## DTHS February Board Actions

The Dwight Township High School Board of Education met on February 18.

Recognized by the BOE was Trojan basketball player Jace Kennedy for being the recipient of an IHSA Sport A Winning Attitude award. Kennedy, a DTHS junior, was acknowledged by officials of a recent Dwight/Gardner basketball game for an above and beyond display of sportsmanship.

Principal Dan Kaiser presented information to the board about a program available to those students needing an alternative way to achieve their high school diploma and achieve their individual, academic, and employment goals.

The Adult High School Credit Program/Early School Leaver Transition Program assists adults in completing their high school diploma rather than earning a GED. Along with various program requirements, the

home high school must agree to accept the credits earned through the program and agree to issue the diploma upon successful completion of all requirements. DTHS will be presenting diplomas to two students who have recently successfully completed the Early School Leaver Program.

In his report to the board, Superintendent Dr. Richard Jancek informed the board that initial discussions around a continued athletic co-op agreement with Gardner/ South Wilmington High School are taking place for the 2015-16 and 2016-17 school years. Currently, DTHS and GSW co-op in football, boys and girls golf, boys and girls cross-country, wrestling, and track.

In other business, the board:

- approved Joel Steichen as Bass Fishing Coach.
- approved Mike Cherveny as Bass Fishing Coach.
- approved Tim Henson

as volunteer Bass Fishing Coach.

- approved Dan Grubbs as volunteer Baseball Coach.
- approved a resolution providing for the termination of an Intergovernmental Cooperative Agreement regarding the abatement of real estate taxes to commercial and industrial firms.

- approved a resolution to acknowledge continuing agreement for the abatement of real estate taxes regarding the enterprise zone.

- agreed to a special joint board session with the DGS BOE on April 29 for seating of new board members and acknowledging outgoing BOE members.

- learned that the State of Illinois currently owes DTHS District #230 \$79,580 in late mandated categorical payments.

The next meeting of the DTHS Board of Education will be Wednesday, March 18, at 7 p.m. at the high school. Meetings are open to the public.

On Saturday, February 21, a brave group of 15 DTHS students and two teachers plunged into Miller Park Zoo Lake to raise money for this year's Special Olympics.


Spring games for the Special Olympics will be held on May 3, 2015 at Normal West High School.



### Women May Face Extra Challenges in Seeking Financial Security

On March 8, we observe International Women's Day. On this occasion, thousands of events across the world will honor the cultural, political and social achievements of women. Of course, in many countries, women still face significant economic challenges. And even here in the United States, women encounter more obstacles than men in the pursuit of financial security, particularly in seeking a comfortable retirement lifestyle. So if you are a woman — regardless of your marital status — you will need to be aware of these challenges and take steps to overcome them.

**Challenge:** Women spend more time out of the workforce and accumulate less money in 401(k) plans.

Your care-giving obligations are an issue to be decided by you, your spouse and perhaps other family members. But while you are working, contribute as much as you possibly can to your 401(k) or similar employer-sponsored plan. Also, try to fully fund your IRA each year.

**Challenge:** Women typically live more years in retirement and depend more heavily on Social Security.

Women reaching age 65 are expected to live, on average, an additional 21.6 years, compared with 19.3 years for men, according to the Social Security Administration, which also reports that the average annual Social Security income received by women 65 years and older was about \$12,500. Furthermore, Social Security comprises about 50% of the total income for unmarried women age 65 and older, compared to just 36% for elderly men.

**Potential solution:** To become less dependent on Social Security, create a sustainable withdrawal strategy for your investment portfolio.

Social Security was designed to supplement one's retirement income, not replace it. Consequently, it's essential that you make full use of your other sources of income, such as your 401(k), IRA and other investment accounts. To make this money last, you'll need to create a sustainable withdrawal strategy early in your retirement — and stick to it.

**Challenge:** Women are far more likely than men to need some type of long-term care.

More than two-thirds of nursing home residents are women, according to the National Center for Health Statistics. And the average cost for a private room in a nursing home is more than \$87,000 per year, according to the 2014 Cost of Care Survey produced by Genworth, a financial services company. Typically, Medicare covers only a small percentage of these costs.

**Potential solution:** Prepare in advance for long-term care expenses.

Long-term care costs can be enormous, but you do have some protection-related options for meeting these costs. Check with your financial advisor to learn which of these choices might be most appropriate for your situation.

These aren't the only financial issues facing women, but they do give you a good idea of what you may be facing. So, be proactive in meeting these challenges — because there's actually a lot you can do.

## Exelon Generation Provides Annual Emergency Brochures to Local Residents

Exelon Generation mailed nearly 100,000 public information emergency planning brochures to residents and businesses within ten miles of its Braidwood, Dresden, and LaSalle nuclear facilities.

Federal law requires nuclear operating companies to develop emergency response plans for their nuclear energy facilities and to ensure evacuation plans are in place in the highly unlikely event of an emergency. State and county agencies often use the plans for non-nuclear related emergencies such as floods, tornadoes, and earthquakes. Exelon Generation has dedicated

teams of emergency planning experts at each of its nuclear facilities who work with state, county, and local emergency management officials in the development, maintenance, training, and testing of emergency response plans.

## St. Peter's Aebleskiver Supper March 7

It's that time of year again, when St. Peter's Lutheran Church has their annual Aebleskiver Supper, this year on Saturday, March 7, from 4:30-7:30 p.m. Dwight's

Danish Brotherhood Lodge #34 has their Aebleskiver Breakfast on Palm Sunday, March 29, from 7:00 a.m. to noon.

Aebleskiver is a Danish dish like doughnut holes, but sweeter. They are cooked in a cast iron pan that resembles an egg poacher and served hot with syrup, jam or powdered sugar. When cooking them, sometimes a piece of apple is put in each aebleskiver.

St. Peter's Youth have been serving an annual supper for many years to raise money that helps the youth attend camps and do other charitable projects in the community throughout the year. Adult members of the church and a few adults from outside the parish help with the cooking and serving. It has become a fun time of fellowship for the young and the old.

Danish Brotherhood Lodge #34 has their Aebleskiver Breakfast on Palm Sunday, March 29, from 7:00 a.m. to noon.

Lodge #34 has two breakfasts annually, and have also been selling Kringle Coffeecakes to area residents for many years. Lodge #34 had special cast iron fryers made that will cook many Aebleskivers at the same time. The Brotherhood loans these fryers to St. Peter's for their dinner, for which St. Peter's is very grateful to the Brotherhood.

### Preparing Aebleskiver

Most cooks agree that the aebleskiver pan is the secret to a successful aebleskiver spread. Often called a "monk pan," the cast iron contraption contains several round indentations (or wells) for the batter to fry, and in newer pans, the seven or nine wells are also coated with a special nonstick surface for easier preparation. The pans can be ordered from many Scandinavian specialty shops, but it is also possible to find them at thrift stores and antique outlets, where they are often mislabeled as "egg pans." Special care should be taken when using a monk pan on glass-top cooking surfaces, as it is extremely heavy.





The Chatsworth Fire Department and EMS are all volunteer, and all income and needs are funded through property taxes. This donation from Monsanto is truly a welcomed gift.



The **Most Valuable Player** award went to two Lady Trojans, Daly Galloway and Rachel Dawson.


"These two ladies were our leaders throughout the season," Froelich said.

### Agriculture Education Line Item Critical to Ag Industry's Future

The Illinois Leadership Council for Agriculture Education (ILCAE) urges supporters to contact Governor Rauner's office and their legislators to protect the Agriculture Education line item as recommended by the Illinois State Board of Education.

On Wednesday the 18th, Governor Rauner proposed his version of Illinois' fiscal 2016 budget which included elimination of the Agriculture Education line item. ILCAE understands the financial situation of our state, but opposes this cut.

This line item funds the Facilitating Coordination in Agricultural Education Project (FCAE) which provides local program support, curriculum resources, professional development for agriculture teachers, and on-site technical assistance.

The line item is currently allocated at \$1.8Million, but the Illinois State Board of Education recommends increasing it to \$3.0Million.

Agriculture is a significant driver of the Illinois economy. One in every four jobs in Illinois is related to the agriculture, food, and natural resources industry. In a recent report by USA Today, agriculture was

identified as one of the top five highest earning college majors for 2015 graduates. Despite these truths, agriculture programs exist in less than 50% of our high school districts.

Andrew Bowman, ILCAE Chair said, "Investment in agriculture education ensures we are adequately supplying all businesses in Illinois with necessary talent and keeps good jobs here. No other educational model is as comprehensive as this. And, there are still far too many high school districts without agriculture programs, particularly in urban districts. There is no fat to cut from this line item. This is a critical investment in our youth and state."

The ag education model is three part, combining classroom instruction with work-based learning and leadership development. It serves as the model for the Illinois Pathways Initiative which was included in the Education Reform and Job Growth Agenda Blueprints. The line item supports student work-based learning projects—or Supervised Agriculture Experiences—that generate over \$11.8 Million in student earnings and over \$2.1 Million in local and state matching funds for Ag-In-The-Classroom Efforts and affecting over 29,000 secondary and 468,000 elementary students, respectively. Even excluding all other benefits, these two facts alone account for a strong rate of return for taxpayers.

This line item began in 1986 when the Illinois General Assembly legislated that a comprehensive program for agricultural education be created and maintained by the public school system for all school districts.

Bowman said, "We understand the difficult financial position of our state and are willing to work with the Governor and General Assembly on how we can strengthen private contributions to our partnership—but investing in our future is the responsibility of both the private and the public sectors. We look forward to working together so that all Illinois students through agriculture education may develop their potential for premier leadership, personal growth, and career success."


Kathleen was raised in Coal City, and resided in Gardner for many years.


