Tom Dempsey: 'Celozzi deal is going to go through ...'

Tom Dempsey, owner of the former Dodge Chrysler Jeep new car dealership at Watters Drive and Route 17 in Dwight, told *The Paper* last week that Chrysler Corp. has approved a change in ownership between him and Celozzi LLC.

However, Celozzi LLC is still seeking bank financing to set up a floor plan for putting vehicles on display. Chrysler Corporation no longer offers financial assistance for dealers' floor plans.

Nevertheless, Dempsey said there is no reason the floor plan loan will not be approved by a bank or banks, and "the Celozzi deal is going to go through."

The Greater Livingston

County Economic Development Council and county banks are finalizing the loan documents for a \$200,000 line of credit they previously committed to the Dempsey/Celozzi deal.

This line of credit was secured by a rebate of up to \$200,000 in sales tax revenue over a three year period approved by the Dwight Village Council May 24 of this year. The sales tax revenue would be generated by sales at Celozzi LLC.

Dempsey noted that in today's financial world, deals such as this take a long time to be put completely in place.

His Dwight dealership stopped selling vehicles one year ago, although the service facility remains open.

DGS District #232 Sets Tax Rate Increase

The Dwight Grade School Board of Education has made a decision to ask District #232 taxpayers for a fifty cent tax rate increase raising the current maximum tax rate in the Education Fund from \$1.88 to a proposed \$2.38. At the August 11 board session, board members voted unanimously to call for the increase on the November ballot.

Prompted by a looming deficit due primarily to cuts in State funding, the board has been working hard to shore up the budget. Over one-third of the District's Education Fund revenue comes from State sources. As Illinois slashes its budget and makes education spending reductions, schools are being forced into tough decisions and to look elsewhere for revenue.

Earlier this year, the DGS

board made spending reductions and cut their budget by nearly \$160,000, but stopped short of cutting deep into programs, such as sports, or making changes that might impact the quality of its students' education. With cash reserves exhausted, seeking a tax referendum was determined to be the only viable long term option that will allow the district to maintain its current academic and co-curricular offerings. Without the passing of a referendum, the board anticipates drastic cuts next year.

"The cuts are all going to occur if we are unsuccessful at a referendum," stated board member Steve Tock during a discussion earlier this year. "It is not a choice — there is no leeway."

The district is facing a roughly \$500,000 deficit at the end of this year. The board has elected to issue a \$1 million dollar Working

Local Problems Aired at Town Meeting

Fifteenth District Congressman Tim Johnson visited Dwight August 11 for a 6 p.m. Town Meeting in the Dwight Village Council room. About 45 of his constituents were present.

For almost a year, Johnson has been appearing weekly at town meetings throughout his 22 county district.

In Dwight, Johnson heard concerns about new eligibility guidelines for receiving extended unemployment benefits; lack of a grant to alleviate flooding on Brewster run; and the hardships visited on Dwight residents by FEMA placing them in flood zones — along with other matters.

"There is little or no money available for smaller, but important projects," Johnson said. "Many local projects have been scuttled because the federal government has been spending so

much money on larger projects — like health care reform — which is the worst piece of legislation to be passed in this country in 200 years," Johnson added.

The congressman said

that he had voted to extend unemployment benefits until now — but no more — "because they should be using unspent stimulus money to extend benefits rather than spending new revenue."

"We are on the precipice as far as our country's debt is concerned, we are endangering our children and grandchildren, this problem is the single biggest issue facing this nation," stated Johnson.

He added that, regardless of the obstacles facing his office, they are doing their best to work through the system. He urged those with serious local problems to contact his office and he or his staff members would respond.

Dwight Police Arrest Teens for Alcohol; Squad Car Damaged

The arrest of several teenagers in Dwight led to a Dwight squad car being damaged and one offender going to jail.

Dwight Police Chief Tim Henson said police went to the 200 block of West William Street at approximately 1 a.m. on July 17 after receiving information of an underage drinking party there. Henson said that when police arrived, "There were several individuals there with alcohol present."

Two 18-year-olds were arrested for illegal consumption of alcohol by a minor. One of them was Michael A. Taylor of Dwight.

Four 18- and 19-year olds were arrested for illegal possession of alcohol by a minor. Henson added, "There were also juveniles who were under the age of 18 who were present, who were also arrested."

Taylor was also charged

with escape and criminal damage to state-supported property. Henson explained that these charges came because Taylor was "arrested and placed in the rear of a police squad car," but Taylor "kicked out the window" and "took off running."

Police later found Taylor in the 300 block of East Delaware where he was arrested, along with one of the people who had been charged with illegal possession of alcohol and who had also escaped from the scene and was thus charged.

Damage to the squad car is estimated at \$853, Henson said.

All the teens involved were released, with the exception of Taylor, who was transported to Livingston County Jail, according to Henson.

Illinois State Police and the Livingston County Sheriff's Police assisted with the incident.

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Coils, Inc. Still Interested in Dwight -- but in Indiana, too

There was a lot of interest generated in and around Dwight when a story in *The Paper* last December related that Coils, Inc. of Huntley might be returning to Dwight with plans to manufacture chargers for plug-in hybrid vehicles in its former plant on West Waupansie Street.

At full production, the story stated, such a plant could employ 300 people with an annual payroll of \$9 million.

Fast forward to August 2010 — with the rumor circulating that Coils, Inc. is going to open its battery charging plant in Kentland Indiana, where it has another manufacturing plant.

Steve Kim, corporate counsel for Coils, Inc., indicated in a phone conversation with *The Paper* last week that a final decision has not been made on the manufacture of the battery chargers. “We are still looking at making a final determination.”

But another project, the manufacture of solar panels, has the company “definitely leaning toward Dwight because the space available in Dwight better fits the solar panel plans.”

Kim explained that Dwight, where the company owns some seven empty

acres adjacent to its plant, would allow for future expansion of a solar panel operation.

Kim said that the demand for solar panels is increasing worldwide, as is the desire for an American-made product.

“In many developing countries, they cannot afford the construction of land lines, and that is why you have this increasing demand for solar panels, windfarms, cell phones,” Kim explained.

“The potential for jobs (producing solar panels) is even greater than it would have been with the battery charger operation,” Kim stated.

“We would have three shifts,” said Kim, “and could expand to more lines (in Dwight) as the business grew.”

Coils, Inc. is presently not manufacturing solar panels in its plants, but does produce some affiliated components.

Kim was asked if Indiana had outbid Illinois in the attempt to secure the battery charger operation.

An edition of the *Indiana Economic Digest* earlier this year stated that Kentland had offered \$500,000 from its Economic Development Commission, it believed that the county (Newton) would



match Livingston County, Illinois’ offer of \$3 million in incentives, and it had \$3.5 million in grants and loans on the table from the State of Indiana.

Coils didn’t fully apply to Dwight for financial incentives, and a dollar figure was never approved. The State of Illinois offered minimal financial assistance compared to Indiana.

Kim said he did not want to pick sides between Illinois and Indiana, “I am only saying that Dwight better fits our physical plans for a solar panel operation.”

So . . . what is to be determined from all of this?

If Coils, Inc. does begin manufacturing battery chargers for plug-in hybrid vehicles, will it do so in Indiana rather than Illinois?

If Coils, Inc. enters the

solar panel manufacturing business, will it do so in Dwight?

Kim has indicated that start up money for new manufacturing equipment is not easy to get in today’s economic climate.

The Greater Livingston County Economic Development Council is working with Coils, Inc. and doing what they can to assist them, but have not finalized an incentive package for the solar panel project.

In Kim’s words, “It is difficult to publicly state any definite conclusions.”

IMPACT Dwight, an organization dedicated to improving the community, held its monthly meeting August 4 at the Dwight village hall.

The night started with the introduction of the new Americorps VISTA volunteer, James Meece, who has been sent to the organization by the Corporation for National and Community Service.

"I am really excited to be here in Dwight. I think this organization can get a lot done to help the communi-

ty," Meece said. "IMPACT has already done quite a bit in the community, and I think in the coming months we can get even more done."

Discussion of the depot restoration project was the next issue, and the completion of that was the next thing on agenda.

"I think it looks wonderful, and when it is done, it will really be a nice thing for the community to have," said Jane Anderson, treasurer of IMPACT Dwight.

The depot project began a few weeks ago, with a landscaping kickoff organized by IMPACT, and is scheduled for completion by the end of the month.

"I encourage all the members of the community to stop by and see the work

when it is completed; you will be amazed," said Anderson.

In an attempt to make the town more environmentally friendly, IMPACT discussed the idea of creating a possible community compost, where residents could take their organic material and have it turned into soil that could be used in the spring. IMPACT is currently exploring this idea, and would love feedback and ideas from the community to see if they think something like this would be a good idea or could work.

Economic development was a major part of the meeting, and the idea of working with other organizations in Livingston County to create a strong base for all the towns in the surrounding area was discussed. This idea is not a new one; IMPACT has been working with other groups in the area already. The focus this time was on re-examining the approach that is being used and seeing if the ties of the groups could

be strengthened.

The creation of a possible Oktoberfest festival for the village was also brought up. The festival would happen in mid-October and would be used as a way to celebrate the fall. More details about this will be forthcoming, with discussion of it at future meetings.

The final topic of the meeting was one that involved the creation of a possible souvenir shop for the town, where local groups and businesses could sell merchandise to people visiting the town. This issue will also be discussed further at future meetings.

The next meeting will take place Wednesday, September 1, at 6 p.m. in the village hall.

Taylor Gettinger Awarded \$20,000 College Scholarship

As if starting college isn't stressful enough, imagine doing it after a fight with cancer. Four teens from the Midwest proved just how possible and inspiring this task can be.

The Children's Oncology Services Education Fund (COSEF) recently awarded its \$20,000 tuition-based scholarships. Scholarships were available to cancer patients or survivors treated or living in Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Michigan or Wisconsin who were diagnosed by the age of 18. This year there were more than 500 applications and only four were chosen.

Taylor Gettinger of Cabery is the Deanna Lyn Kromer Memorial Scholarship recipient.

Gettinger was diagnosed with a brain tumor in 2007. While still in treatment, this 2010 Dwight Township High

School graduate has become an inspiration. Gettinger has raised thousands of dollars for Relay for Life of the American Cancer Society. She also recently traveled to Washington, D.C. to lobby for cancer research and meet prominent speakers.

One of Gettinger's passions is writing. In fact, she is already a published author! A teacher submitted an essay of hers without her knowledge, and it was published in "Chicken Soup for the Cancer Survivor's Soul."

Attending Joliet Junior College in the fall, Gettinger intends to study English or social studies. Coming from a long line of school teachers, teaching is also Gettinger's ultimate goal. Her favorite subjects in school are English and psychology, and she hopes to continue cultivating these interests in college.

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Can You Save for Retirement and College?

As another school year approaches, you may be thinking about the day in which you'll be sending your children off to college. Can you afford to help them pay for school while still saving for your own retirement?

There are many strategies to explore when saving for your retirement and your child's education. To implement the right mix of options, it's important to discuss your situation with a professional financial advisor, but here are some options to consider:

- Contribute to your 401(k). Since many people don't have unlimited funds available to save for retirement and college, it's important to get the most mileage possible from the money invested. Try to utilize the tax-advantaged retirement accounts available to you. For starters, contribute as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. Not only can your earnings grow on a tax-deferred basis, but your contributions are generally made with pretax dollars, so the more you contribute, the lower your annual taxable income – which, in turn, could give you more disposable income to invest for college. In 2010, you can contribute up to \$16,500 to your 401(k), or \$22,000 if you're 50 or older.
- Fund your IRA. Depending on your income level, your contributions to a traditional IRA may also lower your taxable income, again potentially freeing up resources for college. Plus, your earnings can grow tax-deferred. If you qualify for a Roth IRA, your contributions are not tax-deductible, but your earnings grow tax-free. Withdrawals are also tax-free, provided you've held your account at least five years and you don't start taking withdrawals until you're at least age 59½. Also, you can withdraw Roth IRA contributions without paying taxes (since you've already been taxed on this money), so you could use these funds, if necessary, to help pay for college costs, although ideally you'd like to leave your account untouched until you retire. If eligible, you can contribute up to \$5,000 to your traditional or Roth IRA in 2010, or \$6,000 if you're 50 or older.
- Open a 529 college savings plan. Contributions to a 529 plan are made with after-tax dollars. However, when you contribute to a 529 plan, your earnings grow tax-free. Withdrawals are also tax-free, provided they are used for qualified higher education expenses. (Withdrawals for expenses other than qualified higher education expenditures may be subject to federal and state taxes plus a 10% penalty.) Furthermore, 529 plan contributions may be eligible for a state tax deduction or credit in certain states for residents who participate in their own state's plan. Also, the lifetime contribution limits for 529 plans are quite generous, and you can gift \$13,000 per year, per beneficiary, without incurring gift taxes. To make sure you understand the tax ramifications of a 529 plan, you'll want to consult with your tax advisor.

It may not be easy to put away as much as we'd like for retirement and college. But you do have some attractive savings and investment options. Don't delay, because when saving for any goal, time is a great ally.

- The Grundy Transit Stakeholders are working with Morris Hospital, the county GREAT bus and other providers to coordinate public transportation in the county.

- The Grundy County Growth Conference works with elected officials to discuss conservation and green projects.

- Challenges of the Future addresses topics such as public schools, daily health concerns, water supply, and storm water management.

Cash Fund bond to get through until tax revenues can be realized if the referendum passes in November.

The board weighed different referendum options including a twelve and thirty-seven cent increase, but determined that fifty cents would provide needed financial security while giving the district the option not to levy the full amount in the future as the economic climate changes when factors such as wind farm revenues start to become realized and the Working Cash Fund Bond is paid off in three to five years.

"The levy can always be pulled down," stated Board President Deb Christoff. "But,

I don't want to have to go back to the taxpayers in five years."

"What we do today has to last us another 25 years," Superintendent Dale Adams told *The Paper* regarding the proposed tax increase amount.

For homeowners, a proposed fifty cent increase would equate to an annual property tax increase of \$119.88 for a home valued at \$90,000; \$169.83 for a home valued at \$120,000; and \$369.63 for a home valued at \$240,000.

The proposed 2010-11 District #232 budget is currently available for review in the District office for the 30 days. Final action on the budget will take place at the September 15 board session.

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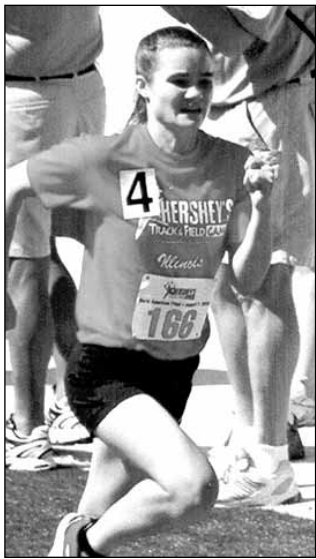

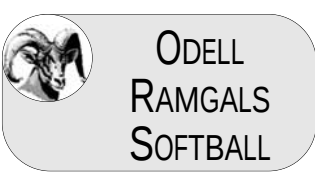
Ashley Saunders of Gardner was named the youth division (age 13-14)

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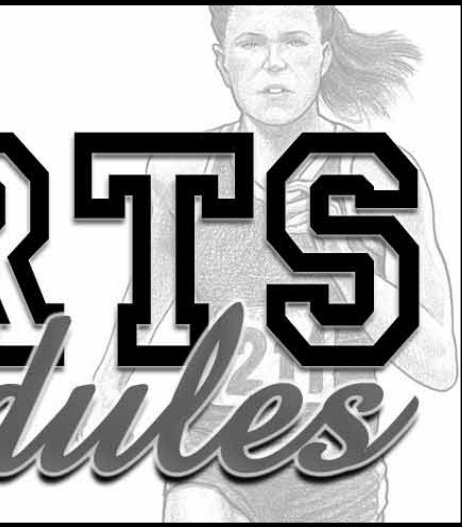

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Bus Shelters to Be Constructed in Gardner and Mazon

Public bus shelters will soon be constructed in Gardner and Mazon through federal grant dollars, according to Grundy County Administrator Dan Duffy.

The shelters will be an addition to Grundy County's current public bus transportation system, Duffy said. The "GREAT" bus has been providing on-call rides to county residents since the early 2000s.

Duffy explained that Grundy County recently received a \$100,000 federal grant for transportation. The county also receives a yearly 5311 public transportation grant for a single bus in the county.

Through the recent federal grant, the county was able to purchase a second bus. Part of the remaining funds are going toward six new bus shelters to be placed in the "high-traffic areas" of Gardner, Mazon, Coal City, Minooka and two in Morris, Duffy said. The other remaining funds are being used to repaint and re-sign current benches.

For construction of the benches, the county accepted a bid from Crown Concepts of Morris. A bid from Midwest Signs of Morris was accepted to re-sign the benches. Duffy said the county contracts out to a third party provider, Rendell Motors of Joliet, for the bus

service. Taking the yearly grant into consideration, Duffy said the bus service costs the county about \$5,000 a year out-of-pocket to operate.

The new bus shelter will be "a simple bus stop that's made of tempered glass," Duffy said. He explained that the shelter "allows people to get out of the elements" while waiting for a ride.

The shelter will also provide a central location to board the bus. The pick-up point for a Grundy County Public Transportation System bus must be in Grundy County, Duffy said. Although drop-off locations are usually also within the county, the bus will travel to major drop-off points outside the county, such as a train station or social service.

Duffy said it is hoped that the new bus shelters will be installed by the end of August. Eventually, the county hopes to create a set route and schedule system for the county buses.

Anyone may ride the bus, but you must call at least 24 hours ahead of time to request a ride. Grundy County buses can seat 13 people and are handicapped accessible. With the addition of a second bus, the hours have been extended, Duffy said - hours are now 6 a.m. to 6 p.m., Monday through Friday. To request a ride, call 1-800-409-9032.

The purpose of the clap-in is to demonstrate the importance of education to our children and to start the school year on a positive note.

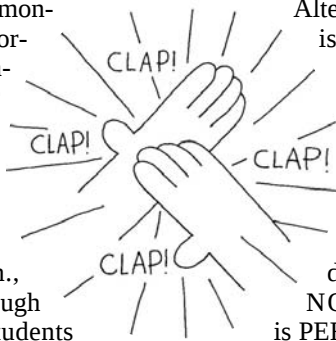

Dwight Approves Street Repaving Project

When the Dwight Village Board of Trustees met on Monday, August 9, differing opinions on the best way to proceed with street repaving in the Village of Dwight resulted in only a portion of Chicago Street getting a needed facelift.

With \$250,000 budgeted for street repaving, the board looked at options that included a base bid for milling and asphalt overlay of several streets, including two blocks of W. Chippewa, Smith Lane, Sunset Drive, Morris Road north of the tracks, and Chicago Street from Philmar to Susan, at a base bid of \$308,133. The board also looked at alternate bids for only the Chicago portion of the project using concrete instead of asphalt at \$226,100, or dropping the Chicago Street portion entirely for a bid price of \$195,090.

Mayor Bill Wilkey favored going over the budgeted amount and spending

approximately \$421,000 to do the entire proposal including using concrete for Chicago Street.

Trustee Jerry Curtis took a different stance and was opposed to overspending the budgeted \$250,000.

"There are a lot of things that need to be done," stated Curtis.

"Other things do not benefit taxpayers as much as these streets," said Wilkey. "It is a crime to drive down these streets the way they are."

"Then I suggest you come up with some money somewhere," countered Curtis. "I would like to fix all of [the streets] too."

"I don't think the priorities have changed," continued Curtis. "I just think we move that to next year and see what it looks like in the next budget cycle."

Regarding using asphalt or concrete, the decision came down to quality over quantity.

"The most value for the dollar is in that concrete street," Village Engineer Ryan Hanson told the board. "But, the most bang for the buck is going to be in the asphalt. You are going to see the greatest rewards, probably, from the concrete. It is a matter of quantity over quality."

Asphalt has a life span of 10-12 years, while concrete should last 40 years.

A motion by Trustee Mike Woods to repave all the proposed streets in asphalt and overspending the budget by \$58,000 was turned down with Trustees Curtis, Nick Kester, Angie Turner, and Justin Eggenberger voting no. Woods and Jared Anderson were for the move.

A second motion to move forward with repaving only Chicago Street from Philmar to Susan using concrete at the bid price of \$226,100 passed with Trustees Curtis, Kester, Turner and Eggenberger voting yes and

Woods and Anderson opposing.

Anderson Concrete of Coal City will do the street repaving work.

In other business, the board accepted the resignation of Angie Turner as Ordinance Committee Chairperson. Turner submitted her resignation last month following some public comment indicating there could be a bias towards matters concerning pending trailer park and mobile home ordinances. Trustee Jerry Curtis was appointed to serve as the new Ordinance Committee Chairperson.

Chief of Police Tim Henson reported that burglaries continue in the village and advised local residents to take necessary precautions to protect their property and valuables. Henson also asked that anyone having any information or observing unusual behavior contact the local police department.

"Any information is greatly appreciated," said Chief Henson.

With Harvest Days approaching, the board also approved street closures necessary for the downtown area flea market, craft and food booths, parade route and car show.

Use of golf carts by the Harvest Days Committee in the downtown area and along the parade route was also approved. Harvest Days will run from Thursday, September 16 through Sunday, September 19.

The board also approved a VFW request for a beer garden and bean bag tournament on Saturday, August 21.

A question was raised to the board regarding the status of the baseball and softball fields which suffered extensive damage after the June 5 tornado. Trustee Jared Anderson indicated that the village has received approval to move forward and a meeting to discuss how to proceed with the fields was scheduled for August 16.

Finally, James Meece, an AmeriCorps VISTA volunteer, introduced himself to the board and indicated that he will be helping Impact Dwight complete their goals and encouraged ideas for the organization.

The next meeting of the Dwight Village Board of Trustees will be Monday, August 23, at 6 p.m. in the Dwight Public Services Complex.

Pre-K Programs Return to DGS; Full Day Kindergarten Offered

There was good news last week for the youngest of students at Dwight Elementary School as the board of Education approved a recommendation by Superintendent Dale Adams to reinstate both the Pre-K Block and Pre-K for All Programs.

Last spring, board members acted cautiously in the uncertainty of continued state funding for Pre-Kindergarten and elected to cut the programs pending State budget decisions.

However, it appears the programs will be safe now for at least one more year.

“We have learned that both programs will be funded at last year’s amount,” Adams told the board indicating the amount of State funding to be at 90 percent. Adams told the board that his only concern is when the money will be received since the State has been late with payments.

The board approved re-assigning teacher Leslie Grieff from First Grade to Pre-K Block along with Tana Kopmann as the classroom Aide. Both had been with the Pre-K Block program last year.

A contract has been offered to fill the half-time

Pre-K for All teacher position pending Board approval. Filling the half-time Pre-K for All Aide position will be Martha Cockerham of Dwight. Cockerham has been an aide and a substitute teacher at the school. The former Parent Coordinator position will not be reinstated at this time.

Entry into Pre-K is determined through screenings to evaluate the needs of the student. The Pre-K Block program targets three to four year old children with the most developmental need and can serve 40 students. The Pre-K for All Program can serve 20 students aimed at pre-school children with more moderate needs.

In addition to reinstating Pre-K, the board also gave direction to move forward with full day Kindergarten. As of the meeting date, only 38 students have been enrolled in Kindergarten for the coming year. While numbers may still increase, it is believed that enrollment will be low enough to allow the full day option.

While full day Kindergarten will be offered, parents can refuse the option if they feel their child is not ready and participate in a half day program instead.

Employed to fill the open First Grade teacher position

was David Allen of Minooka. Mr. Allen is a recent graduate of Lewis University where he majored in Elementary Education.

Several resignations were also accepted by the board including the resignation of Amy Black as Reading Aide. Replacing Black will be Donna Stimac. Early Special Education Aide Karen Chipman also resigned with the board approving Chris Hansen to fill the ECE Aide position.

Bret Heinrich’s resignation from the DGS Board of Education was also accepted. Heinrich and his family will be relocating to Missouri. The board appointed Cathy Ferguson to the open board seat. Ferguson will fill out the term until April 2011 when it

will be placed on the ballot for election.

In other business, the board approved the annual:

- hazardous route designation as north of Route 17 and East of Route 47.
- \$4,000 contribution to the Track Maintenance Fund.
- \$1,000 contribution to the Baseball/Softball Maintenance Fund.
