Day

The Route 66 Java Stop in Dwight will serve its last cup of coffee on Sunday, May 31. The drive-through shop, which has sold specialty coffee beverages, smoothies, snacks and souvenirs since it opened in December 2006, is closing because it has been decided to sell the business and property.

"I'm really appreciative of all our local support," said Michelle Rub of The Java Stop. "We've had people who would come in two or three times a day.'

The Java Stop's closure was announced late last month, and the shop's hours were cut to weekends only after May 10. The Java Stop's last days in operation will be Saturday, May 30, and Sunday, May 31, from 7 a.m. to 5 p.m. both days. Customers can purchase bulk items, such as bags of coffee beans, bottles of flavored syrup, etc. on Sunday.

The Java Stop gained a strong local customer base during its two and a half

years in business, in addition to becoming an attraction for travelers on Route 66. The colorfully painted building is an advertisement in itself, and Rub said many visitors have stopped to take their pictures in front of the build-

"We've definitely had travelers from all over the world," Rub said, noting that visitors have represented countries including Spain, Germany and New Zealand. Tourists were able to write their names and home locations on a sign at the shop.

Last year, The Java Stop even became a wedding photo backdrop for two Route 66 enthusiasts from Schaumburg who were married at the 1932 Standard Oil station in Odell.

The Java Stop is also featured on several Route 66 travel websites.

Rub doted on the "great, enthusiastic" workers who have been employed by the shop. Java Stop employees created a Relay for Life

### DTHS Board Moves to Retain All Co-op Offerings with GSW

Following months of consideration and controversy, the DTHS Board of Education voted contrary to the recommendation of football coaches and conference committee members and elected to continue the co-op with Gardner South Wilmington High School in all sports currently shared between the two schools. The recommendation had been to drop the DTHS/GSW co-op in football while retaining all other co-op offerings.

Earlier this year, the school also looked at alternative conference options. Driving the desire to make conference and co-op changes in the current athletic programs was concern that DTHS has lost its competitive edge in the football program due to school size. Currently without including the enrollment of GSW, the Trojans have the smallest school population in the Interstate Eight Conference. However, by adding the GSW enrollment, the Trojan football team is placed in the larger, more competitive 3A playoff division. As many schools in the I-8 are growing rapidly while the DTHS population

However, many board members believe continuing the co-op with Gardner in all sports, including football, enhances the Dwight program and offers positive opportunities for students from both districts. Growing the football program and making it stronger seemed a better alternative to some board members than keeping it small in order to be in a smaller, possibly more competitive playoff league.

"We are playing the same teams (in regular season) regardless of the co-op," said Board President Irv Masching. "We need to build the program and not worry about the play-

Board member, Kim Rodosky expressed her thoughts on growing the sports programs. "Let's get the kids excited about playing a sport. Let's involve everybody. Two or three kids don't make a

"The board feels that we are the smallest school in the conference, and any students we can pick up from Gardner will help us over the long haul," Superintendent Dale Adams told The Paper. "Dwight has not been a consistent playoff team to warrant the concern at this stage.'

President Masching and board members Kim Rodosky, Gerald Earing, Brian Perschnick and Paul Ferrari voted to retain the current DTHS/GSW co-op Board member offerings. Kathy Perry opposed the move. Amy Hansen was not present at

the meeting. In other sports action, following a closed session evaluation of coaches, the board elected not to renew the head varsity boys basketball coaching assignment.

'The board felt we needed to make a coaching assignment change in order to address issues brought forth by parents," Adams told The Paper.

The position has been posted. One requirement is the candidate must be an employee of the DTHS District or live within the district boundaries. The former coach was not a district employee and lived outside of the community.

The rationale was in order to have better communication with players, the coach needs to be in the community," said Adams.

Other coaching changes include moving Chris Moeller up to JV volleyball coach and naming Julie Jensen as freshman volleyball coach. This change was due to the resignavolunteer assistant football and basketball/competitive cheerleading coach, taking the place of Kandi Nelson. All other current coaching assignments were approved to continue asis for the 2009-10 school year.

Two new faces will greet DTHS students in the classroom next school year. The board approved employing Mark Fiske as art teacher. Mr. Fiske is a graduate of Olivet Nazarene University and has teaching experience Kankakee High School. Fiske will take the place of Bill Skridulis, who is retiring at the close of this school year.

"Fiske is a practiced artist and has passion for educating students," Adams told the

Nicole Dunnill will replace Barbara McKeever as Spanish instructor. Ms. Dunnill, who spends her summer months teaching migrant workers, earned a bachelor's degree from ISU and a master's from

Olivet Nazarene University. "She is an experienced teacher who is very confident," said Adams.

One more significant maintenance project received board approval. Along with phase one of the roof replacement and resurfacing of the track slated for this summer, the board approved a stadium renovation project. A bid of \$36,750 from Bill Abraham Mason and Concrete from Pontiac was accepted. project will entail re-bricking of the wall at the front of the west stadium. The new 8" thick brick wall will feature a poured concrete top.

The board considered other options, such as a concrete wall or making a dropped walkway, to eliminate obstructed view created by fans walking to and from seats. However, structural needs along with a desire to retain the current, traditional look of the stadium won the bid for Abraham.

The board also expressed interest in investigating options for new washroom facilities at the athletic field. Adams will seek options and estimates for presentation to the board.

Based on information obtained in a Well Site Survey, published in 1992 by the Illinois EPA, one potential source, route, or possible problem site was identified within the survey area of Gardner's wells. Furthermore, information provided by the Leaking Underground Storage Tank Section of the Illinois EPA indicated several additional sites with ongoing remediation which may be of concern. The Illinois EPA has determined that the Gardner Community Water Supply's source water is not susceptible to contamination. This determination is based on a number of criteria including: monitoring conducted at the wells; monitoring conducted at the entry point to the distribution system; and the available hydrogeologic data on the wells. Furthermore, in anticipation of the U.S. EPA's proposed Ground Water Rule, the Illinois EPA has determined that the Gardner Community Water Supply is not vulnerable to viral contamination. This determination is based upon the evaluation the following criteria during the Vulnerability Waiver Process: the community's wells are properly constructed with sound integrity and proper site conditions; a hydrogeologic barrier exists which should prevent pathogen movement; all potential routes and sanitary defects have been mitigated such that the source water is adequately protected; monitoring data did not indicate a history of disease outbreak; and the sanitary survey of the water supply did not indicate a viral contamination threat. Because the community's wells are constructed in a confined aquifer, which should prevent the movement of pathogens into the wells, well hydraulics were not considered to be a significant factor in this vulnerability determination. Hence, well hydraulics were not evaluated for this groundwater supply.






