Aerial History Being Re-created in Aero Acres Hangar

History is in the re-making at Aero Acres near Campus, where Chuck and Brad Brady are combining their talents with those of many others to re-create a Sopwith Pup, a World War I single seat scout and fighter aircraft that saw considerable duty in The Great War, 1914-18.

The Sopwith Pup at Aero Acres is not a scaled-down model of the once popular WWI plane . . . it IS a Sopwith Pup, constructed piece by piece from the original factory plans. It will be the exact size of the original plane and ready to be piloted.

Once inspected and test flown, this Pup will embark on a flight to the World War I Dawn Patrol Rendezvous at the Dayton, Ohio National Museum of the Air Force September 26 and 27 this year.

The Dayton fly-in will commemorate the 100th anniversary of the start of World War I in Europe, and also highlight the impact made by fledgling military

aircraft during their first large-scale use in wartime situations, 1914-1918.

Construction of the Sopwith Pup at Aero Acres began about two years ago. It is the dream of Joe Hawk of New Berlin, Wisconsin. Hawk had compared notes over the phone with Chuck Brady of Dwight on numerous occasions regarding his hopes to build the aircraft.

After doing a lot of the Pup's framing in Wisconsin, Hawk moved the final stages of the work to a hangar at the Bradys' farm and airstrip north of Campus.

At present, the wings, rudder and elevator of the Pup have been covered with heat-shrinkable fabric, and await final painting and assembly. The fuselage of the aircraft is partially covered, a rebuilt seven-cylinder radial engine has been mounted, wiring and tubing for modern-day amenities such as an electric starter and hydraulic brakes have been installed, and the end of construction is in sight.

Who will fly the Pup to

Dayton? Probably Hawk or Chuck or Brad Brady. Navigation will be visual, a map-in-the-lap, if you will, like in 1916!

Chuck has experienced and overcome the difficulties inherent in these building projects on several previous occasions. In the '80s he built and flew a vintage 1918 French Nieuport 28 biplane for several years. His Nieuport later graced an Alabama, and then a Netherlands, aircraft museum.

More recently, a WWI German Fokker D VI was completed and flown. The Fokker was partially destroyed in a hangar fire at Aero Acres in 2001. It has been rebuilt and may also be flown to Dayton.

A Boeing P26 "Peashooter" is also under construction at Aero Acres.

Chuck's son, Brad, has been instrumental in the construction of these WWI aircraft. Brad is a licensed commercial pilot and also a licensed aircraft and engine (continued on page 10)





Accident Destroys Pillars at Renfrew Park, Dwight

An early morning accident Saturday, May 17, 2014 at a south walking entryway to Renfrew Park, Dwight, leveled two historic upright pillars.

Stephen D. Mathews of Dwight was driving a 1999 Chevrolet Blazer northbound on Prairie Avenue, approaching North Street.

Mathews told Dwight Police Officer Mark Scott that he applied the brakes one-half block before North Street, "but the brakes did not work." His auto struck the brick pillars on the sidewalk just west of the driveway entrance to Renfrew Park.

Mathews stated he was traveling at 15 mph, and that the brakes on his Blazer had just been repaired the day before, according to the police report.

The demolished pillars were brick on the outside, poured concrete on the inside, and each had a large cement cap on top.

McKee Sentenced on DUI Charges

 Dwight Police Officer Watson McKee, seriously injured in an off-duty one-vehicle accident Dec. 21, 2013, pled guilty to driving under the influence of alcohol in Livingston County Circuit Court Thursday, May 15.

A charge of driving too fast for conditions was dismissed.

A special prosecutor had been appointed to investigate the accident.

McKee was sentenced to two years court supervision terminating May 15, 2016; 240 hours of community work to be served by Nov. 15, 2015; ordered not to use

or possess any alcohol or enter any place where the sale of alcohol is the principal business; ordered not to operate a motor vehicle that is not equipped with a blood alcohol ID device except for employment purposes; show proof of evaluation/treatment counseling by Aug. 15, 2014; show proof of attending a victim impact panel by Nov. 15, 2015.

In addition, fines and costs totaling \$2,908 are to be paid by McKee by Nov. 15, 2015.

Dwight village officials have been awaiting the outcome of the accident investigation before taking any action in the matter.

Avoid Problems by Updating Beneficiary Designations

Like many people, you might not particularly enjoy thinking about your estate plans, but such planning is necessary to make sure your assets go where you want them to go. And it's just as important to regularly review your plans with your tax, legal and financial professionals in case any changes are needed. For instance, some of your wishes expressed in your will may be overridden by beneficiary designations you filled out years ago. If these designations become outdated, your assets could be passed to those you didn't intend.

You might be surprised at how many of your financial assets and legal documents have beneficiary designations tied to them. If you have an IRA, a 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan, a life insurance policy, an annuity, a transfer-on-death (TOD) arrangement, or any of a variety of other assets or accounts, you almost certainly named a beneficiary. And this beneficiary designation offers a simple, direct and efficient way to get assets in the hands of your loved ones who survive you.

Dwight Village Board May Actions

 The Village of Dwight Board of Trustees met on May 12 at the Public Services Complex.

A three year agreement between the Village of Dwight and Local 399 International Union of Operating Engineers was approved by the board. The contract will see Dwight's Public Works employees receiving salary increases of 2 percent for Fiscal Year 15; 2.25 percent for FY 16; and 2.5 percent for FY 17.

It was learned that village streets totaling six blocks are slated for repair this summer. Bids were opened last week for the following: W. Seminole Street (3 blocks from Clinton to Franklin); Clinton Street (2 blocks from Rt. 17 to Chippewa Street); and Carriage House Lane (1 block).

In public forum, a local addressed the board with a request that he proposed might help to save village streets. The Prospect Avenue resident requested that the board consider the elimination of residential street salting in winter months noting reasons such as damage to

streets, shrubbery and lawns caused by the salting chemicals used along with a potential cost saving for the village. He suggested that village streets that are along the school bus route continue to be salted along with the Routes 17 and 47 highways which run through the village, but that all other residential streets be plowed only. The board agreed to send the request to the Properties Committee to review.

In reports to the board, Village Administrator Kevin McNamara reported that approximately 700 people signed the guest book at the historic Ambler Becker Station during the recent Springfest celebration. The station's welcome center will be open from 10 a.m. – 4 p.m. daily for the summer beginning Memorial Day. Volunteers to help greet visitors are welcome and encouraged.

Many thanks were given to the residents and DTHS students that helped with the community clean-up day. It was called a "great effort by the entire community."

EMS Director Al Metzke reminded everyone that

EMS Week is slated for May 18 – 24. An open house will take place at the Dwight Public Services Complex from 7 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday – Friday and 8 a.m. to Noon on Saturday.

Residents are again reminded to keep valuables out of sight and vehicles locked as potential for thefts increase with warm weather.

In other matters, the board approved:

- a Dwight Fire Fighters "Boot" bucket brigade for June 14 from 7 a.m. – 4 p.m. at the corners of Routes 17 and 47 with the money to be used for Smokey the Bear repairs.
- a liquor license request for LiLi Mae's to be located at 14 E. Burbeck Drive.
- a bid of \$19,004.40 from Braniff Communications/Federal Signal for replacement of the village warning siren located at Stevenson Pool.

The next meeting of the Dwight Village Board of Trustees will be Monday, June 9, in the Public Services Complex. Please note that the second May meeting is cancelled this month due to Memorial Day.

DGS Board of Education May Actions

School Lunch Prices to Increase/Summer Projects Planned

As Fiscal Year 2014 begins to wind down, many items were on the agenda when the Dwight Grade School Board of Education met on May 14.

School lunches will increase for the 2014-15 school year following board approval. According to District Superintendent Dr. Richard Jancek, as a participant in the National School Lunch Program, the District must raise its price for student lunches 10 cents and then continue to increase the price by 10 cents each year for the next few years. The NSLP has determined that each student lunch is valued at \$2.99. Currently, the district charges \$2.25 for a regular student lunch. Students on the reduced lunch program pay .40 cents with the Federal Government reimbursing the District \$2.59. The Federal Government reimburses the District \$2.99 for students on the free lunch program. According to NSLP, the District needs to close the gap between the price of a regular student lunch and the free and reduced reimbursement price. In addition to the increase in plate lunch prices, some individually priced items will also

increase.

In another matter, the board approved an Illinois School Security Grant of \$14,375 to be used for a main entrance security system. The quote for the system is \$21,000; sales tax revenue used to make up the balance. The system will be installed this summer. Other summer projects planned will include painting, hallway ceiling tile improvements, a new concrete bike rack area, and way to address the current gap between the sidewalk and the front drive. The board also discussed installing security cameras at each doorway entrance to the building (12 cameras total) at a cost of \$27,680. Some board members felt cameras impose a privacy issue while others were in favor of the monitoring system.

"I am in full support of [security cameras]," said board member Bo Partney. "It changes people's behaviors. I understand the privacy issue, but this is a public building."

The security camera question will come back to the board next month for a final decision.

In business related to staffing, the board approved a recommendation to employ Jessica Moyemont as a Special Education

Teacher. Miss Moyemont comes to the district with one year of experience and will start at a Bachelor's Year 2 level.

The board approved the re-employment of all support staff for 2014-15 and also approved a three-percent increase in hourly wages for these support staff. One exception to the support staff increase was for School Nurse Jane Fritch, who was approved for a four-percent hourly wage increase. Total current salaries for all support staff is \$475,315. An increase of three percent would equate to an additional \$14,259 or a total of \$489,574.

The board also:

- affirmed a payment of \$8,815 to Heartland Bank & Trust Company (Go Bond Interest).

- accepted the resignation, Angie Goley, Cheerleading Sponsor & Competitive Cheer.

- approved 8th Grade promotions as presented, pending successful completion of all requirements.

- approved the Board Meeting Schedule for 2014-2015; board meetings will remain on the second Wednesday of the month at 6 p.m.

- approved Summer Maintenance employees.

- approved Substitute list for continuation of employment 2014-2015.

- approved tenured teachers for 2014-2015.

- approved Parent / Community member volunteer list.

- discussed and approved the 2014-2015 Student Handbook and recommended changes.

- approved a three-Year contract with Center Point Energy, Natural Gas Supplier.


Tri-Point K-8 Art Show

Lt. Andrew Kelson Completes Hazardous Materials Class

Lieutenant Andrew Kelson of the Dwight Fire Protection District recently completed a Hazardous Materials Class called "Statewide Weapons of Mass Destruction Response: Hazardous Materials Technician B."

This class was a 40-hour class and was held in Alsip in April. Prior to taking the course, Kelson had to complete two other 40-hour classes and one eight-hour class in the Hazmat field.

This course prepares local responders to operate as a team within the National Incident Management System at a CBRNE (Chemical, Biological, Radiological, Nuclear, or Explosive) Weapons of Mass Destruction event. In the class, Kelson learned self-protection measurements and rescue and evacuation procedures. He was taught to mitigate incidents involving hazardous materials as well. Students learned and had to demonstrate proper

understanding of monitoring, detection, and basic skills needed to evaluate and work at an incident such as identifying basic hazard and risk assessment techniques and selecting and using proper personal protective equipment. Kelson also learned and demonstrated the understanding of standard operating guidelines and termination procedures for incidents involving the release of hazardous materials and/or CBRNE agents.

This particular class was taught through the Illinois Fire Service Institute and was free to students due to a state-funded grant program called Cornerstone. Lieutenant Kelson plans to use his training to help train the Dwight Fire Protection District members to better prepare for such incidents in the area. He also has big plans to start a Hazardous Materials Response Team in Livingston County.



LETTER TO THE EDITOR

Think Green

That mankind's general effect on the natural world has become noxious is almost a cliché.

Monarch butterflies struggle into Yucatan three weeks late, their numbers diminished, because we've cut down or poisoned the milkweed they feed on by the roadsides.

A 1999 report by the U.S. Geological Survey "found at least one pesticide, and often more than one, in almost every stream and fish sample tested, and in about half the samples drawn from wells throughout the country" Diane Lewis reveals in a New York Times article ("The Toxic Brew In Our Yards," May 11, 2014). This physician, founder of the Great Healthy Yard Project, reports on the newest scientific findings that synthetic pesticides such as glyphosate, carbaryl, malathion, and 2, 4-D, used as a quick fix on our lawns, and previously thought to be "acceptable" in small amounts, get into ground

water, and have a cumulative effect on the human body, not only carcinogenic, but messing up the entire endocrine system (glands and hormones), which pretty much run the human body. "The United States Fish and Wildlife Service says homeowners use up to ten times more chemicals than farmers do," she observes.

I love a beautiful lawn as much as anyone, but we might rethink how we achieve that without dousing our lawns in synthetic pesticides. There are natural products on the market, such as the by-product of corn syrup manufacture, which, spread spring and fall, prevent weed sprouts from forming feeder shoots. There is an elongated, hand-held "gun" which zaps the centers of weeds with an electric shock. We ought to look into the matter, if not for our own sakes, for the sake of our grandchildren.

Just saying.
