Dwight Artist Cathee Clausen to be Featured on WGN News

Cathee Clausen, a renowned artist from Dwight, will be featured on WGN-TV Chicago News Thursday, August 19. Clausen will provide a three-minute demonstration of her artistic process sometime between 11 and 11:30 a.m. during the live national broadcast.

The segment will also promote the Gold Coast Art Fair in Grant Park, Chicago, which will be held August 20 through 22 featuring the work of Clausen and 400 other artists.

During the news program, Clausen will sit down with one of the anchors and describe the creation of a painting from start to finish. She will display the found image, initial sketch and final painting of a work in her Native American series.

The initial step Clausen will explain is finding an image as inspiration for a painting.

"The first thing is to get that astonishing historical image," she said. "Usually I'll find an image that just strikes me." One such image, she said, was the photograph that inspired one of her best-known works, a portrait of Abraham Lincoln in wavy bands of color.

Clausen sometimes does a pencil sketch to get a better grasp on the tones of the image. Her next step is usu-

ally a small, full-color oil painting sketch.

"It's a great opportunity to play with the rhythm of the colors that I'm thinking of painting," she said. Describing the way the painting's tones work together, she said, "It's almost musical."

Clausen usually shows that sketch to family and friends to hear what they think, but she said, "Looking at it, I can instantly tell if it will be a success."

Clausen's final step is to begin the full-size painting. She said that lately her paintings have been about 24 inches high. She always begins by painting the subject's eyes, then expanding to other details of the face, she said.

During the WGN broadcast, she will finish work on a preliminary study of a piece, then work on a half-completed full-size version.

Although she cannot teach anyone how to paint in a three-minute segment, Clausen said the demonstration is about showing people how to follow their intuition and "find their own voice" in their artwork.

"People can connect to the piece if you put love and respect into it," she said.

Mexican Restaurant Opens in Downtown Dwight

Anyone who has a taste for authentic Mexican cuisine need look no further than Dwight.

A new restaurant, The Grotto, opened July 31 at 114 S. Franklin St. in downtown Dwight. Owner Sue Michaels explained that a grotto, by definition, is "a cave-like summer house."

"It is just a safe place to go to, so we thought it would make a cool name for a restaurant," she said.

The Grotto serves old-recipe Mexican fare such as tacos, burritos, chips and salsa, etc. There are also frozen drinks such as strawberry smoothies and frozen margaritas. Michaels said she plans to expand the menu each week, possibly including baked goods eventually.

"We just have to find out what everybody's likes are, and dislikes," she said.

Guests can dine indoors, where festive music plays and Mexican decorations adorn the walls; or they can choose to eat in the fenced-in courtyard behind the restaurant, either on a covered porch or in the yard. Michaels is planting a garden in the courtyard and hopes to install a fountain next year.

The Grotto also offers free wi-fi Internet.

Michaels would like to host special events at the restaurant; for example, she said, an area musician might

play an unplugged set one night as guests eat dinner. Anyone interested is welcome to contact the restaurant.

In addition, Michaels plans to start a lunch catering program for local businesses.

Although Michaels is looking to hire more employees, her current staff consists of her daughters, Nikole, 19, and Melissa, 16; along with family friend Tony Juarez and the rest of Michaels' family. Michaels also has a son, Noah, age two, who has his own play space in The Grotto's building.

"He's kind of our boss," Michaels joked. She has another son who lives in California.

Michaels and her family lived in Dwight for 14 years;

they recently lived in Oak Brook for two years, but now they've returned to Dwight.

"I wanted to come back to Dwight and have a restaurant and raise my son," Michaels said. She said she decided to open a restaurant because "I've always wanted to. I've been in food service for over 25 years." She added, "I love Mexican food, and there's never really been any Mexican food in town."

Things at The Grotto have been going well so far. Michaels said "we had a full house" on opening night, and "The Village has been really helpful" in quickly granting permits, etc. "And anybody that's been in has been real helpful so far," she added.

Michaels plans to expand the restaurant's hours in the (continued on page 5)

Illinois State Police Announce July Enforcement Activity

Illinois State Police (ISP) District 6 Commander, Captain Suzanne Jansky announced a summary of July 2010 enforcement activity. During the month of July, ISP District 6 Troopers handled 2279 incidents.

The following enforcement activity demonstrates that ISP District 6 Troopers are committed to the reduction of traffic crash fatalities.

In July, Troopers issued 504 citations and 230 warnings for speeding, made 27 arrests for DUI, 13 arrests for underage drinking, issued 316 safety belt citations, and 27 child passenger restraint citations.

All other violations of the Illinois Vehicle Code, observed by ISP District 6 Troopers, resulted in 392 citations and 853 warnings being issued. ISP District 6 Troopers made 46 criminal arrests.

District 6 investigated 73 traffic crashes, and assisted 288 motorists. There was one fatal crash investigated

in District 6. District 6 has a total of nine fatalities to date in 2010 handled by all police agencies.

Second division vehicle safety (trucks) continues to remain a priority for Troopers. During July, 489 second division vehicles were inspected resulting in 96 vehicles being placed out of service.

The Illinois State Police will continue its mission to eliminate fatal crashes through traffic enforcement and by adding enforcement of the no texting law and illegal use of a cell-phone in construction zones.

"Many of the Illinois highways and interstates remain under heavy construction. Motorists are urged to use caution while driving through construction zones and be alert for workers present in the zones. As a reminder, cell-phone use in a construction zone is against the law," said Trooper Joseph Dittmer.

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Village Administrator Explains Tornado Relief Distribution

When the Tornado Relief Funds Committee for the June 5 Dwight tornado met July 20 in Pontiac, committee members determined how funds would be distributed to tornado victims.

Although he is not part of the committee, Dwight Village Administrator Kevin McNamara has provided some additional information regarding the funds and distribution process.

McNamara explained that the tornado relief accounts at all four Dwight banks were set up by the Village of Dwight. Anyone was allowed to contribute funds; money collected from several of the post-tornado fundraisers was also donated to the Village's tornado relief accounts.

Tornado victims could apply for funds by filling out a form available at Dwight Village Hall. McNamara said 24 applications have been received so far; on August 3, he said, "I know there are some (applications) still outstanding."

Village officials spoke with officials in other towns to determine how to form a tornado relief funds committee. It was decided that the committee should be composed of individuals who are not Dwight residents. McNamara said the committee is made up of four people – a resident of Fairbury, one of Odell, one of Pontiac and one of Saunemin. He said they represent "varied backgrounds."

At its July 20 meeting, the Tornado Relief Funds Committee determined that those with income less than \$2,333 per month, which is the Livingston County median, are eligible to receive funds. The funds will be distributed to victims one time; it is not a monthly distribution, McNamara said. He did not expect there would be any monies left over once funds have been distributed to all eligible victims.

The committee decided funds will be disbursed as follows: \$1,200 per household with no insurance; \$500 per household that had insurance. McNamara said those amounts are based on the total amount in the tornado relief accounts at the four banks, which as of July 20 was "something like \$26,000." Since that date, another \$10,500 was added to the total with a donation from the June St. Patrick Catholic Church fund-raiser dinner, as well as \$1,000 from another organization and possible other donations, according to Dwight Village Clerk Patti Drechsel.

The committee determined that funds are "to assist families in starting over." For this reason, funds may not cover medical bills for those injured after the tornado. Because Dwight has several food pantries, and clothing donations were collected and distributed after the tornado, McNamara explained that the funds will also not be allowed to cover clothing or grocery expenses.

Expenses eligible for funding include rent; rent deposit; appliances; furniture/household items; car repair/replacement; and/or renter's insurance. McNamara said that funds are already starting to be distributed. No money is going directly to the individual victims, he said; instead, checks will be written to landlords, utility companies, appliance stores, etc. Checks are not given until invoices are produced as either due or paid.

McNamara said the tornado relief funds are "basically just a small token to help (victims) get their lives together."

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DGS Moves Close to Referendum Decisions Pre-K Block Program May Return

Critical decisions will be made at the next meeting of the Dwight Grade School Board of Education as the deadline draws near to adopt a formal resolution calling for a tax referendum option on the November ballot.

With the struggling district projecting a \$500,000 deficit at the end of next year, a special board session was held on August 4 where the board discussed the proposed tax rate increase and referendum process. Additionally, the board is preparing to move forward with issuing an earlier approved \$1 million Working Cash Fund Bond.

On the decision table are proposals to increase the current \$1.88 maximum tax rate by twelve cents, thirty-seven cents or fifty cents. Kevin Wills of First Midstate provided tax rate summaries using the proposed increase options and average estimated bond and interest rates. Board members were also provided information showing the estimated financial impact each option would have to property owners in the district.

The board was also given information on requirements for board members, administrators, and teachers with regard to actively seeking the proposed referendum. Per state regulations, elected officials are prohibited from actively promoting or encouraging the passing of a referendum while acting in their official capacity once a formal referendum declaration has occurred. The board and administrator's role in the process is to provide impar-

tial, factual information and data for public use in determining the need for a tax increase. Also, school monies and resources cannot be used to drive a referendum campaign. Enforcement of penalties could occur if regulations are not adhered to. For a referendum to succeed, it will need to be driven by community members.

Aside from pending referendum decisions, the board will also be taking action on continuation of Pre-K programs for the coming school year.

Earlier this year, the board moved to eliminate the state funded Pre-K programs and associated positions pending decisions by the state as to continued funding, with the idea that if State funds for the Pre-K programs came through, reinstating the teachers could be a possibility. At that time, Superintendent Adams indicated he felt the monies would become available to fund the Pre-K Block program which addresses Pre-K students with the most need, but was doubtful that funding will come for the Pre-K For All and Transitional Pre-K programs.

Illinois Governor Pat Quinn's current outline of budget cuts squeezes schools even tighter, calling for additional school spending reductions. Still unclear as to where all of the cuts will occur, Superintendent Dale Adams told the board that he believes there will be money available for the Pre-K Block (At Risk) program.

"So far, Early Childhood was unscathed," Adams told the board. "I feel 75 percent confident we will get enough money to pay for a teacher

and aide for a Pre-K At Risk program."

While the money may be allocated, Adams indicated that with State money not readily forthcoming, it may not come in this fiscal year. And, money for the state funded Pre-K For All program is less certain.

"How much risk are you willing to take?" was Adams' question to the board as they prepare to make a decision on moving forward with Pre-K programs for the soon to start school year.

"I don't feel as confident," said Adams of available funding for the Pre-K For All program. "I would say we hold off on [reinstating] this [program] and it could be added at a later time. For these students it is more of a service and not a need."

In a final matter, the board learned that member Bret Heinrich has submitted his resignation from the board. Heinrich and his family will be relocating to Missouri.

The next meeting of the DGS Board of Education will be Wednesday, August 11, at 7 p.m. in the school. Actions will be taken on the referendum, Pre-K proposals, and Heinrich's resignation in addition to other agenda items. All regular sessions are open to the public.

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TOD Agreement Can Reduce Hassels for Heirs

You could, for example, have money distributed to your children or grandchildren in installments, over a period of years. Many people like having this ability, especially if they are unsure of the money management skills or maturity level of their heirs. Plus, a properly established revocable living trust will carry out your wishes if you become incapacitated. Be sure to consult with your legal advisor to see if a revocable living trust is appropriate for you.

While a TOD agreement can't take the place of all estate-planning tools, it can complement them. And a TOD agreement offers another feature that can prove valuable: flexibility. Specifically, you can revoke or modify your TOD agreement at any time in response to changes in your life or family circumstances.

To determine if a TOD agreement is appropriate for your needs, contact your tax advisor or legal professional.

It's taken you many years to accumulate your assets, so take some time to help ensure they end up where you want them to go.

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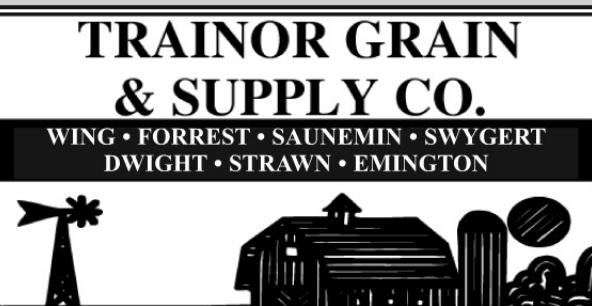

I do all the installs, trouble calls and maintenance for the town's cable system. Since I've been in town we've upgraded Gardner's internet speeds to compete with companies such as Comcast, and it's now faster than DSL. I have also updated every channel to digital or HD.

It has come to my attention that a Gardner resident made a complaint at the village meeting. In the past six months or more, that resident has called me directly at home after hours to let me know about outages and trouble. I've come out to her home a handful of times on service calls. I never charged a service fee even if it wasn't our fault. Her problem with

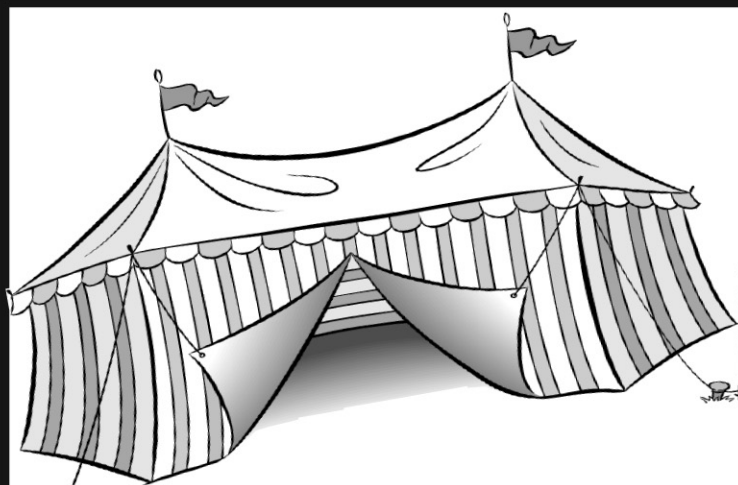

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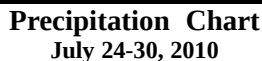

State law requires new students to bring a copy of their birth certificate when registering.

Thursday, August 12, registration will be from 4 to 8 p.m. in the gymnasium for freshmen through seniors. Friday, August 13, students will register in the gymnasium at the following times:

Seniors, 9-10 a.m.; juniors, 10-11 a.m.; sophomores, 1-2 p.m.; freshmen, 2-3 p.m. Freshman Orientation will be held from 3 to 4 p.m.

Monday, August 16, registration will be held in the gymnasium for freshmen through seniors from 9 a.m. to noon.

All students must be registered at these times. Questions may be directed to the office at 815-584-6200.

Monday, August 23, will be the first day of school for students. Classes will begin at 8:15 a.m. and dismiss at 3:10 p.m.

Students will be required to supply the following information on registration day:

Student's Social Security number, name of family health coverage plan – insurance company, parent's place

of employment and telephone number, family physician and phone number, adult to contact in case of emergency (if parent cannot be reached).

State law requires students entering ninth grade and students new to the district (at any grade level) to present evidence that the dental and physical examinations and immunization requirements are met. Students entering ninth grade for the first time will be required to show evidence of having received two doses of the live measles virus vaccine. Students failing to present evidence of physical examinations and immunizations will not be allowed to enter school until this requirement has been met. Dental and physical exam forms are available in the high school office.

Two school-approved combination locks are to be purchased by incoming freshmen. One is to be placed on the student's hall locker and the other on the physical education locker. The fee for the two locks is \$12.

Other student fees include:

Behind-the-wheel driver's education fee, \$10; textbook rental, \$28; year-round, 24-hour accident plan, \$60; football coverage, grades 9-12, \$125; activity fee (required of all students), \$15; participation fee (required of all students par-

ticipating in athletics, cheerleading, band and flag corps), \$25; P.E. uniform, \$16; parking, \$5.

Fees are due at registration. Students may also be required to pay other fees for consumable workbooks or project fees for supplies and materials, depending upon courses for which they are enrolled.

Football insurance covers football players during a football game and practice only. School time insurance covers a student during school hours and at all athletic events and practices except football. School time accident insurance is available to all students at no cost. Twenty-four-hour coverage covers the student 24 hours a day, seven days a week for 12 months. This insurance also covers all athletic activities except football.

The school district does not receive any commission or derive any income from the student accident insurance program. The plan is made available at the prices listed above. The student accident insurance policy does have certain benefit limitations. The district suggests that parents retain this information for future reference.

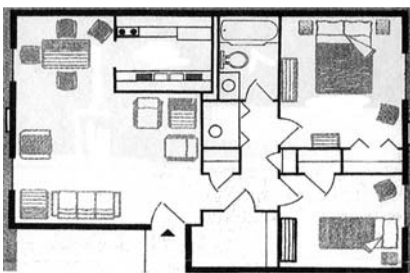
