# Dwight Approves Tower Allowing for Local Radio Station

January 26 Village Board Actions

The Village of Dwight took action on January 26 approving a special use permit that would allow for a local radio station to be operational from Dwight.

WGVD 97.3 FM is being planned to operate as a ministry of the Frist Baptist Church of Dwight. Programing for the conservative Christian station is proposed to include 60 percent music and 40 percent programming including weather, local news, some local sports and events coverage and a variety of other programming options.

The station will reach over 2,000 square miles reaching nearly 100,000 people. Live streaming internet radio is also part of the plan.

"The Gospel knows no boundaries, and the future of WGVD has possibilities we cannot even begin to imagine thanks to the tool of internet radio and the blessings of God," stated Dr. Daniel Woodward, Pastor of First Baptist Church, in a letter.

The Special Use permit will allow for a 105 foot tower with a 4 x 4 foot base to be erected on property owned by the Dwight Baptist Church and Academy. In addition to the tower, a climate controlled 8 x 8 foot building will be constructed to house the transmitter.

Trustee Nick Kester expressed concerns centered mainly on whether the tower would be intrusive to the neighboring residential area. Trustees Kester and Tim Dougherty voted against the move, while Randy Irvin, Justin Eggenberger and Mayor Jared Anderson voted in favor. Jerry Curtis and Marla Kinkade were not present.

The proposal is for the

radio station to be operational by August.

In other business, the board approved a Star-Com Radio System proposal for Dwight EMS and Police. Star-Com is a state of the art radio system currently used by the Illinois State Police which would allow users to talk with other police and governmental agencies such as IMEA and IDOT statewide. The County Board has agreed to pick up the cost of providing mobile and portable radios to all of the police agencies in the County. The system, owned and operated by Motorola, does carry a \$386 user fee.

0Dwight issued one residential permit in 2014 breaking a two year streak where zero new residential permits were issued by the Village. Comparing the past ten years, 2005 was the top new residential single family home growth year for the village with 15 new residential permits issued; a marked decline has since followed. Building Permits for 2014 totaled 83 with the total value of these permits at \$3,034,743.14. The one new residential permit issued was valued at \$60,000; 64 residential permits for alterations/additions totaled \$288,214.14; one new Commercial permit; and 17 Commercial permits for alterations/additions totaled \$436,529.00.

In his report to the board, Chief of Police Tim Henson gave an update on the January 24 robbery at Casey's General Store on Union Street where an undisclosed amount of currency was taken. A suspect is in custody. Anyone with information is asked to call Detective Gary Beier, Dwight Police, at 815-584-3132.

# Dwight Mayor Anderson Previews Upcoming Projects

The Paper recently asked Dwight Mayor Jared Anderson to expound on a number of important matters facing the community. His responses follow:

#### • High-Speed Rail Work

Mayor: We met January 13 with representatives from the Illinois Department of Transportation rail division and the construction designer from Parson's Brinkerhoff to address issues brought up at our October meeting.

That meeting consisted of Dwight's Village Board as well as business owners on East and West Main, as well as residents from the Dwight community. Many issues were brought to light that evening, we identified the most important concerns and addressed those to IDOT.

Among those items was the loss of business parking as presented in the new (downtown crossings) design for East and West Main Streets, and an agreement to install new water main on Route 17 from Prairie to the Gooseberry Creek bridge on Route 17.

The meeting went very well for all parties involved. An agreement was reached for added parking to replace that to be removed near some businesses, and information was provided to IDOT so they could finalize an intergovernmental agreement for installing new water main if Dwight provides the materials needed, and the contractor hired for the crossing improvements would install the new water main under contract to IDOT.

We expect to receive revised plans for construction in the near future and IDOT wishes to have this on a bid letting in the coming months.

The question that remains is if the work will be started and completed this year or be started and completed next year. This will be dependent on final drawings, completing necessary land acquisition and land easements, to have a better idea of the time frame for the beginning of crossing improvements.

My opinion is that this will happen in the spring of 2016 and only utility relocations will happen this year.

Dwight is looking at a number of improvements in downtown Dwight besides the High Speed Rail crossings: sidewalk, street lighting, electrical improvements, curb and gutter and repaying of streets.

This work would include

part of East/West Main Streets, Prairie Avenue, Chippewa, Franklin and Delaware Streets, as well as Park Street behind East Main Street businesses.

These improvements are estimated to be a \$3-million investment if they are to become a reality. The way we would pay for these improvements would be by taking out a bond to be repaid over 10 years. We have two bonds that mature this year, and the amount we are paying on those would almost cover the yearly cost of a new bond.

We would also be using funds we have received from High Speed Rail agreements -- \$150,000 from closing the sidewalk at the depot, \$100,000 for easement agreements, and an estimated \$150,000 from the state to repave East and West Main, so that will give us a good start.

#### • New HSR Depot

Dwight was selected to have a new depot to service AMTRAK HSR. The Village has all agreements in place and is now waiting for construction drawings. We are anticipating we will receive drawings by the end

of February, or early March.

Dwight will be directing and placing the new depot construction for bids. We will be soliciting bids for a general contractor and contractors to complete the work. We will be expecting construction to be complete by year's end; this will only happen if the designers can

deliver complete construction drawings in a timely manner.

#### • Depot Rehab

We were awarded a grant for rehabilitation work for the existing depot; we are talking with IDOT and the state historic preservation authority. We have to follow strict guidelines for any work on the depot because it is on the National Register of Historic Places. So this is a work in progress and we hope to have a plan together by late spring or early summer for this work.

#### • Street Repair

The town is in need of street repairs, but at this time we do not have a plan for any work in the 2015 year. We are going to concentrate, as I stated earlier, on downtown Dwight, and continue evaluating that larger and more involved project.

We also have several water main projects that we need to take a very serious look at. We have to develop a plan for sewer replacement, we have had many issues in town during some of these heavy rains. It needs to be recognized that many sewer mains are 80-100 years in age. This needs to be addressed sooner than later.

#### • Pinecone Path

The Pinecone Path extension going to Lions Lake along Odell Road is set to be on IDOT's letting this January, so we will be looking for construction to begin this spring. Funding has (continued on page 3)

#### When Investing, Use the "Power of Three"

Many factors will affect your results as an investor — and some of these factors are beyond your control, such as interest-rate movements or the eurozone debt crisis or the sales results of the companies in which you invest. However, as you work toward your financial goals, you will find that you actually have control over three of the most important drivers of investment success: time, money and return.

Let's look at these three elements:

Time — Time can be a big asset — if you use it wisely. However, many young people, just starting out in their working lives, think they can wait until "later" to begin investing, as their retirement is so far away. But this could be a mistake. The earlier you start to invest, the more money you will put away, and the greater the potential for your money to appreciate. If you do wait until mid-career before you start seriously saving and investing for retirement, you will still have options, but you may need to make some trade-offs, such as possibly retiring later than you had originally planned. So here's the key: Start investing as early as possible — and keep investing.

Money — Not surprisingly, the more money you invest on a regular basis while you are working, the more money you'll likely end up with when you retire. Suppose, for example, that you invested \$3,000 per year and earned a hypothetical 7% annual return. After 30 years, you'd have accumulated about \$303,000 (assuming the investment was placed in a tax-deferred account, such as a traditional IRA). But if you put in \$5,000 per year, instead of \$3,000, and earned the same hypothetical 7% annual return, you'd end up with about \$505,000 after 30 years, again assuming the investment was placed in a traditional IRA. The difference between \$3,000 per year and \$5,000 per year isn't all that much — just about \$40 a week — but after 30 years, these relatively small differences can add up to a big sum of money. Of course, this is just a simple illustration that shows how saving more can possibly put you in a better position in the future. Keep in mind that there are no guarantees and that the value of your investments will fluctuate.

Return — You might think that your investments' rate of return is the one variable over which you have the least control. However, "least control" doesn't mean "no control." You can control your potential return to the extent of selecting a mix of stocks, bonds, government securities and other investments that reflects the level of risk you're willing to tolerate in exchange for the potential growth you'd like to achieve. By creating this mix, you can help yourself avoid the biggest investment risk of allnot reaching your long-term goals.

By investing for as many years as you can, putting in as much as possible each year and choosing an investment mix that provides you with the greatest potential reward given your risk tolerance, you can take command, to a significant extent, of your own investment success. And that's a type of authority you won't want to relinquish.







The rezoning was unanimously approved. However construction cannot begin until the Town Board of Trustees approves at their February 12 meeting.

Mr. Eshleman projects that construction of the new store could begin as soon as March of this year, with a completion date of sometime this spring (May or June).
