## Petitions Still Available for Dwight Trustee **December 8 Board Actions**

Petitions for the position of Trustee for the Village of Dwight are still available for the April 7, 2015 Election. Consolidated Three openings for Dwight Trustee seats will on the ballot as terms held by Nick Kester, Marla Kinkade, and Tim Dougherty expire.

At the December 8 Dwight Village Board session, Village Clerk Patti Drechsel stated that the first day to file a petition for Trustee was Monday, December 15 with the last filing date being December 22. Candidates must be residents of the Village of Dwight. Petitions may be picked up at Dwight's Village Hall.

Also at the recent board session, Mayor Jared Anderson commended those responsible for December 5 Christmas Parade and all the various Christmas activities over that weekend.

In other business, the board approved:

· a Resolution required by IDOT committing local funds (20 percent) for the Transportation Illinois Program Enhancement (ITEP) grant for the Pine Cone Path extension to Lions Lake; total project cost estimate \$757,267.00.

• a Mutual Aid Box Alarm System Addendum & Ordinance (verbiage change).

· a request by two minor FCCLA students requesting to hold a bucket brigade on December 13 at the Rt. 17 and 47 intersections for the purpose of raising funds for an FCCLA National project with the stipulation that an adult accompany each student soliciting funds and all safety and insurance requirements were met; Trustee Jerry Curtis opposed the motion with Mayor Jared Anderson casting a yes vote.

The next meeting of the Dwight Village Board of Trustees will be Monday, December 22, at 6:30 p.m. in the Public Services Complex.

## Gardner Village Board Approves Christmas Bonuses, Pays School District

The Gardner Village Board met in regular session on December 8 with Commissioner Dick Hileman serving as Mayor Pro-Tem in the absence of Mayor Tom Wise.

The board discussed and approved three prizes: \$50, \$75, and \$100, for the annual holiday Home Decorating

Contest. Hileman reported the funds had been taken from the General Fund in the past, but will come from the gambling funds this year.

The board also approved Christmas bonuses and days off for the Village employees. Hileman commented the Village has just over \$1,000 in funds from sale of scrap iron and batteries and he proposed \$100 bonuses

for full-time, \$75 for parttime, four hours paid time off Christmas Eve and New Year's Eve. and eight hours paid for Christmas Day and New Year's Day. A weather or other emergency would

pre-empt the holidays. Commissioner Terry Jensen reported the water project is proceeding but urged residents to conserve water on December 8 to sup-

Commissioner Mike Serena thanked his family and everyone else who helped with the Christmas Tree Lighting on December 1. Commissioner Rob Wolf commented he would like to see new businesses meet with the Village officials prior to beginning business-

## John Howard Report Debunks Savings on **Dwight Prison Closing**

The highly respected John Howard Association of Illinois, a prison watchdog group, has released its long-awaited report on conditions at Logan Correctional Center, Lincoln, where all of Dwight Correctional Center's inmates were transferred in March of 2013.

DCC was then closed, at an alleged annual saving of \$37-million.

In news stories immediately following the issuing of the John Howard report, Executive Director John Maki of JHA was quoted as stating, "I don't think any money has been saved."

The cover letter on the John Howard report

"In 2013-14, JHA conducted three monitoring

tional Center. In March 2013, the facility was repurposed as a multiple security level female facility, which also operates the female intake Reception and Classification Center for the Illinois Department of Corrections.

"In our special report, 'Overcrowded, Underresourced, and Ill-Conceived: Logan Correctional Center, 2013/14,' we document our findings and recommendations:

In 2013, the Quinn administration closed several correctional facilities in the face of severe prison overcrowding, consolidating the majority of its female prison population in Logan, (formerly) a male medium security prison, without adequate resources to do so or a viable plan to reduce the prison population.

"- While the Quinn administration argued repurposing Logan would reduce costs and create a more efficient and rehabilitative environment for the state's female prison population, it has exacerbated overcrowded conditions, damaged IDOC's capacity to address the needs of female inmates, and failed to generate meaningful cost savings.

"— Without significant reductions in Illinois' female prisoner population, the best that IDOC's staff and administration can do with Logan is to try to sustain a precarious, ineffective, and expensive status quo."





The Town of Chatsworth's Town Board meeting was called to order at 7 p.m. on Thursday, December 11, 2014 by Mayor Richard Runyon. All board members were present and the minutes from the last meeting were

Water Tower and Well Security was discussed and fencing prices for each site will be gathered and discussed at the next meeting.

Ty Eschelman, representing the Overland Properties Group and Dollar General, requested a rezoning of the corner property purchased for the use of a new Dollar General store from R1 to a Commercial Zoning. According to plan, the Dollar General will break ground and have a fully operational store in eight weeks. The opening of the store hopes to entice more businesses to open in Chatsworth.





#### Seek to Balance "Risk Tolerance" and "Required Risk"

Like everyone else, you have financial goals. To help achieve these goals, you may need to invest — and when you invest, you'll need to take on some risk. But the more you understand this risk, and the better you are at managing it, the greater your potential for staying invested for the long term.

To begin with, then, take a look at these terms:

Risk tolerance — Your risk tolerance is essentially your comfort level with taking risk. For example, if you have a high tolerance for risk, you may be comfortable investing aggressively. Conversely, if you tend to be risk-averse, you might lean more toward more conservative investment vehicles that offer greater protection of princi-

Required risk — While the term "required risk" may sound odd, it is actually an integral component of your ability to invest successfully. Basically, your required risk is the level of risk necessary to help you achieve your investment goals. The higher the return necessary to reach those goals, the more potential risk you'll need to

As you invest, you'll need to balance these two aspects of risk. For example, what might happen if you have a low risk tolerance, leading you toward "safer," low-growth investments, but your goal is to retire early? For most people, this goal requires them to invest in vehicles that offer significant growth potential, such as stocks. And, as you know, investing in stocks entails risk — specifically, the risk that your stocks will lose value. So in this situation, your risk tolerance — the fact that you are risk-averse — is going to collide with your required risk level, the amount of risk you are going to need to take (by investing in stocks) to achieve your goal of early retirement.

When such a collision occurs, you have two choices. First, you could 'stretch" your risk tolerance and accept the need to take on riskier investments in exchange for the growth potential you will require. Your other choice is to stay within your risk tolerance and adjust your ultimate goal - which, in this example, may mean accepting a later retirement date.

Obviously, this is a personal decision. However, you may have more flexibility than you might have imagined. For instance, you might feel that you should be risk-averse because you have seen so many fluctuations in the financial markets. But if you have many decades to go until you retire, you actually do have time to recover from short-term losses, which means you may be able to reasonably handle more volatility. On the other hand, once you're retired, you won't have as many years to bounce back from market downturns, so you'll have less "risk capacity" than you did when you were

In any case, by balancing your risk tolerance and your required risk level — and by understanding your risk capacity — you can be better prepared to take the emotion out of investing. When investors let their emotions get the better of them, they can make mistakes such as chasing "hot" stocks or selling quality investments due to temporary price drops. By having a clear sense of what risk really entails, however, you may be able to avoid costly detours - and stick with your long-term investment strategy.



## **Dwight's Sales Tax Revenue Improves**

by Tom Tock

After several quarters of declining sales tax revenue, the Village of Dwight improved its third quarter 2014 municipal sales tax income by almost \$10,000 compared to the third quarter of 2013.

Dwight had sales tax income of \$174,671 in the third quarter of 2014, \$164,901 in the third quarter of 2013.

The Livingston County part of Dwight had third quarter 2014 sales tax revenue of \$117,531 compared to \$114,590 in 2013, while the Grundy County portion of Dwight continued to increase its share of local sales tax revenue to \$57,140 from \$50,311 in 2013.

Dwight, Grundy County, provided nearly a third, 32.7%, of Dwight sales taxes in the third quarter of this year. A year ago in the same quarter it provided 30.5% of the total collected.

Dwight's strongest sales tax categories continued to be Automotive and Filling Stations, and Drinking and Eating Places.

Fairbury showed an excellent gain in the third quarter, posting sales tax revenue of \$186,806.

## County School Funding Sales Tax Reported

The Paper's quarterly sales tax reports, such as the one to the left, compare municipal sales tax figures received from the Illinois Department of Revenue. Figures are compared with those from previous quarters and from previous years.

A new 1¢ countywide sales tax went into effect in Livingston County beginning January 1, 2014 — the School Funding Sales Tax.

This tax revenue can be used by schools within Livingston County "only for maintaining, renovating and upgrading existing school facilities, for new construction and paying off building bonds that can help reduce property taxes." Each school district decides how to use its revenues from this tax.


The school tax is not collected on vehicle sales, groceries, medicine, farm equipment or parts.

The total amount collected countywide since the beginning of the application of this sales tax, January 1, 2014, through September 30, 2014, is \$2,132,936.

The amount of the School Funding Sales Tax collected in Dwight since the first of the year is \$204,174.

All of the money collected countywide with this tax is redistributed to school districts throughout the county based on a school district's enrollment.
