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Drug Dog Wanted Heroin Bedevils Dwight

Syringes.
Syringes in Renfrew Park under the benches . . . in the walkway alongside the Bank of Dwight . . . syringes along Pinecone Path . . . on the East Delaware St. bridge . . . in the bushes recently removed near the railroad depot . . . syringes on the East Main St. sidewalk . . .

Syringes for injecting heroin.

"We are losing the battle" against heroin, said Dwight Chief of Police Tim Henson at a 6:30 p.m. meeting August 26 that he called in St. Patrick's parish hall.

Circuit Judge Jennifer Bauknecht stated, "Heroin is the biggest problem we have right now . . . drug use and the crime associated with it is the worst problem we have in Livingston County."

Bauknecht went on, "It's good to see that Dwight has recognized the problem. We see the problem every day in my courtroom."

Mike Burke stated, "In my nineteen years as coroner, Dwight still holds the title for the most lethal dose of a drug ingested by a

human being." The victim's body contained enough drugs to kill several other people, Burke said.

Norcan (a heroin antidote) saves a lot of people who become overdosed, according to Burke, so he doesn't know how many drug deaths there would be otherwise.

"There were 100 residents in Dwight on the known (drugs) user/seller list," said Henson, "but right now we're down to 98 because two of them have died."

This, and other testimony about drug use, especially heroin drug use, in Dwight was graphically portrayed to the 90 people who attended the August 26 meeting.

Heroin is regularly being brought into the community from Chicago and suburbs. Interstate 55 serves as the pipeline. Elaborate measures are sometimes taken to hide the heroin.

The majority of users are ages 12 to 26, but senior citizens are not exempt.

The addiction to heroin can be immediate, it is a powerful drug. Users that are rescued from the brink of death are oftentimes anxious to

shoot up again.

How can such drug use be controlled?

Two of the guests at the August 26 meeting were Fairbury policeman Rob McCormick and his drug dog *Gunnar*.

Gunnar gave an enthusiastic display of his ability to sniff out a can containing cocaine and another containing marijuana in a demonstration before the eyes of a highly attentive audience.

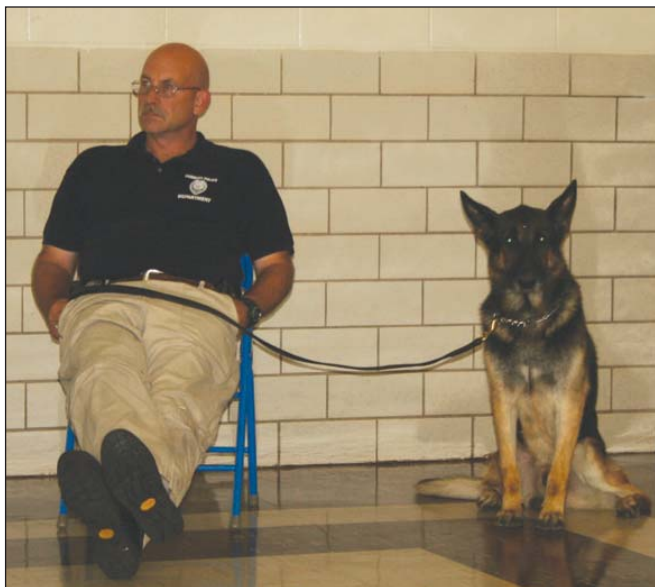
A drug dog like *Gunnar* is the tool that Henson said Dwight needs to fight the drug abuse prevalent in the community. Drug dogs have been successful in controlling heroin and other drug use in not only Fairbury and Pontiac, but across the country. Police forces in most major cities now use police dogs to sniff out illegal drugs, search buildings, track lost people and criminals, and protect their handlers.

Chief Henson told those assembled that the immediate need is to raise \$60,000 for a drug dog, training, a K-9 police car, and the equip-

The Chezaday Illusion Company intends to amaze its audience at 4 p.m. At 6 p.m., the 29th Annual Hare and Tortoise 5K Run and 2K Fun Walk starts at the Legion Community Center. Awards will be presented inside the Legion fol-

lowing the race/walk.

On Monday, September 6, there will be concession stand and game booths open all day in Village Park. The arts and crafts show opens at 9 a.m. in the State Bank of Herscher parking lot.

The Grand Parade steps off at 10:30 a.m. featuring the Herscher High School marching band, Olivet Nazarene University marching band, floats, horses, antique vehicles, farm equipment, marching units and more. Pat Wagner is the grand marshal this year.

The grand dinner will be served at 11:30 a.m. in the Herscher High School cafeteria by St. Margaret Mary Catholic Church. The menu includes barbecue chicken, (continued on page 6)

Mayor Vetoes Dwight Street Repaving Project

Village Moves Forward to Collect Outstanding Fines

The Chicago Street repaving project has been put on hold following a Notice of Veto given by Mayor Bill Wilkey to the Dwight Village Board of Trustees at its August 23 session. Mayor Wilkey's veto notice stated "for the reason that the street repair project should include the repair of additional streets by blacktopping as provided in the additional bid."

On August 9, the board

chose quality over quantity when it passed the Chicago Street project by a four-to-two vote authorizing the village to move forward with repaving Chicago Street from Philmar to Susan using concrete at an estimated cost of \$226,100. At that time, the board looked at proposals that included a base bid for milling and asphalt overlay of several streets, including two blocks of West Chippewa, Smith Lane, Sunset Drive, Morris Road north of the tracks and Chicago Street from Philmar to Susan, at a base bid of \$308,133. The board also looked at alternate bids of only the Chicago portion of the project using concrete instead of asphalt at \$226,100, or dropping the Chicago Street portion entirely for a bid price of \$195,090. It was determined that asphalt has a life span of 10 to 12 years, while concrete should last 40 years.

Budget for the project is \$250,000. Wilkey has been in favor of going over the budgeted allowance in order to address additional streets, while extending the budget concerned several board members.

At the next regular session on September 13, the board will respond to the mayor's veto via a second vote that will either change the board's original decision or override the mayor's veto.

In another matter, the Village of Dwight is moving forward with steps to ensure outstanding village fines and new ordinance violations are paid.

As reported in the July 14 edition of *The Paper*, unpaid tickets issued by Dwight police over the past two years currently total approximately \$3,500. In June, the village board agreed with a recommendation to hire attorneys Boggs & Fillen-

He has received permission from the village to seek private financing for the endeavor.

As of Monday, the program had received \$24,000 in pledges. One pledge was for \$5,000.

"I don't want to knock on any more doors and tell people that their loved one is no longer with us," said Henson. "We need everyone to help solve this problem."

An initial committee of six was formed to work for the establishment of the K9 unit. Members are Sharon Doyle, Justin Eggenberger, Larry Little, Phil Becker, Rodney Connor and Lou Cronin.

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MAKING SENSE OF INVESTING

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Are Your Investments Working as Hard as You Are?

worth LTD to attempt to recoup unpaid fines and then move forward with prosecuting outstanding unpaid ordinance violations. Approximately 110 unpaid violation letters are being drafted seeking payment.

The board discussed a proposal by Mayor Wilkey to lessen current outstanding fines in an effort to give one opportunity for violators to pay their overdue fines at a reduced rate and clear the books. However, a majority of board members opposed the proposal to reduce fines, and the village will seek payment in full from all violators. As part of the process change to ensure unpaid and contested violations are addressed and police officers are available for court appearances, the third Monday each month at 2 p.m. will be on the court schedule to hear Dwight ordinance violation cases.

In other business, appointments were made to reestablish the Village's Historic Preservation Committee. Recent landscaping work around

Dwight's historic depot has raised some concern that the new look does not complement the architectural structure of the building. The Preservation Committee will include Brad Wilkinson, Kim Drechsel, Mary Flott, Marylin Thorsen and Carol Siebert. The committee will work with IMPACT Dwight to review the current design.

Bids received by the village for painting of the west water tower were rejected by the board as higher than anticipated. The village will put the project out for bid again at a later date.

Safety concerns were brought to the board regarding Dwight Grade School children using a section of Columbia Street at Trojan Drive as a crosswalk. The area is not designated as a crossing. The village will notify the school that this area is not to be used for crossing unless it is established as a crosswalk.

Chief of Police Tim Henson again advised local residents to take necessary precautions to protect their property and valuables as police work to curtail burglaries in the village. Henson asks that anyone having any information about a crime or observing unusual behavior contact the

local police department.

Local resident Andy Kelleher addressed the board regarding a letter to the editor published in the August 18 edition of *The Paper* and signed by the board of trustees.

The board also:

- heard a Grundy County Economic Development Council update from Nancy Ammer.

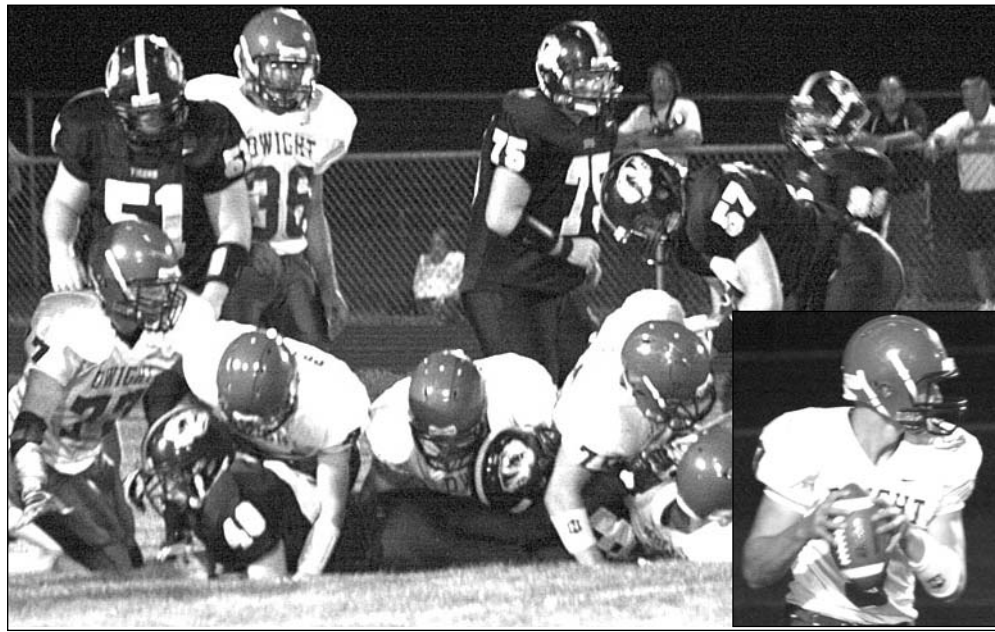

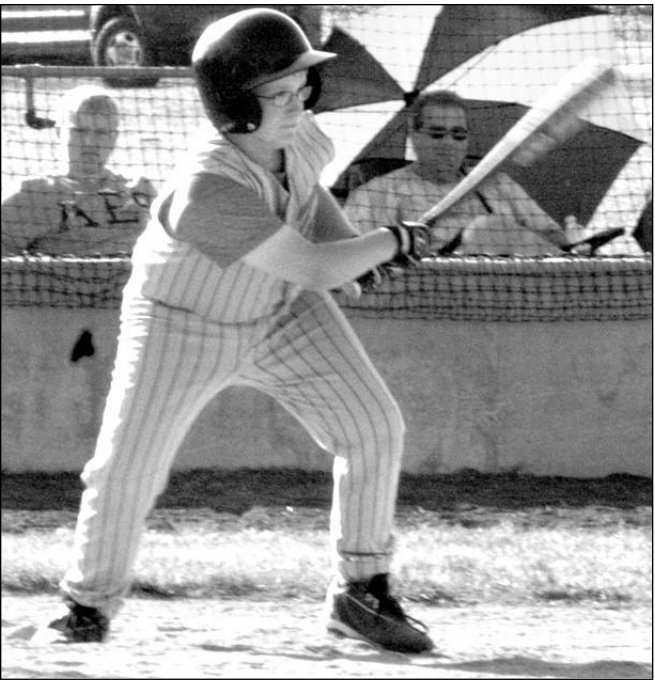
