## Saunemin Gym Nearing Completion

Saunemin is closing in on the final stages of its new joint gymnasium and community fitness center expected to open November 1.

Workers broke ground in December on the \$1.5 million, approximately 13,000-square-foot structure added onto the south side of the current Saunemin Grade School, which is on the south side of Route 116.

"It's getting there," said Mike Stoecklin, Saunemin Grade School athletic director and fifth grade teacher. "It's going to be unbelievable."

The wood floor is expected to arrive this week and needs several days to become acclimated to a controlled climate, he said. The final parts for the bleacher system should be installed this week.

Talks for a new gymnasi-

um first began after the school's current gymnasium, which stands alone across the road from the grade school on the north side of Route 116, sustained significant water damage during heavy rains and flooding in January 2008.

The gymnasium portion of the building will include locker rooms, restrooms, a mechanical room and a lobby and concessions area.

Plans for the fitness center include an office, a storage area, a separate community room and about 1,500 square feet of floor space for fitness equipment.

The school's current gymnasium, which used to be attached to the old Saunemin High School before it was torn down in 1987, is only used for sporting and special events. The school's approximately 145 students in grades pre-k through eight currently exer-

## New Dwight Pamida Store Open for Business

Dwight's new Pamida store opened for business Monday, October 12.

Located at 110 Watters Drive, the Pamida store is just over 27,000 square feet and offers a wide variety of items. The store opened at 8 a.m. Monday with "dignitary shopping" for local business people and officials by invitation only; at 9 a.m., the store opened to the public for the first time. A grand opening celebration will be held Friday, October 30.

"I'm very excited," said Store Team Leader Connie Buberle. "I think that the community really needs this store."

The new Pamida offers a pharmacy and over-the-counter medications. There is a pharmacy waiting area with leather chairs and a children's table. Additional departments include health and beauty, greeting cards, food, liquor, paper goods and chemicals, pet care, sporting goods, toys, domestics, automotive, housewares, kitchen, small appliances, furniture, seasonal, crafts and stationery, dairy, a "destination shop" for holiday items, shoes, accessories, clothing, electronics, books and magazines and a small hardware department.

"The big plus for Dwight

is that they can now come here to buy clothes," Buberle said. The store offers children's, juniors, mens, ladies and intimates departments, including some plus-sized items.

Items for sale in the electronics department include televisions, DVD players, home theater systems, game systems, cell phones and accessories, a mini laptop computer and more.

There are also leather armchairs in the book and magazine department for those who wish to sit and read for a while, perhaps while a companion is shopping.

"I think it's going to be a great plus for the people who live here, not only in the fact that we have such a wide assortment of merchandise, but also because Pamida is very big on community involvement," Buberle stated. She explained that the Pamida Foundation has given the store an increment of money, which will be donated to local organizations on the day of the grand opening.

"We are asked to have some type of community involvement every week," Buberle said.

The store will also have a senior discount day at least one Thursday each month, when the store will open an

hour earlier than usual, at 8 a.m., and people age 55 and older can get a 15 percent discount on many selected items.

Flu shots will also be given at Dwight Pamida on Monday, October 19.

The groundbreaking for the new store was September 5, 2008. Although completion of the building took a bit longer than originally expected, Buberle said everything has been running on schedule since July, when Dwight Pamida's 24 employees started training and began stocking the store.

Buberle said Pamida's employees are the greatest asset of the store.

"I think the people we have here are the best part," she said. "We did a lot of interviews, and we chose people who share the same ideas as Pamida – customer service, giving back to the community and just trying to make this the most positive experience we can for people who walk through the front door."

Pamida will be open every day of the year except Christmas and Easter. Store hours are 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily. Pharmacy hours are 9 a.m. to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday, 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. Saturday, and closed Sunday. The new store can be reached at 815-584-9566.

## Volunteers, Input Sought for New Dwight Teen Center

Plans are underway for the Dwight Teen Center.

The center, which will be located at 158 and 160 E. Main Street, will serve teens age 13 through high school seniors and will offer a variety of programs, trips, community service projects, dances, vocational exploratory programs and more, according to Teen Center President Dawn Sutton. The goals of the center are to build the relationship between teenagers and adults in the community while providing a safe, productive environment for teens.

Sutton addressed the Dwight Village Board at its September 28 meeting to announce progress in planning the center.

"Mayor Wilkey stood up and gave his blessing," Sutton said.

Although the center will

have time for recreational activities such as video game playing, teen center Vice President Tracy Deterding said, "It's more of a learning center."

Sutton added, "It's not just a hangout. You're not going to be able to go out the front door and out the back door." She explained that there will be a membership fee, and only members will be allowed at the center. The center will be under constant adult supervision.

Teen Center Adult Board members Sutton, Deterding, Jim Kinnamon, Kim Csecsinovits and Meagan Kolthoff are currently working with teens, parents and community officials to gather ideas and gain community cooperation. A Teen Board is also working toward the same goals while planning the center's decor, which is set to include a mural, black lights and a disco ball.

In regard to the opening

date of the center, Sutton said, "We are shooting for before Christmas."

Teen Center organizers are seeking input from teens, parents and community members to learn what is specifically desired in a Dwight Teen Center.

"We want to get the community involved," Deterding said.

Teens wishing to participate in planning the teen center are welcome to do so, and adult volunteers are wanted. Volunteers will need to go through a screening process, Sutton said.

Donations of items and monetary donations are also being accepted. Monetary donations may be directed to the Dwight Teen Center account at Bank of Dwight, with checks made payable to "Dwight Teen Center."

## Heritage Woods to Open in Late November

Seniors moving into Heritage Woods of Dwight will have just enough time to digest Thanksgiving dinner before making the move into the brand new facility.

The two-story, 68-unit building located at 710 E. Mazon Ave., just east of the mini storage, will offer studio or one-bedroom apartments for residents 65 or older.

Construction began in January on the \$8 million facility, and it's on track to open its doors the weekend after Thanksgiving, said Market-ing Director Jodi Jensen.

The parking lot was recently surfaced with black-top. Inside, workers are finishing drywall, wall coverings and completing floor coverings and equipment installation in the next few weeks.

Additionally, on-site managers are in the process of hiring their different department directors and then recruiting local service staff in healthcare and non-health related positions.

A community open house will take place once the facility opens.

Prior to that, people can obtain more information including pricing, floor plans and decoration samples at

the facility's temporary sales office that has been established at 212 E. Mazon Ave.

"Heritage Woods of Dwight is an affordable assisted lifestyle available for seniors 65-plus who want to remain independent yet need some assistance with everyday living," Jensen said. "Residents have their own private apartments and get to enjoy a variety of social and recreational programs in order to enrich their daily lives and overall well-being."

The facility is an alternative to those who have been struggling alone at home or thinking of moving to a nursing home, or especially for those who have been paying for private home nursing.

People who have already signed on to move in can gather at a "meet your neigh-

bor" event Thursday, October 15, at the Country Mansion.

Heritage Woods of Dwight will operate under BMA Management LTD, of Bradley, and will employ about 35 people in a variety of health and non-health related positions. Applications are still being accepted at the temporary sales office.

# People Need to Get Flu Vaccines, Experts Stress

People should get flu vaccines wherever they can find them, say experts at the Livingston County Health Department.

The Livingston County Health Department is currently out of the seasonal flu vaccine, said Linda Rhodes, health education and marketing director at the health department, and she's not sure when another shipment may come in.

In Dwight, locations to be vaccinated include doctor's offices; at the new Pamida store from 9:30 a.m. to 11:30 a.m. Oct. 19; or daily at Doc's Drugs.

"At the present time, we're giving the standard seasonal flu shots and we are in particular doing it on an everyday basis," said Richard Schwartz, pharmacist in charge at Doc's Drugs. "It's definitely recommended. The seasonal flu shot changes from year to year, so people have to get it every

year."

Doc's is open from 9 a.m. to 6:30 p.m. during the week and 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. on Saturday. They do not administer the shot for people under the age of 14.

Medicare pays for the shot for seniors. If a person has insurance, they just need to pay the co-pay. Without insurance, the shot is \$25.

The shot is made with egg, so people with allergies or who take immunosuppressant drugs should consult a physician.

Schwartz isn't sure if or when Doc's will be receiving a shipment of the swine flu vaccine.

"In a week or so they'll be releasing more information

about swine flu," Schwartz said. "It's so sketchy as to who's going to get the first available injections."

The swine flu vaccine comes in one of two ways: a nasal spray mist of live virus that can only be used by healthy people ages two to 49; or an injection of a dead virus for pregnant women, seniors, babies and people with compromised immune systems.

Livingston County Health Department workers expect their first shipment of the H1N1 nasal vaccine to come in the next week or so, and they'll begin administering it at a clinic tentatively scheduled for the last week of October.

Following the CDC guide-

lines, Rhodes said the initial round will be reserved for three groups of people: healthy adults who are healthcare workers who are under 50 years of age; healthy adults under age 50 who provide day-care for children who are less than six months of age; and healthy people ages two through ages 24.

Unlike the seasonal flu, the swine flu has particularly hit young people the hardest. Of the 448 people in Illinois who have been hospitalized for the

swine flu, the majority have been under 65 years old, with 125 people between the ages of five and 18 and another 105 people between the ages of 25 and 49, according to the website ready.illinois.gov

As of Oct. 2, there were 19 deaths in Illinois from the swine flu. That compares to more than 30,000 deaths a year nationwide from the seasonal flu, Rhodes said. For more information, visit these websites: cdc.gov; flu.gov; or ready.illinois.gov

## Wet Weather Affects Crops, Further Delays Harvest

The cool, damp summer necessary for optimal growing served crops well, but the wet fall is wreaking havoc on the harvest.

Additionally, the extra moisture coupled with cooler temperatures created the perfect environment for white mold to invade some soybean crops.

"In some fields, in some locations, in some varieties, individuals are having as much as 30 percent yield loss," said Marion Shier, crop systems educator with the University of Illinois extension based in Pontiac.

The disease, typically seen in cooler northernmost states such as Wisconsin and Minnesota, attacks soybeans as the flower is dying after pollination, he said.

"It is a significant disease here in the county," Shier said. "It varies by field and variety, but last

year we had (it on the) west side of the county. This year, it's pretty well all over the county. Not every field has it or has it significantly."

In the fields affected, the white mold resembles fluffy, white, cottony structures on the stems with black capsules resembling mouse droppings.

The white mold serves as a double-whammy to farmers who anticipate a decrease in bushels per acre due to the late start they got after an extremely wet spring.

Instead of planting in mid-April, most farmers did not make it into the fields until mid-May, putting them about a month behind schedule.

While they needed a cooler, wet summer to salvage crops, many of which had shallower root systems this year from being planted into hard ground, that moisture is now delaying harvest.

Farmers can't harvest soybeans unless the fields are dry. Wet plants cause problems for the combines.

In Illinois, only one percent of soybeans have been harvested, compared to the 21 percent that should be done, said Phil McArdle, owner of McArdle Grain and Commodities.

Typically, 40 percent of corn has been harvested by now, but Illinois farmers have only harvested five percent.

"We're farther behind in Illinois than others in the western Corn Belt," McArdle said. "We're kind of waiting (for it to dry up). We should be going full-

blast. I think it's going to be a really slow harvest time, especially on corn. Our combines are huge and able to do lots of acres, but they'll be limited on the number of bushels they can dry."

Cooler weather also means higher moisture percentages during harvest.

Typically, farmers harvest corn at about 15 to 17 percent moisture levels, McArdle said. Currently, corn is at about 35 to 40 percent moisture. Corn needs to be dried before it is stored in order to prevent mold.

In a typical year, farmers spend all day and even into the night combining, but McArdle expects that many of them will combine for two or three hours and then spend the rest of the day waiting for that corn to dry before they can harvest more.

Beyond moisture, the later the harvest, the greater chance of running into other complications, he said.

"We're going to be really late with our harvest, and the later we get, the greater the chance of cold weather or high winds," he said.

Additionally, a freeze could do significant damage to the corn crop, as only about half of it in Illinois is mature right now, he said.

"It's going to be a slow harvest," he said. "Normally we'd be nearly done with soybean harvest, and no corn has been harvested yet that I know of. We just haven't gotten very much done. It's been raining and cloudy and not the weather we need."

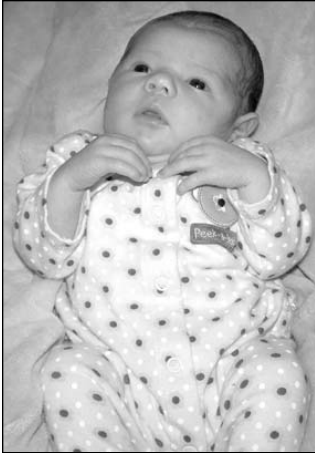

## Small Talk

I've probably mentioned before that I was born into and raised by a family who neither values nor enjoys sports. My dad does golf, but he didn't start that until long after my brothers and I left the nest.

I read a lot, and wrote. My brothers were plenty active, and they destroyed their fair share of my mother's furniture, but they didn't bring home trophies. Once they could sit still for more than a minute, one started drawing and painting. The other made music. They're both accomplished artists today.

Growing up, we never bothered with the World Series. Super Bowl Sundays were approached with a casual indifference that bordered on full-blown ignorance. None of us could be counted upon to even know who the contenders were.

But then I started dating and eventually married a football player. To be polite, and I suspect as a way of arming themselves with at least a few conversation starters for their new, sporty member of the family, my parents slowly started putting baseball and football news on their radar. I didn't bother, though. For years, football season meant I could have a good, uninterrupted nap on Sunday afternoons.

But then, we had this little boy. For a long while, not much changed, at least not on the football front. I just had this adorable, albeit grubby little guy who grunted an awful lot and couldn't keep his hands and face clean if his life depended on it. We went through a series of phases, and all of them were loosely held together with dirt, sweat and aggression. There was the sandbox/eating rocks phase, a fire truck phase, a Power Ranger period that might still rear its ugly head on occasion, and even a brief fascination with army guys. My husband relished all of it, celebrating like only fathers with sons can, the ever-increasing possibility that he and our son would likely share an attraction to the full-blown testosterone rush that apparently only football can satisfy.

For both of their sakes, I'm happy to report that my son lives and breathes football. The two of them talk about football all of the

time. It's like having a radio sports commentary playing non-stop. Of course, it's during football season that all of this activity and conversation reaches a fevered pitch. But in the off-season, the conversation simply turns to rehashing seasons past and speculation about the season to come.

Naturally, my son plays little-boy football. And my husband coaches little-boy football. My son's muddy cleats get left in the living room, and I'm a pro at getting his knee pads put in the right way. They come home from practices and games all wound-up. Saturdays are devoted to the most important contest on the face of this Earth.

I don't completely understand the game, but I'm getting there. At a recent match, another football mother and I had to laugh at ourselves. We were the mothers who'd been forever reminding our sons to stop being so rough, to keep their hands to themselves, to try to stay clean for five minutes, and there we both were, screaming from the sidelines with deep, almost guttural conviction, "Hurt him! Get in there! Get tough!" We were encouraging our sons to be rough and dirty and aggressive, all of the things they get in trouble for off the field.

How ironic. If someone had told me 25 years ago that I'd be screaming my head off in the rain so that my son would fight and scrap and use his body like a weapon. I would have laughed and put my nose back in my book.

I guess we just never know what's in the next chapter, do we?

### Keep Inflation in Mind When Investing

As an investor, you're always aware of the potential effects of market volatility on your portfolio. But you also need to pay attention to another factor that could impact your investments' return — inflation.

If you look back over the last few decades, you might not think inflation is much of a threat. Since the double-digit rates of the early 1980s, inflation has fallen significantly and, for the most part, has stayed low. Still, over time even a mild annual inflation rate can eventually erode your purchasing power.

Obviously, if you're a retiree, or close to retiring, you need to plan for the impact of inflation on your income stream, which may, to a large degree, depend on the types of investments you own. But even if you're at an earlier stage in life, you need to think about inflation because it can reduce the "real" rate of return you receive on your investments.

In any case, you can find investments that may be able to help you cope with inflation. When you own stocks, for example, you've got an ownership stake in companies that have the ability to raise prices — which make them effective inflation-fighting investments. Keep in mind an investment in stocks fluctuates and you can lose your money.

But one of the biggest inflation-fighting benefits of stocks is the dividends that they may pay. Well-run companies may reward investors by paying them back with dividends — and some companies have increased their dividends annually for decades. A word of caution, though: Companies can reduce or eliminate them at any time, without notice. In fact, during the long market slump we experienced, some companies did cut back on their dividend payments.

Not all stocks pay dividends, of course. In any case, if you're going to maintain a balanced portfolio, you'll also want to own other types of investments, such as bonds. But many bonds — along with other fixed-income vehicles, such as Certificates of Deposit — are not good "inflation fighters" because the fixed rate of return they offer simply may not keep up with inflation. However, if you built a "bond ladder" — that is, a group of bonds with varying maturities — you'd have more flexibility in combating inflation, because your longer-term bonds typically offer higher interest rates.

What about the so-called "inflation hedges," such as commodities and real estate? Actually, these "hedges" are extremely volatile and should be approached with great caution. You need look no further back than the bursting of the housing "bubble" to see that real estate, for instance, can go down just as fast as it goes up — and once down, it can take years to recover.

In your efforts to invest wisely for the future, inflation is only one of the variables you need to consider. But it can be an important one — so make sure you choose the investments that both address inflation and can help you make progress toward all your financial goals.



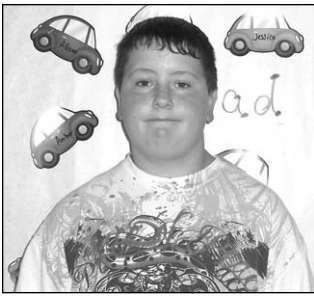

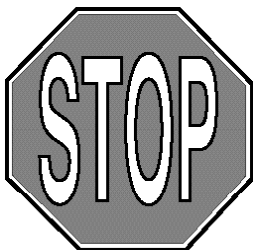

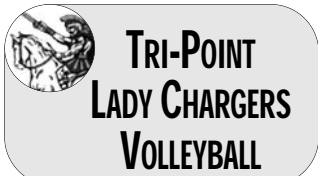

cise in a small multi-purpose room that doubles as the school's lunch room.

A wet spring hindered concrete being poured for the project and pushed the opening date back from August to November.

"I don't know that any construction project goes by the book or on schedule," Stoecklin said.

Installation, painting and sealing are the next steps for the wooden gym floor, followed by a two-week no-touch policy to let it cure, he said.

The scoreboard from the old gymnasium has already been moved to the new facility, where much of the interior construction is coming to a close, he said.

The heating system is already up and running. The grid for the drop ceiling is up with the majority of the ceiling tiles in place, minus those waiting for the sprinkler system to be completed. Bathroom fixtures are on their way.

The locker rooms are waiting for the floor to be complete before plumbing fixtures go in; however, lockers are up.

When the final electrical work, sprinklers and ceiling tiles are completed, the tile floors in the fitness center, office, concessions, commu-

nity room and hallways will go in.

That's the last step before fitness equipment can make its way into the building.

Stoecklin anticipates that the non-gym areas of the facility will be ready a couple of weeks in advance of the November 1 deadline, allowing for several open house opportunities for Saunemin residents and people from surrounding communities to tour the new structure.

"I think the community is really going to utilize it," Stoecklin said. "We'll see how they react to it."
