DTHS Concert January 9

The Dwight Township High School 2010 Winter Concert, which was canceled on December 12 due to dangerous weather conditions, will take place Sunday, January 9, at 7 p.m. in the DTHS Auditorium.

The high school chorus and concert band will perform holiday favorites. Admission is free, and all are invited.

Next year, the railroad section between Dwight and Pontiac will become the first in the Chicago to St. Louis corridor to debut high-speed train travel.

Illinois Transportation Secretary Gary Hannig recently announced that a historic public-private partnership agreement on high-speed rail development is in place to bring Illinois one giant step closer to achieving high-speed passenger service between Chicago and St. Louis by 2014.

Governor Pat Quinn, U.S. Senator Dick Durbin and U.S. Transportation Secretary Ray LaHood together praised the signing of the historic Cooperative Agreement by the federal government, state government, Union Pacific Railroad and Amtrak as a crucial advance in the development of a planned high-speed passenger rail network that will serve Illinois and the Midwest region.

In September 2010, Governor Quinn announced that Illinois had become the first state in the nation to begin high-speed rail construction through an initial agreement to upgrade 90 miles of track between Alton and Lincoln. With the full Cooperative Agreement now in place, construction will continue in early spring from just south of Lincoln to Dwight. This phase of work is expected to conclude next fall.

The next step would then be the installation of new, enhanced grade crossing warning protection. The public can expect to enjoy its first taste of 110 mile-per-hour train service when a 20-mile segment between Dwight and Pontiac is completed in 2012. Procurement

of new cars and locomotives, as well as station upgrades, will be other facets of the project completed under the Cooperative Agreement.

"It's a wonderful day for Illinoisans as we celebrate a milestone achievement towards becoming the first state in the nation to bring high-speed rail to fruition," Governor Pat Quinn said.

The Cooperative Agreement also outlines current plans for 110-mph high-speed rail service upon the completion of the construction that began in September. The agreement calls for a total of five daily round trips between Chicago and St. Louis, including three daily high-speed round trips in the initial 2014 schedule — and confirms on-time performance expectations of at least 80 percent for the service. Expected reductions in travel time of as much as 48 minutes between Chicago and St. Louis are also noted in the agreement, shortening the trip between the two cities to as little as 4 hours, 32 minutes. Amtrak operates

passenger rail service along the route in cooperation with Union Pacific, which owns the track.

"Our priority in working out this agreement was to protect Union Pacific's ability to provide the exceptional freight service our customers need and expect, while helping public agencies invest in

improved passenger service," said Jim Young, Union Pacific chairman and chief executive officer. "This agreement allows us to deliver on those customer commitments.."

In January 2010, the Obama administration awarded Illinois more than \$1.2 billion in federal stimu-

lus funds for high-speed passenger rail projects, including corridor improvements on Illinois' signature route: Chicago to St. Louis.

Tanya Shannon's Body Found

The body of Tanya Shannon, 40, of Ransom was found in an open field in Brookfield Township, at 9:21 a.m., January 3, according to LaSalle County Sheriff Tom Templeton and Coroner Jody Bernard. Shannon had been missing since a single-vehicle crash on December 5 that killed her husband, Dale Shannon.

Reports said a body was found in a field near North 20th and East 27th roads. The location was approximately three-quarters of a mile from the site of the December 5 crash, according to the sheriff's office. The woman was reportedly wearing clothing that matched what Shannon was last seen wearing, and the sheriff's office confirmed that Shannon's purse was found with the body.

An autopsy and toxicology test have

been scheduled for this week.

The search for Shannon resumed January 3. It had been postponed due to winter weather conditions, but recent warmer temperatures melted the snow, allowing searching to continue.

Leading the search were the LaSalle County Sheriff's Office and the Illinois State Police, along with LaSalle County Emergency Management Ground Search and Rescue; ground search teams from Utica Fire, McLean County and Will County; search dogs from the Illinois-Wisconsin Search Group; American Red Cross of the Heartland; Seneca Fire Department; LaSalle County Sheriff's Office Mounted Posse; Brookfield Township officials; and the Illinois Emergency Management Agency Region 3 unified command vehicle.

August

Sheryl Thompson becomes the new warden at Dwight Correctional Center.

Spuds, Inc. announces its plans to start up in Dwight, manufacturing baby products from reclaimed potatoes.

CGB Enterprises announces its plans to build a major grain facility in rural Dwight, on Route 17.

IMPACT Dwight welcomes James Meece as its Americorps VISTA volunteer.

New landscaping and

brick work at Dwight's historic train depot brings cheers and jeers from area residents.

September

The Village of Herscher observes its 90th Labor Day celebration.

Ed Condon is welcomed as the new principal of St. Paul Catholic School, Odell.

After being placed on unpaid leave, former Odell and Pontiac public library director Eric Colclasure is charged with two counts of theft over \$10,000 of government property for intercepting checks intended for Pontiac Public Library.

In two separate incidents, three Dwight residents are arrested on drug-related charges, including possession and delivery of heroin.

After donations from various individuals and groups, and with help from community volunteers, a new playground is built at South

Wilmington Grade School.

October

Dr. Ruth Schneider resigns as Herscher school district superintendent after being placed on leave in September. The Herscher school board agrees not to comment on why Schneider was placed on leave. Dr. Rick Bukowski is soon hired as interim superintendent.

With private, community funding, Dwight Police reach their goal of raising \$60,000 to bring a drug-sniffing dog to the department.

The "pumpkin fairy" places autumn decorations outside businesses in downtown Kempton.

The Gardner Memory Gazebo project wins the Governor's Hometown Award.

November

The Mobile Home Parks section of Dwight's Municipal Code is amended, following concerns raised after

the June 5 tornado that destroyed Dwight Mobile Home Park.

A monument is dedicated in Oak Lawn Cemetery to Dwight's only Medal of Honor winner, Henry Fox, who took heroic action during the Civil War.

Voters pass the Dwight Grade School referendum, creating a 50-cent increase to the district's maximum education fund tax rate in order to help maintain class and extracurricular offerings at the school.

The Village of Dwight suspends impact fees in an effort to encourage new home construction.

Talia Fonce, 30, of Cullom, is found guilty of solicitation of murder for hire.

Summer-like Storms Ring in New Year

A "heatwave" of temperatures in excess of 50 degrees on December 31 brought thunderstorms, flooding and even tornado warnings to the area.

Thunderstorms in the early morning hours of the last day of 2010 melted much of the snow that had accumulated, causing flooding in some low-lying areas. Rain continued during the morning, and in the afternoon, storms returned in a

front that stretched across Illinois.

In the early afternoon, the National Weather Service issued a tornado warning for Livingston County, in effect until 2 p.m. The dangerous storm affected "mainly rural areas of eastern Livingston County," according to the NWS.

A tornado watch was also issued for Livingston, Kankakee and Ford counties; the watch was in effect until 7 p.m. on December 31.

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New 2011 Illinois Laws Are Now in Effect

Almost 200 new laws went into effect on January 1, according to State Sen. John O. Jones (R-Mt. Vernon).

Included are pension reforms for most new public employees, limits on campaign contributions, requiring governor and lieutenant governor candidates to run as a team in primaries and changes to laws regarding the use of red-light cameras, Jones said.

Also of note is legislation requiring mandatory imprisonment for aggravated weapons convictions and a number of new measures to stiffen penalties for sex offenders, along with a measure targeting "sexting."

Some laws of particular interest, relevant to the local area, or oddity include the following.

Driving and traffic

- Increased penalties for drivers transporting a child passenger who fail to properly secure the child in the appropriate child restraint system.

- An administrative fee increase for DUI violations from \$500 to \$750 and a larger percentage of the fine to the arresting law enforcement agency.

- It is now a moving violation for a person who is under the influence of alcohol or drugs to accompany or provide instruction to a driver who is a minor operating the motor vehicle with an instruction permit.

- The driver of a motor vehicle is required to properly adjust and fasten a seat safety belt if transporting a passenger who is unable to buckle himself due to infirmity, illness or age but who is not exempted from wearing a seat safety belt.

- A new law raises the penalty for driving a vehicle at a speed that is 30 mph or more over the posted limit, and prohibits a defendant

from receiving supervision for a speeding violation of 40 mph or more over the posted speed limit.

Business

- An employer may not inquire about an applicant's or employee's credit history.

- A new law creates a grant program for manufacturers with 500 or fewer employees for the cost of capital equipment that will reduce environmental impact and achieve cost savings.

- Prior to the filing of any proposed rule or amendment that may have an adverse impact on small businesses, an economic impact analysis that includes certain information must be prepared.

Military

- Children and grandparents are added to the list of people eligible for Family Military Leave, if a loved one is on active military duty for more than 30 days.

- Members of the armed forces may vote by fax or email.

Politics and government

- For all new government hires, the standard retirement age is raised to 67, and if someone retires with a government pension, they cannot collect that pension and then return to government work.

- A new law requires that a public body approve minutes of its open meeting within 30 days after the meeting or at its next regularly scheduled meeting, and also requires that a public body make its approved meeting minutes available for public inspection, and if the public body has a website, post those minutes within 10 days after approval of the minutes.

- The financing of a governor's portrait is banned if the governor was removed from office by impeachment and conviction (nicknamed the "No Blagojevich Portrait law").

- The general primary election is moved to the third Tuesday of March in even-numbered years.

- Political contributions for individual candidates will be limited to \$5,000 from individuals and \$10,000 from corporations, labor unions and trade associations.

Sex offenses

- Sexual predators and child sex offenders are prohibited from being in a public park or loitering within 500 feet of a public park.

- A minor who electronically sends an indecent image of another minor can be brought into juvenile court for a proceeding to determine if the sender is a minor in need of supervision.

Drugs

- Two synthetic marijuana-like substances, commonly known as K2 or Spice, are outlawed.

Firearms

- Mandatory imprisonment of one to three years for an individual who was 18 years or older, who did not have a valid FOID card and who possessed a loaded and uncased firearm (also applies if the firearm was unloaded but ammunition was accessible).

Nature, hunting, fishing

- The Department of Natural Resources is now allowed to assess a fee of up to \$1,000 for the reinstatement of revoked licenses, permits, registrations and other privileges that it administers.

Pets

- Animal shelters, animal control facilities and pet shops must disclose certain information regarding dogs and cats that are being adopted or purchased.

- Possession of any primate (such as a monkey or chimpanzee) is prohibited, except in a properly designated facility.

A few other laws of note, which cross category boundaries, include:

- A new law creates a system of independent review teams to hold inquiries into the deaths of residents of state-operated facilities for people with developmental disabilities and/or mental illness.

- The sunset for the uniformed assessment methodology on wind farms is extended until 2016 rather than 2011.

- The first full week in January is designated as Emancipation Proclamation Week.

- A licensed cosmetologist is allowed to provide hair braiding services without being licensed as a hair braider, and lesser education requirements are provided for hair braiders as compared to licensed cosmetologists.

- The Department of Public Health may not regulate honey that is left in the comb or that is removed from the comb in an unadulterated condition.

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Smart Financial Moves for New Parents

- Prepare a will. Obviously, you hope to enjoy a long life – one in which you see your child grow to adulthood. But none of us can predict the future, so it's essential that you draw up a will to provide for the care of your child, both financially and physically. When you create a will, you can name a guardian to step in and take care of your child, if necessary, and you can make sure your child receives your financial assets. However, many people go beyond writing a will and establish a living trust, which gives them more control over how and when they want their assets distributed. Your legal advisor can help you prepare a will and determine if a living trust is appropriate for your needs.

- Maintain adequate cash. To help pay for all those expenses related to child rearing, keep enough cash on hand. By having enough resources available in liquid accounts, you can avoid having to dip into your long-term investments to pay for short-term needs.

- Save early and often for college. It's never too soon to start saving for the high costs of higher education. A 529 plan is a tax-advantaged vehicle and may be a great option for your college savings. Contributions to a 529 plan are made with after-tax dollars, and have the opportunity to grow tax-free. Withdrawals used for qualified higher education expenses are also tax free. Furthermore, your 529 plan contributions may be eligible for a state tax deduction or credit depending on the plan and state.

- Stay balanced. As we've seen, it takes a lot of money to raise a child. But even as you're meeting these expenses, think about your own future, particularly your retirement. Strive to strike a balance between the money you spend on your child and the amount you invest in your 401(k), IRA and other retirement-savings vehicles.

You can't put a price-tag on your child's future, but when it comes to taking care of that child, you'll want to know the costs involved – and be prepared for them.

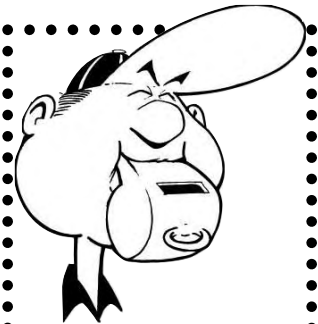

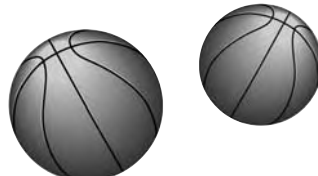

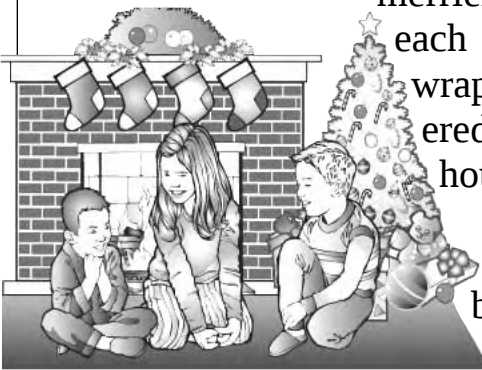
each year match or exceed what is donated during the kettle drive, so essentially, all the funds raised in Dwight are returned to those in need in the Dwight community.
