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Fire Blazes Through Verona Scrap Metal Yard

A fire raged at Hierz Scrap Metal Yard in Verona the afternoon of Friday, March 28.

Verona-Kinsman Fire Department Deputy Chief Nathan Feiner said an employee using metal-cutting torches caught some cardboard boxes on fire at about 3:15 p.m.; the fire then spread to various other materials in the yard.

When we arrived, there was heavy black smoke, Feiner said. The size and nature of the fire prompted the Verona-Kinsman Fire Department to call for mutual aid from the Braceville,

Gardner, Dwight, Seneca and Coal City fire departments. There were some flammable materials mixed in, so that was a little difficult to contend with, Feiner said.

The materials burning were in an outside storage area parallel to the BNSF railway, Feiner said.

They were able to keep train traffic moving throughout the fire, Feiner said.

Emergency crews were able to control the blaze in about three hours and left the scene around 7 p.m. Feiner said the materials damaged at Hierz were only outdoors, and the yard remains in business.

Construction Problems Lead to Early Dismissal

Dwight Township High School students were sent home early Tuesday, March 30, following an electrical outage that occurred as construction crews were trying to prepare the ground for the new cafeteria addition.

According to Dwight schools Superintendent Dale Adams, the initial outage occurred around 9 a.m. as workers were digging trenches for the footing of the new addition, outside on the south side of the building. Three previously buried ComEd power lines were just hanging above one of the trenches, Adams said. The problem occurred when part of the trench wall collapsed, pulling a wire out of a nearby transformer, causing a second wire to arc.

At that point, Adams said, the school was running at (continued on page 3)

Dwight Approves Budget

Village Employees to Receive Salary Increase

Full-time Village of Dwight employees will see a two percent base salary increase effective April 1 following a special Board session on March 29 where the board approved the increase along with the Fiscal Year 2010-11 Budget. Last year, village employees did not receive wage increases.

Board members were split on the salary increase issue when an attempt to pass the budget took place March 22. Concerns regarding the proposed budget's two percent salary increase for all full-time Village employees brought differing opinions by board members. At that time, the motion to pass the budget with the two percent salary increase failed and an alternate budget proposal was prepared with a one percent salary increase. However, with a full board present to vote at the special session, motions for one percent increase options failed and a second attempt for a two percent salary increase passed with a four to two vote. Board members Jerry Curtis and Nick Kester opposed the two percent base salary increase.

According to a letter presented with the budget by Village Administrator Kevin McNamara, the Fiscal Year

2010/2011 Budget is a balanced spending plan that reflects the Village's financial conditions and its slow rate of economic growth. It also reflects the continued downturn in the National, State and Local economies reflected in the projected revenues coming into the Village. Due to this fact, State Income Tax revenue, Local Use Tax revenue and Sales Tax revenue are all projected to be lower than the past fiscal year. The budget reflects a \$12 loss in state income tax per person or \$52,356 less than received in the current fiscal year. This is based on state estimates of income taxes to be received.

The 2010-11 General Fund budget shows \$2,820,000 in both expenditures and revenues with a total budget of \$8,601,768. Some items reflected in the budget are a four percent increase in residential garbage fees per contract; a \$100 increase in base ambulance rates; and a five percent increase for Class II large volume water users. There is no increase in residential water rates, sewer rates, permit fees, swimming lessons or pool entrance fees. The budget does include a Tax Increment Financing Fund to reflect the establishment of the Village's first TIF District. Also included in the budget are a

Commercial Rent Subsidy Fund and Commercial Rehab Loan Fund - both are new programs this year intended to help stimulate small business retail growth in the Village.

In other business at the special session, Impact Dwight requests were addressed. One request receiving approval by the board was for corner locations that Impact Dwight would like to target for adoption and beautification. Currently, the locations designated include entrances to Renfrew Park, Stevenson Pool, Garret Park and Rotary Park. Village welcome sign locations are also being considered for the project.

A second request by Impact Dwight to hold a cardboard boat race at Lions Lake on May 2 was denied by the board. Currently, boating and swimming in Lions Lake are prohibited. After review with village insurance providers, Mayor Bill Wilkey told the group that the village would be unable to approve the request due to too many liability issues.

We checked with our insurance company and they will not — in no way, shape, or form — allow us to be involved in that, said Wilkey.

Cullom Area Crash Claims Lives of Pontiac Residents

A fatal two-vehicle crash occurred at 3300 East Road (also called Livingston County Highway 3 or Campus-Chatsworth Road) and Illinois Route 116 west of Cullom shortly before 3:30 p.m. Sunday, March 28.
According to a press release from Livingston County Coroner Michael P. Burke, it appears one vehicle was westbound on Route 116, a through road, and the other vehicle was northbound on 3300 East Road, which has a stop sign.
EMS personnel arriving on the scene found the apparent driver of the vehicle on 116 and a passenger to be without signs of life. Tim Turner, 49, and Evonne Turner, 28, both of Pontiac, were pronounced dead at the scene of the crash Sunday afternoon by Deputy Coroner Dean Wilhelm.
The Cullom Fire Protection District, Saunemin Fire and EMS and Duffy Ambulance from Pontiac responded to the scene. The crash is being investigated by the Illinois State Police District 6 of Pontiac, their accident reconstructionist and the Livingston County Coroner's Office.

All-Electric FedEx Van Previewed in Odell

People in Los Angeles, California will soon be as curious as the folks in Odell, Illinois who wondered last week why a rather unusual looking FedEx van was making its (silent) way up and down the streets of their community.
The answer is that FedEx is unveiling an all-electric delivery van for service to begin in Los Angeles in May or June. To highlight the beginning of service with this specially-designed van, FedEx planned a Chicago-to-Los Angeles journey on Route 66, The Mother Road, with the vehicle.
The all-electric van travels between stops in a specially-designed truck. A bus with public relations people and FedEx personnel is accompanying the van on its tour.
Odell was selected as one of the stops because of the new windmills that are generating electricity near the community. Photos were taken of the delivery van near the windmills to demonstrate the green possibilities for both generating and using electricity.
Another photo opportunity presented itself at the restored Standard Oil gas station in Odell, where old and new power sources could be pictured side by side.
Banks of lithium ion batteries power the FedEx delivery van. The cost of the batteries would be similar to the cost of a high-end Mercedes sedan, according to a FedEx person.
The vehicle can travel 100 miles before recharging, making it available for a full eight-hour shift in LA neighborhoods.
Top speed is 50 miles per hour for the FedEx prototype that visited Odell. It was manufactured by Navistar in Elkhart, Indiana.
This writer enjoyed a ride around Odell in the van, and its quiet operation testifies to its clean-green qualities.

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When Evaluating Investments Performance, Avoid Common Mistakes

As an investor, you might think it's easy to evaluate your investments' performance. After all, the bigger the gain, the better, right? This statement is true enough, but as an investment strategy, it's incomplete — and, if followed rigidly, it could lead you to make some mistakes that could hinder your progress toward your financial goals.
What are some of these potential mistakes? Here are a few to consider:
☞ Evaluating performance over a short period of time — If you measure an investment's performance over a relatively short period of time, you may be more tempted to invest emotionally — that is, you'll buy more shares of an investment when you feel good about it because its price has risen, and you'll sell more shares when you feel bad because the investment's price has fallen. This behavior is the opposite of the classic piece of investment advice: Buy low and sell high. Try not to make investment decisions based on short-term performance. Instead, look at an investment's long-term track record. While it's true, as you have no doubt heard, that past performance can't guarantee future results, it's nonetheless useful to see how an investment has fared in different market environments.
☞ Neglecting the impact of contributions and withdrawals — If you put more money into an investment, it will be worth more — until the price drops — and if you take money out of an investment, it will be worth less — until the price rises. Yet many people mistakenly attribute their investments' performance to these inflows and outflows.
☞ Failing to distinguish between growth and income investments — To help achieve your long-term goals, you'll need a mix of growth-oriented investments, such as stocks, and income-producing vehicles, such as bonds. However, bonds will typically not add much growth to your overall portfolio, so keep this in mind when you look at the year-to-year change in value on your investment statements.
☞ Maintaining unrealistic expectations — In 2009, the Dow Jones Industrial Average rose nearly 19%, while the S&P 500 jumped more than 23%. But if you anticipate such unusually high returns annually, and you base your investment strategy on them, you'll likely be disappointed and have trouble meeting your goals. For a variety of reasons, most investment experts foresee relatively modest returns in the financial markets over the next few years, so you'll want to plan accordingly.
☞ Comparing investments to benchmarks — Try not to compare the performance of your investments to benchmarks such as the Dow Jones Industrial Average or the S&P 500. If you've chosen an aggressive investment mix, your returns may show wide swings, beating the benchmarks substantially in some years while trailing them significantly in others. On the other hand, if you're a conservative investor, your returns may consistently lag the major benchmarks, but you'll probably experience less volatility.
Once you know what to expect from your investments, you'll be less likely to be disappointed at your returns — and you'll be better prepared to create and follow an investment strategy that works for you.

about one-third to one-half of its normal power. ComEd was called about the problem. ComEd workers arrived within an hour, Adams said, and estimated the problem would take two to three hours to fix and would involve a complete shut-off of the school's power. This led to the decision to dismiss students early, at noon.

Unfortunately or fortunately — whatever way you look at it — shortly after noon, the project was completed and power was restored, Adams said, noting that the problem was not as serious as ComEd had originally thought. However, it was about 2 p.m. before all DTHS systems were back online. An electrician was then called to check circuits at the school.

The school's newly-implemented AlertNow system was used to notify parents of early dismissal. But because power to the school was cut, I didn't have access to my computer or our phone system, Adams said. He quickly went home and used his cell phone and home computer to send the alert, and said many parents had already received the AlertNow notification by the time Adams arrived back at DTHS.

It worked very well, he said.

Although he had yet to verify it with the regional superintendent, Adams said he believes the day will count as a full school day and won't add a day to the school year.

The power outage wasn't exactly a construction accident — workers are having problems digging the trench those wires run through, Adams said, because the earth in that area is filled with unstable junk materials apparently left over from a previous construction project.

It looks like there was a big hole here at one point, and they just put construction materials in that hole, Adams said. We're down probably nine or ten feet, and we still haven't hit solid ground.

Because the ground appears too unstable to place footings for the new addition, Adams said the school is now looking at plan B for that portion of the construction. That trench is collapsing and is now much wider and deeper than it should be, Adams said, and workers are concerned that more digging in the area would lead the nearby transformer to fall. That transformer will be moved to another location in June as construction progresses, Adams said.

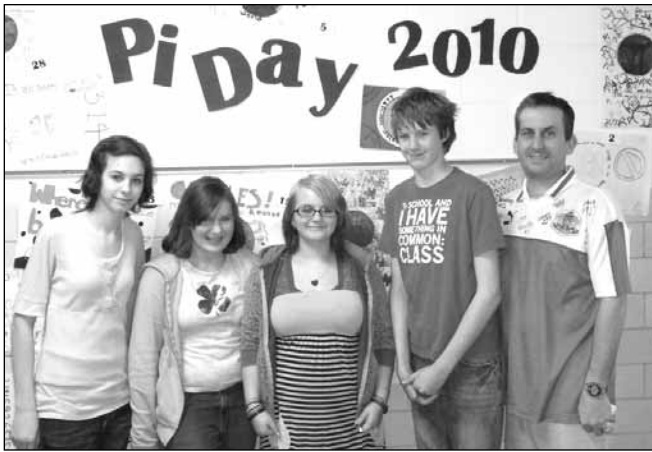

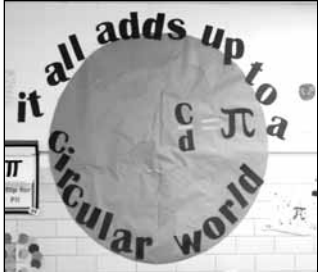

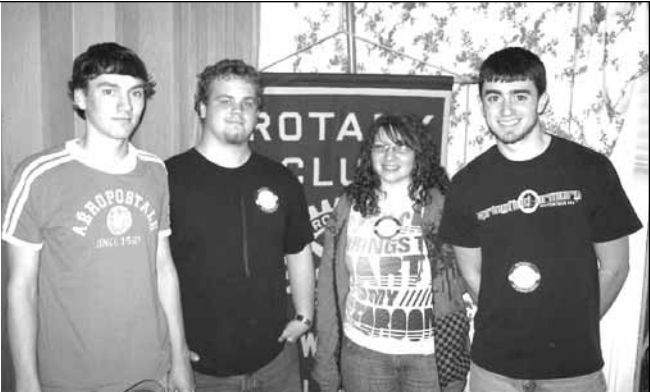

It seems like I'm cheering and cajoling and wringing my hands at a challenge that's too big for me to handle.

It must be God's design that the exasperating moments are outnumbered by my boy's smiles, his funny sense of humor, his delicious hugs, his fierce loyalty. This kid has made me laugh so hard I can't breathe. I don't think I ever really chuckled to myself until this particular boy entered my world. I never stopped to find out how household items were put together until my Harry came along. He could take apart just about anything with his chubby, dirty little hands almost before he could talk. I've learned a lot about dinosaurs, football and rocks, and my appreciation for duct tape, string and pocketknives has definitely been awakened.

During the past several months, he's become taller than I am. His change in stature has shifted the dynamics of our relationship. It's a slight shift, but it's there. I'm still the Mama, the Boss, his Alpha and Omega, but it is kind of weird to be looking up at this man-child as I order him to get started on his homework. He's evolving into a man right before my eyes, and as I consider this, I'm ready to put the brakes on. It's times like these when it feels like his maturation might be happening too quickly. I can't stop time, but I hope I have enough time left to make my imprint while he's still in my grasp.

Already, I'm starting to get a vision of the kind of man he's going to be. I'm pretty confident that the dreams I have for my son aren't altogether different from most mothers of sons. My dreams for my son are at once simple and ambitious.

I want my son to do whatever he can to stay alive. I want him to use his brain and his heart and his body in the right combinations. If I could just inject him with some magic potion that would give him adult-strength wisdom to get him through his youth in one piece, I'd do it.

I want him to become a person of honor, a man who holds fast to his principles.

I want my son to be trustworthy and to be someone who treats other people with compassion.

It is my hope that he will get as much education as he can and that he finds a profession that allows him to support himself and makes him happy to be alive.

I want my son to be the kind of man who cries when it's warranted, laughs at what's funny and sees the world with hopeful, happy eyes.

I pray that my son will keep God in his life, and that when my husband and I are gone, he'll know where to turn when he's struggling. I want my son to be a praying man.

I suspect that my son will have several girlfriends before he settles down. I want him to be the kind of man who treats women with the respect they deserve. And when he does find his soul mate, I hope he can love her with unflinching generosity. I hope he finds a wife who has more love to give him than he can imagine.

I hope my son is blessed with children, and that he gives them his heart. And I hope that his children change him and help him grow even more.

I have a lofty wish list, I know, and I pray that we'll get there. For now, we'll focus on his room. We mothers of sons have to start somewhere.

The year was 1858. And an effort was underway to change the name of the four-year-old community of Dwight.

R. P. Morgan, a local landowner and also an engineer who helped establish the Chicago, Alton & St. Louis Railroad, had dedicated the Village of Dwight on January 30, 1854. He wanted the name to remain Dwight.

Morgan had named the village in honor of his friend, Henry Dwight Jr., the capitalist and engineer who lost a fortune in the construction of the railroad.

A second faction was headed by "a leading politician named Tom Little, known more familiarly as 'Jersey,'"* who wanted the name changed to Beckman, the name of a county in New York State. Reason unknown.

A third faction "toiled in behalf of the euphonious appellation of Dogtown."*

In any event the townspeople put the matter to a vote, and "Dwight" won. By a single vote!

To commemorate that

incident, and because Dwight is a *doggone good town*, as well as home to hundreds of dogs, especially during Harvest Days when the Bassets arrive, an IMPACT Dwight committee has been formed to place 10 artistically-decorated dogs in the downtown Dwight area.

Through individual donations, more than half the dogs have already been sponsored, and 10 local artists have graciously agreed to contribute their time and talents to paint the dogs in a variety of styles.

A small plaque at the base of the dog will include the title, artist's and sponsor's names.
