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Dwight Reviews Mobile Home Park Regulation Proposals

Regulations around mobile homes and mobile home parks are being reviewed following a tornado that swept through Dwight on June 5.

At its June 14 session, the Dwight Village Board of Trustees heard reports on damage resulting from the tornado that demolished a trailer park on Dwight's west side as it cut a path through the village. Village officials indicated that with the pending rebuild of the mobile home park, now is a good time to enact some special ordinances.

The ordinance being sent to committee for review could require each mobile home park within the village to have a basement storm shelter located within a building in the mobile home park. Another proposed requirement would not allow a mobile home to be placed in a mobile home park if the date of manufacture of the mobile home is more than five years prior to the placement of the mobile home in the mobile home park. These and other mobile home ordinance proposals will be reviewed by the ordinance committee with recommendations presented to the village board for approval at a future board meeting. Should new regulations be

approved for mobile homes and mobile home parks, existing homes and parks would also need to comply with the new ordinance.

A review of the tornado aftermath indicated that thirteen people were reported injured with six taken to the hospital; one with critical injuries. Eighty homes were damaged in Dwight. As of the board meeting date, there were 24 displaced families with ten having found housing; two living in hotels; one hospitalized; and the remainder staying with family. Whether Federal Disaster Aid monies would be available was still undetermined.

As post tornado cleanup and repair efforts continue, village residents were cautioned to be careful to make sure contractors requesting work are legitimate and have a village permit. Approximately 29 different companies have registered with the village so far.

Mayor Bill Wilkey commended all of the utility, service providers, organizations along with the efforts of local and area community members and groups who came together to provide assistance following the storm.

It was a lot of people working together to clean up a mess, said Wilkey.

Police Chief Tim Henson also shared praise and expressed his thanks.

According to Chief Henson, no looting took place in the village during the turmoil which can be common during disaster situations in a community.

Never have I been more proud to say I am a citizen of Dwight, said Henson. Our community is a class act.

The village will be hosting meetings to review what went well and what can be improved upon should a disaster situation arise again in the future. Unlimited garbage pickup will be available in Dwight through Friday, June 25.

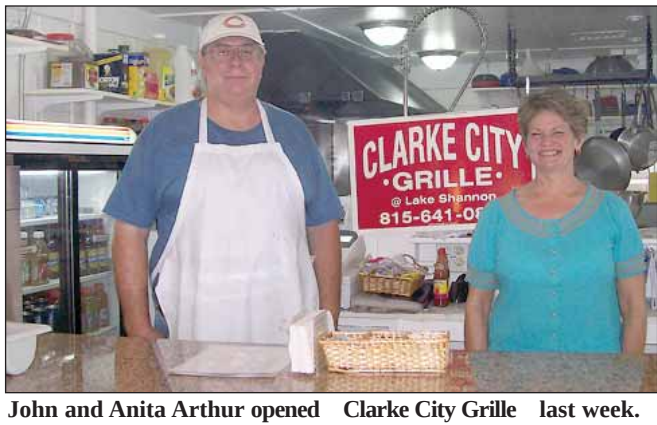
Mobile Home Park Owner Reacts to Proposed Ordinance

I don't think it's fair. That's John Airgood's response to the new mobile home park ordinance proposed at the Monday, June 14 meeting of the Village of Dwight Board of Trustees.

Airgood, of Gardner, is the owner of the Dwight Mobile Home Park, which was destroyed by the June 5 tornado. He has owned the park for more than 15 years and hopes to turn the property into a mobile home park again.

The ordinance, which has not yet been passed, includes a stipulation that each mobile home park in the village must have a basement storm shelter located within a building in the mobile home park.

In regard to this, Airgood said, I don't think we need one. The Village doesn't have one for all the residents of Dwight. He said he believes the Village is picking on mobile home parks,

Clarke City Grille Honors History of the Area

Clarke City is back on the map.

The former coal town has a new restaurant that has brought back the name that first brought the area prosperity 130 years ago.

Clarke City Grille opened last week and has been doing a lively business. John and Anita Arthur bought the former Lakeside Grille and did an extensive renovation. They decided to change the name to honor the history of the area.

Clarke City was located near Essex and Reddick. A coal mine opened there shortly after coal was discovered in 1880. A town sprung

up and had as many as 2,000 people at its peak. Mining ended in 1910, and the town declined very rapidly after that. A one-room schoolhouse continued into the 1950s. Today, the 21-acre town site is a farm field.

However, strip mining began after deep shaft mining ended. It is the lakes created by strip mining that make up the present Lake Shannon development, directly adjacent to the former Clarke City.

John Arthur originally is from Coal City. He worked as a production manager for Reichold in Morris, until the company transferred him to Pensacola, Fla. He was laid

More Bank Participation Sought for Celozzi Loan

The Mayor and Dwight Village Council members voted four to two May 24 to rebate up to \$200,000 in sales tax revenue over a three-year period to Celozzi LLC, a partnership planning to open a Chrysler dealership in the former Dempsey dealership location at Rt. 17 and Watters Drive in Dwight.

The sales tax money would be generated by vehicle sales at Celozzi LLC, with one-half of the revenue going to the Village of Dwight and one-half to the Greater Livingston County Economic Development Council to pay back a \$200,000 loan that is being negotiated by the GLCEDC for Celozzi LLC.

Larry Vaupel, CEO of GLCEDC, told *The Paper* Friday that a commitment by two banks (\$50,000 each) and \$100,000 by the GLCEDC has been made to provide the \$200,000 loan to Celozzi. However, Vaupel wants more banks to participate in the loan to reduce the risk to each participant, and to grant the opportunity to all the county banks to show support for economic development in Livingston County.

Vaupel said four banks are presently considering loans. All the county banks have been offered a chance to participate. He expects to have a final decision on the number of financial institutions participating by the end of this week.

Two banks have said no to the loan agreement, but that was early on, according to Vaupel. There have been iterations to this loan agreement since it was originally offered, he said.

Freestar Bank of Pontiac will be the lead bank, meaning it will write and administer the loan agreement on behalf of all the participants.

Celozzi LLC has applied to Chrysler for approval to purchase Dempsey-Chrysler-Jeep-Dodge in Dwight, and their request is proceeding through the required process, but there has been no final determination at this time (June 21), according to Ralph Kiesel of Chrysler.

noting that many permanent houses in the village do not have basements.

Another part of the proposed ordinance would mandate that no mobile homes more than five years old be placed in the park.

I don't think that's fair, because there's a lot of mobile homes out there that are 15 years old that look pretty nice, Airgood said.

He said he has not spoken with many of the park's former residents but has heard from a couple people that would like their spots (in the park) back again.

When asked what it will take to restore the property to a mobile home park, Airgood responded, Money. Some low income grants — federal or state grants, and added, (I) just need the village of Dwight to cooperate so we can get this back up and running again.

Airgood was not at the June 14 village board meeting but said he will be at the next one.

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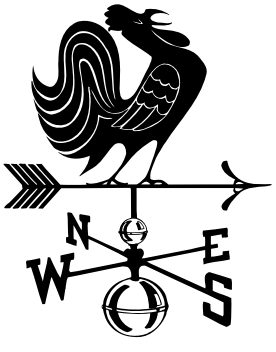

ComEd Continues Work on Tornado-Damaged Towers

The tornado damaged nine towers in the Dwight area, he said. Of those, four are being repaired, while five are being completely replaced. A total of 34 miles of wire will also be replaced.

Burdick said the bases of new towers are built first; the tower itself is built next to the base and then set into place.

Because of recent heavy rainfall, ComEd crews have built their own road system to get across unpaved areas. Burdick said the crews use heavy plastic mats to drive and walk across, because

It's basically a mud pit out there.

About 50 ComEd employees have been working on repairs and replacements in the Dwight area, Burdick said.

We're hoping to have things done in the next several weeks, he said, noting that this is one of the biggest projects area crews have worked on in six years. He said customers should not be affected by the work currently being done, as electricity to tornado-damaged areas has been rerouted to customers through other lines.

Cayuga Ridge South Wind Farm Road Rehabilitation to Begin

The Livingston County Highway Department has announced that beginning on or about Thursday, June 24, Iberdrola Renewables — in conjunction with its contractors, Mortenson Construction and Beniach Construction — will begin rehabilitating county and township highways that were damaged during construction of the Cayuga Ridge South Wind Farm in Odell and Union townships.

This work is being done as a requirement of the road use agreements negotiated

among Iberdrola Renewables and Livingston County and Odell, Union and Saunemin townships. The work will consist of pulverization of existing road surfaces, adding additional aggregate, grading and compacting the aggregate and the application of bituminous oil and chip surface treatment.

Residents within the wind farm construction area will be notified by distribution of flyers prior to work on the roadway in front of their homes. Temporary road closures of short duration will be required throughout the project, but every effort will be made to maintain local access. It is recommended that through traffic use alternate routes to avoid the construction area. Minor inconveniences or delays can be expected. The department requests patience and caution by the motoring public when traveling through the construction zone.

The work is expected to be substantially complete by September 1.

Zoning Board to Hold Public Hearing About Wind Farm

Heartland Wind LLC has filed a special use application in Livingston County for the proposed development of the Streator Deer Run Wind Farm. This project is to consist of approximately 165 wind turbines and associated facilities that are part of a wind farm development, which includes a proposed substation.

The Livingston County Zoning Board of Appeals will begin a public hearing on this zoning case on June 29 at 7 p.m. at the Country Mansion, 101 W. South St., Dwight, relative to this special use application. It is planned to continue this public hearing on June 30 at 6 p.m. at the Country Mansion. Future hearing dates and places will be determined by the zoning board of appeals.

The Streator Deer Run Wind Farm is proposed to be located in Esmen, Newtown and Sunbury townships, within the general boundaries of 3300 North Road to the north; 900 East Road to the west; 2300 North Road to the south; and 1800 East Road to the east.

All interested citizens are encouraged to attend this public hearing.

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DTHS Names New Principal

Students, parents and staff at Dwight Township High School will be greeted by a new principal when school starts next fall. At the June 14 session, board members approved hiring Dr. Richard Jancek to fill the position left open following the resignation last month of Principal Robert Richardson who has accepted a position at Taylorville High School.

The board approved a three year contract for Jancek with a beginning annual salary of \$85,000 plus benefits.

Dr. Jancek grew up on a farm in Highland, IL. He earned a Bachelors Degree in Technology Education from Eastern IL University, a Masters in Education Administration from Southern IL University, and a Doctorate in Education Administration from Northern IL University. Jancek brings to Dwight 21 years of experience in education, filling roles as an Industrial Arts teacher, athletic director, assistant principal, and principal along with experience as a football, girls basketball and girls and boys track coach. He has small and medium school experience and has spent the last ten years in a large, diverse school set-

ting in Rockford. He is looking forward to returning to a smaller school environment.

I was looking for a different leadership opportunity and wanted an opportunity to go back to a small school setting, said Jancek. I believe Dwight is a perfect fit.

Jancek told The Paper that he has a passion for working with kids and has high expectations of students and staff. He simply asks that they do their best all of the time.

And, students, parents and staff should also have high expectations of me, said Jancek. When everyone has high expectations in the learning community and everyone is doing their best, great things happen.

Jancek does have three things that he calls non-negotiables. One of those is his expectation that everyone will do their best work. But, on the personal side, the other two could be more controversial — he is a St. Louis Cardinals and a Green Bay Packers fan.

Those are non-negotiable, joked Jancek.

I am excited to meet the staff, students and parents and to build positive relationships, Dr. Jancek told The Paper. I have an open door policy and students, parents and staff should feel free to contact me when I am official-

ly in my office.

Principal Jancek is making plans to move to Dwight and will officially begin his role at DTHS on July 1.

In other business, the board approved three co-curricular resignations and new assignments. Dan Kaiser has stepped down as Freshman Girls Basketball Coach; Donita Forneris has stepped down as Assistant Track Coach; and Lindsey Presswood has stepped down as Co-Drama sponsor. Replacing Kaiser as Freshman Girls Basketball Coach will be Erik Black. Maleah White was employed as Freshman Girls Volleyball Coach. Adam Lee, a Gardner-South Wilmington teacher, was approved as an Assistant Football Coach filling the position vacated earlier this year when Jeff Froelich resigned the position. Brian Cobb will take on the role as sole Drama sponsor.

The board discussed damage to the school and property following the tornado that swept Dwight two weeks ago. Damage is expected to be covered by insurance at replacement cost after a \$1,000 deductible. The board passed a Building Repair Emergency Resolution that will allow the district to seek quotes without going through the normal bidding process. It is expected

The park office building is a small museum of old Clarke City artifacts.

Clarke City Grille also is a museum of sorts, with framed pictures of Clarke City sites and people covering the walls. The pictures were donated by the Herscher Area Historical Society.

Both Clarke City and Cardiff, another area coal town that is now gone, have people living where a town once was, and they are taking pride in their past.

Clarke City Grille is on the lake, with tables inside and outside. The view of the sand beach and the lake just outside the door gives the feeling of

being on vacation.

Harris Resigns DGS Board of Education

An open seat on the Dwight Grade School Board of Education was created June 16 when the board accepted the resignation of board member Tim Harris. Harris is moving to a location outside of the district limits.

The board will begin immediately seeking a replacement for Harris.

We have forty-five days to fill the position, Superintendent Dale Adams told the board. If not, it goes to the Regional Office for filling.

Once appointed, the new member will fill a one year term before the position goes on the ballot for a two year term.

Harris was commended for his service and dedication to the DGS board.

Thank you, Tim, for being a very concerned board member for many years, stated retired teacher Linda Rosenbaum.

In other business, the board employed Leslie Grieff as a first grade teacher pending the results of the State's budget. Grieff lost her position as a Pre-K teacher at the school when the grant funded Pre-K programs were cut in March due

to lack of State monies. Should funding become available for the Pre-K programs, Grieff would transfer back to Pre-K and the district would then seek another first grade teacher.

We recognize a quality teacher and we would like to retain her (Leslie Grieff), said Adams about the move.

In co-curricular activity, Justin Eggenberger resigned as Jr. High Wrestling Coach and will move to the Assistant Wrestling Coach position at the High School. Chris Sassenger will step in as Jr. High Wrestling Coach.

The board heard an extensive report from school counselor Beth Lawless. Mrs. Lawless reported on the Response To Intervention Model which is a school-wide system for student success. The report contained data capturing things such as office referrals by grade, time of day, location at the time of referral, and the problem behavior. Lawless report indicates that 87.35% of DGS students have had zero or one office referrals.

As a school, we are really healthy, Lawless told the board.

The discussion also included the need for setting consistent behavioral expectations. The Check-in

Check-out program that began in 2009 received credit for its benefits. The program requires identified students to touch base at the beginning and end of each day with a designated advisor.

That accountability factor is huge for these kids, said Jr. High Principal Mark Pagel.

In another matter, board members reviewed damage to the Grade School following the tornado that swept Dwight on June 5. The DGS building received minor roof damage and a broken window. Two vans belonging to the Dwight School Districts were totaled in the storm. The board approved the purchase of a 2007 van from Delong Ford Mercury for the Grade School to replace the damaged vehicle.

In other business, the board:

- abolished the District's Working Cash into the Education Fund.

- approved the annual Prevailing Wage Resolution.

- approved the 2010-11 meeting schedule.

The next meeting of the Dwight Grade School Board will be Tuesday, July 13, at 7 p.m. A special meeting will be held Thursday, July 15, at 7 p.m. to review financials as the district moves toward a referendum in the fall. Both meetings are in the Grade School.

Dwight Native s Design Firm Launches Competition

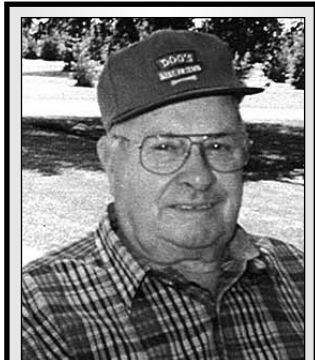

Exelon's Braidwood Generating Station has the honor of awarding three local high school graduates with scholarships for their impressive efforts during the 2009-10 school year.

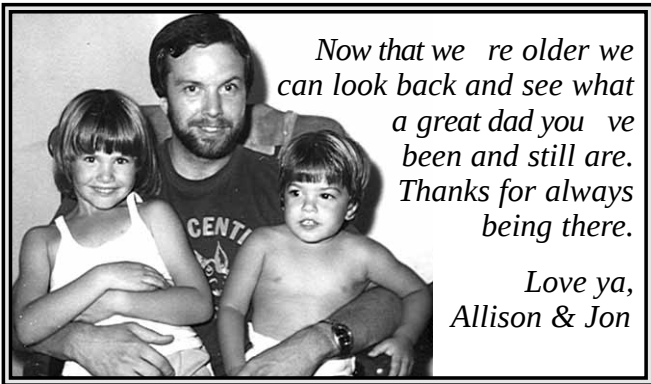

We walked down Gooseberry Lane early in the morning June 6 and found our neighbors with the same stunned looks we wore. The once tree-lined street was strewn with uprooted trees, downed limbs, broken windows and damaged shingles, damaged vehicles, and lots of frayed nerves – but fortunately, no injuries. We had heard about the injuries sustained by residents on the west side of Dwight, and the significantly greater property damage faced by residents east of us, and prayed for those folks as we mourned the damage we faced.

We wondered, “What we should do now? Where do we start? Who do we call?”

And then “they” appeared.

“They” just showed up on our street, and in our yard. Volunteers – many, many of them – who determined that others needed assistance, and showed up without a phone call requesting them – just because they wanted to help others.

They worked up and down our blocks, using chain saws to cut up limbs and tree trunks, and front-end loaders and dump trucks and trailers to move, stack or haul away the large amount of tree material.

In our yard, “they” included Larry Seabert, Phil Becker, Ray and his large crew from Popejoy Plumbing, Heating & Electric; Nate Smith (a recent high school graduate who called us to tell us he was on his way to help with chainsaws and a trailer); Bill, Polly and Nolan Hoffman; Dan Hogan from Blackstone, Don Kilgore from Pontiac, Mark Boma, Patty Hogan and her family, Chuck Trainor, and many, many others who brought food for workers, helped carry debris to the street, or called to ask if they could help us.

“They” are all wonderful people, and we were not surprised to learn that “they” included hundreds of folks from Dwight and the surrounding area who helped those who suffered damage from the June 5 storms all over town, not just in our yard or on our block.

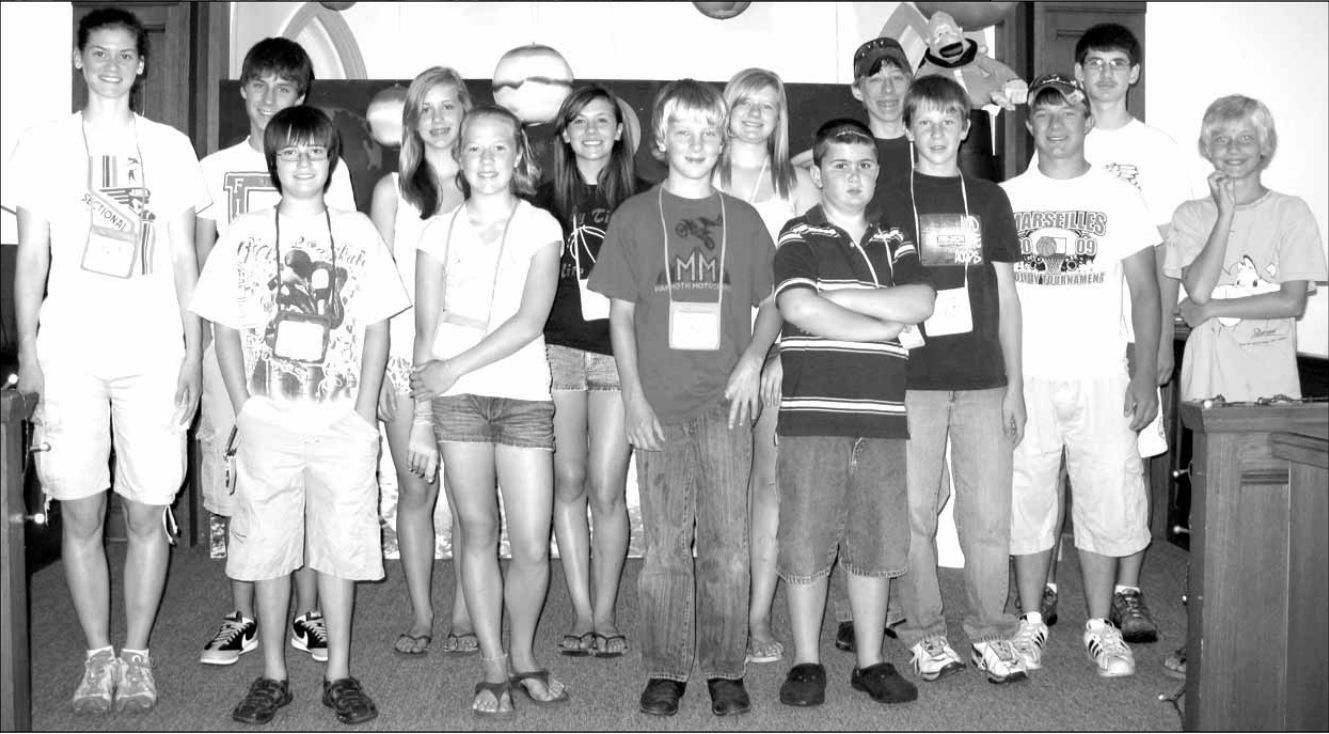

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Now that summer is officially here, you may be looking forward to vacations, barbecues, ballgames and other events of the season. But even while you're engaged in these activities, you can't forget about other aspects of your life — such as your plans to achieve your long-term financial goals. However, your summer activities can actually provide you with some valuable lessons on managing your investment strategy.

Here are a few possibilities:

Plan your trip. If you're taking a long road trip this summer, you'll need to choose your vehicle, map out your route, determine how far you want to go each day and be quite certain of your destination. And, essentially, the same is true for your investment strategy. You need to choose the right investment vehicles, familiarize yourself with your ultimate goals (such as a comfortable retirement) and chart your progress along the way.

Try to avoid getting burned. If you're going to spend a lot of time outdoors this summer, you may need to apply some sunscreen. But you don't have to be exposed to the sun to get burned — it can happen in the investment world, too. However, you can help prevent this from happening. How? By building a diversified portfolio. Furthermore, if you are relatively illiquid, you may have to dip into your longer-term investments to pay for short-term emergency needs. Try to always keep an adequate level of liquidity in your holdings.

Dress for the season. As you go about your summer activities, you won't always wear the same clothes. On hot days, you might want to wear shorts, but on cool, rainy days, you might need heavier items or even a raincoat. And as you go through life, you may need to adjust your investment approach depending on your individual financial season. For example, early in your career, you might be able to afford to invest more aggressively, as you'll have more opportunities to recover from the inevitable short-term downturns. As you close in on retirement, though, you may need to take a more conservative approach so that you can lower your investment risk when you need to access your money.

So there you have them — some ideas for summertime investing. Use them wisely, and they may be of value to you long after summer is over.

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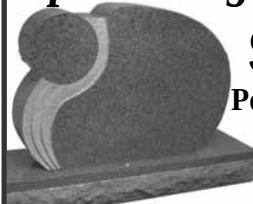
