

Gardner VB Discusses Burning, High Grass and Abandonment

The Gardner Village Board met in regular session on July 27, with Dick Hileman acting as Mayor Pro Tem in the absence of Mayor Mike Serena.

The board opened with public comments on several topics. Resident Don Phillips expressed opposition to the Village revising the burning ordinance to allow burning paper. Phillips suggested the Village should reduce the items allowed with a goal of eliminating burning in the Village rather than expanding a problem that is regularly addressed during the fall.

Resident Chris Irvin addressed the board regarding enforcement of the mowing ordinance. Irvin noted the property adjacent to his asked the board about the enforcement of the ordinance, commenting he has reported the issue to the Village at least four times this year.

Hileman responded he is "not taking any crap"

regarding grass and the Village will do the best they can, noting Ray Serena has not received any special treatment.

Carla Irvin noted that the property owner has received several verbal warnings, which they consider special treatment.

Irvin commented the property has been an issue for over 25 years with no changes and asked why the ordinance is not being enforced by the Village.

Hileman stated that each time the Village receives a complaint, they send a letter and the owner has seven days to mow, and if they do, it was over.

Irvin responded it was her understanding that the first letter of the year covered the entire mowing season and asked why some owners are worth the Village pursuing and others are not.

Hileman commented it should be applied the same way for all properties.

Dwight to Change Brush Pickup Schedule July 27 Board Actions

The Dwight Village Board of Trustees met on July 27 following a Public Properties Committee meeting where it was decided that Dwight residents will see a change in their services with regard to brush and tree branch pickup in an effort to better manage the service and give residents a more definitive timeline for brush pickup.

Beginning October 1, residents can plan on large tree branch and brush pickup on Mondays and Tuesdays twice monthly, with weeks alternating between the north side of town and the south side of town using the railway tracks as the town's divider.

Residents are reminded that bagged yard waste, such as leaves and yard debris, must be in biodegradable bags, require a purchased sticker and are picked up on Mondays each week. Stickers are \$3.65 and can be purchased at the Village Hall. Bagged yard waste without a sticker will not be picked up.

The board approved a recommendation regarding a new mower purchase. The Village will pursue the purchase of a 72" John Deere mower from AHW of Dwight following a rebid from AHW (previous bid dated January). No trade-in will be used in the transaction.

In other topics from the

Public Properties Committee, the board discussed and

will continue to review the Village sidewalk reimbursement policy and will revisit at a future meeting. Also, the Properties Committee recommended proceeding with the expansion of the Public Works building and will bring back bids to the full board at a later date for consideration.

The board took action on two recommendations by the Zoning Board of Appeals following a Public Hearing held on July 21. In the first matter, a Zoning Variance filed by Wayne and Tola Haley to allow for the construction of a storage building within an existing flood plain on property located at 505 N. Clinton Street was considered. The applicants also requested that the building be allowed

Randy Bisailon Named Grand Marshal of Herscher Labor Day Parade

1967, serving as an elder and on the Church Council.

He is a current member of the Central Illinois Green Club and participates in many area tractor rides.

He has served as Drainage Inspector for the Village of Herscher for about ten years and continues in that role today.

building, Trustees Jerry Curtis and Marla Kinkade voted yes, while trustees Randy Irvin, Justin Eggenberger and Tim Dougherty voted no. Board member Jim Mixen was not present. Four yes votes are needed to overrule a committee recommendation. In a second vote to take the Zoning Board's recommendation and not allow the variance, Irvin, Eggenberger and Dougherty voted yes while Curtis and Kinkade voted no. The variance was not granted.

In a second matter, an application for a Zoning Variance filed by Thomas and Rebecca Christenson to reduce the rear yard requirement from 25 feet to nine feet for the construction of an addition to an existing home located at 604 S. Chicago Street was considered. The board approved the Zoning Board's recommendation to allow the variance.

In his report to the Board,

the Village Administrator reported that landscaping is now taking place along the recent Pine Cone Path extension. Also, excavators will be at the site of the new High Speed Rail depot and will begin demolition of existing buildings on the property.

Train Depot Ground Breaking, Pinecone Path Extension Ribbon Cutting Ceremony August 11

The Village of Dwight has announced they will have an official ground breaking ceremony for their new train depot Tuesday, August 11, at 2:30 p.m. at the location of the new depot, 401 S. Columbia Street. Senator Dick Durbin will be present to take part in the groundbreaking ceremony.

Dwight, Pontiac, Normal, Lincoln, Springfield, Carlinville, and Alton are all planning to construct new depots or upgrades to accommodate the advent of High Speed Rail in Illinois. The Dwight Depot is the first municipality to award a construction contract and break ground.

"We are excited to be receiving a new depot as part of the high speed rail program in Illinois," stated

Mayor Jared Anderson. "And even more excited that Senator Durbin will be in Dwight to help usher in this new era of transportation in Illinois. The new depot will provide protection from the weather, appropriate amenities, dedicated parking spaces, be ADA compliant, and be an overall plus for the Village."

Following the groundbreaking, the Village will be having an official ribbon cutting ceremony to open the Pinecone Path extension at 3:00 p.m., at the corner of Washington Street and Odell Road. Senator Durbin will also be present for the ribbon cutting.

In 2010, the Village was notified that funding for the Dwight - Pinecone Path extension had been approved through an

Illinois Transportation Enhancement Program (ITEP) grant. Grant funding for the project was \$716,790.00. The path will connect the existing end of Pinecone Path, at Columbia Street, to Lions Lake and its 1/2 mile trail, located at Old Route 66 and Odell Road.

"This is an exciting project for Dwight and our residents," said Anderson. "It's

a fun time to be living in Dwight. I invite all the residents of Dwight to come out to the Pinecone Path ribbon cutting and the train depot groundbreaking. Bring your walking shoes, your bike, your kids in strollers, and let's enjoy this new path."



Manager before becoming a Human Resource Specialist in February of 1997. Her current title is Human Resource Generalist 3.


Sharon resides in Dwight. Her plans include working in her flower garden, spending time with family and friends, and volunteering for Christian Ministry.

DWIGHT – Rev. Oliver Kermit "Doc" Zivney went to his Lord and Savior July 30, 2015 at Heritage Health of Dwight, where he had been a resident since early spring.

He was born April 24, 1926 in Beaver Dam, Wisconsin, elder son of Fred and Albena Roller Zivney.

He was educated in the public schools of Beaver Dam, Wisconsin, and Peoria and Polo, Illinois. He graduated from Polo High School in 1943. He received his BS in Education from Northern Illinois State Teachers College in 1949; his Masters in Divinity from Drake University in 1960; and was awarded an honorary Doctorate of Humane Letters from the Aero-Space Institute of Chicago in 1976.

Oliver was a proud veteran of World War II and the Korean Conflict. He enlisted in the U.S. Navy April 8, 1944 and began his active duty August 18, 1944. Initially he was trained as a radioman, but was sent to San Diego and transferred to the USMC, where he became a Fleet Marine Corpsman, serving with the 1st, 2nd and 6th Marine Divisions. He received training as a hospital corpsman aboard a Navy transport on the way to Guadalcanal; once there he joined the 1st Marine Division for field training in the jungles.

He eventually became a member of the Corps Evacuation Hospital #3, a unit of the 6th Marine Division, and spent more than three months in combat on Okinawa. In September 1945, as part of the 2nd Marine Division, he was sent to Nagasaki; his unit was one of the first teams sent to search for and care for U.S. POWs. He spent six months as a member of the Occupation troops. He was sent to China as part of a Marine search party, seeking wounded American flyers.

His duties included not only

providing emergency medical care, but also handling the gold wire which was used to trade for needed supplies. Returning to Japan, he sailed for the U.S.A. in April 1946, being discharged May 17, 1946.

He achieved the rank of Seaman 1/C. He was awarded the Victory Medal, the American Area Campaign Medal, the Asiatic Pacific Campaign Medal, and two Bronze Stars.

He was recalled to active duty for the Korean War, serving from August 1, 1950 until November 2, 1951 as a US / Korean evacuation Flight Corpsman / Instruction, based at Glenview Naval Station and Great Lakes Naval Station. He made more than 20 trips to Korea as a Flight Corpsman, returning with some of his former Chicago 9th Infantry Battalion among the wounded.

As a pastor, he served a number of churches: his first was Colfax Christian Church. In 1962, he transferred to the Methodist Church, and served as pastor at Roberts/Thawville, Roanoke/Secor, Gridley, Fithian/Oakwood, Hennepin/Granville, Stronghurst/Carman, Chrisman/Scottland, and Reddick Methodist Churches. He retired in 1993 and moved to Dwight.

As a parish minister, he took part in many community activities. He was Civil Defense Director at Roberts; CD Chaplain at Roanoke; while at Hennepin, he received training as a volunteer EMT, eventually receiving the EMP rating as a National Registered EMT.


Residing in small communities, he often was called upon to help local fire departments; after retirement, he received professional training as a firefighter.

He conducted more than 800 graveside services for veterans. He served seven years as the Department Chaplain for the American Legion, as well as Unit and Divisional Chaplain. He served as Chaplain to both local veteran posts.

Among the numerous awards and recognitions over the years: Honor Flight Trip to D.C. War Memorial on April 15, 2009; serving as Chaplain on Call for the Illinois State Senate, opening the Senate with prayer

for many years; from the Dwight E.S.D.A., the Reddick Fire Department, the Dwight Rotary and the Dwight Board of Education.

On July 10, 1948, he married Barbara Bunker in Waukegan. She predeceased him in 1999. They had five children together: Terry (Margaret Ann) Zivney of Middletown, IN; Jan Tarbet of Lake Zurich; Daniel, who died in February 1971; and the twins, who were his birthday present one year, Diane (Hagen) Miller of Montgomery, Texas and Mark Zivney. His two grandchildren are Teresa Zivney of NY and James Tarbet of Lake Zurich.

In June, 1976, he married Shirley Ross Campbell in Indianapolis, and added six more children to his family: James (Kathy) Campbell of Joy; Bruce (Nina) Campbell of OH; Cathy McRee of IN; Karen (Jay) Juday of TN; Scott (Beth) Campbell of KY; and Amy (Mat) Samkutty of OR. They provided additional grandchildren to his family. He raised Amy as his own daughter. Shirley preceded him in death in 2010.

A brother, Richard (Pat) Zivney of Salem, survives along with his Zivney cousins of Minonk.

Funeral services were at 10 a.m., Monday, August 3, at the United Methodist Church, Dwight, with Rev. Lance Leeds officiating.

Visitation was from 4 until 7 p.m., Sunday, August 2, at Hager Memorial Home, Dwight, and for an hour preceding the Monday service at the church.



Hileman next recognized Ray Serena, who was not on the agenda, who asked why he is being pointed out regarding his grass.

Commissioner Rob Wolf commented it is because he is the land owner of the property being discussed.

Serena commented he believes he is being harassed and there are reasons he has not cut the grass.

Carla Irvin noted that Serena was not on the agenda and was allowed to speak, and rebutted Serena's comments, noting they came only to address the mowing issue.

The board heard from Craig Parks questioning a letter he received for an abandoned vehicle. Parks commented he will move the hearse in question to Jimmy's (Commissioner Riley) driveway, to which

Riley responded it would be towed.

Hileman then related several instances when he has spoken to Parks concerning the hearse at the flea market.

Parks commented he expects to have the paperwork completed for purchase of the vehicle by the end of the month.

Hileman noted the issue is the lack of license and tags.

Commissioner Terry Jensen presented a proposal to amend the Village burning ordinance to allow the burning of paper in the Village. Wolfe, Riley, and Serena suggested tabling the issue until the next meeting.

Jensen reported he walked the grass alley behind 304 N. Pine St. One of the other residents erected a pole in or along the alley, which may be in the right-

of-way. Jensen asked for assistance in determining the location of the alley and the pole to determine proper placement.

Hileman noted there are several issues regarding the property line, dictating the location of the alley.

Commissioner James Riley provided an update on the Nielsen elevator property and the possible purchase of the property by the Village. Village Attorney Scott Belt commented he is waiting for the property title search.

Village Engineer Guy Christensen reported the storm sewer project remains on hold and he is discussing access to the high school with the contractor.

Hileman closed the meeting commending Riley for his efforts to clean up the Village.

New Vaccine Requirement for Some Illinois School Kids

As Illinois families prepare to send their children back to class, state officials say immunizations should be on the back-to-school checklist.

For school entrance, students must show proof of vaccinations against several diseases, including diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, mumps and measles.

Dr. Nirav Shah, director of the Illinois Department of Public Health, says this fall the state is introducing a new requirement of vaccination against meningococcal disease.

"This is the bacteria that causes meningitis," he explains. "Sixth graders must show proof of having one dose and 12th graders most show proof of having received at least two doses."

Illinois families that object to vaccinations on religious grounds are not legally required to obtain the

immunizations, but the parent must present a signed statement to the school district detailing the grounds for objection.

Medical exemptions are also allowed and require a doctor's note explaining why one or more of the required immunizing agents is medically conflicting.

Earlier this year, there was an outbreak of measles in Illinois, and a total of 15 children were affected. Shah says the incident underscores the need for anyone who can be vaccinated to receive immunizations to prevent infection.

"Vaccines when properly used create this invisible force field, which protects not only the child who's been vaccinated but the entire community of children - even those children who for whatever reason, medical or otherwise, may not be able to be vaccinated," he stresses.

According to the State

Board of Education, Illinois had a 97 percent compliance rate for school vaccinations in 2013.

The federal government and researchers acknowledge that no vaccine is 100 percent safe or effective and no public health official or vaccine provider can determine who will be protected or harmed by a vaccine.

DTHS Registration Days, School Starts August 24

On Friday, August 7, Dwight Township High School will hold registration from 9:00 a.m. to noon in the office for new students who are not enrolled in District #230 or District #232, Odell Grade School, St. Paul Grade School, Ransom Grade School or Saunemin Grade School. State law requires new students to take a copy of their birth certificate when registering.

On Monday, August 10, registration will be from 4:00-7:00 p.m. in the cafeteria for freshmen-seniors.

Registration will be in the cafeteria **Tuesday, August 11,** at the following times: seniors, 9:00-10:00 a.m.; juniors, 10:00-11:00 a.m.; closed, 11:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m.; sophomores, 1:00-2:00 p.m.; freshmen, 2:00-3:00 p.m.

Freshmen Orientation is in the auditorium from 3:00-4:00 p.m.

Late registration will be by appointment only **Monday, August 17.** Call the main office

to schedule an appointment. This is the last day to register.

All students must be registered at these times. If there are any questions, call the office at 815-584-6200.

Monday, August 24, will be the first day of school for students. Classes will begin at 8:10 a.m. and dismiss at 3:10 p.m.

School Fees

Two school approved combination locks are to be purchased by incoming freshmen. One is to be placed on the student's hall locker and the other for the physical education locker. A \$12.00 fee applies for the two locks.

Other student fees include: Behind the Wheel Driver's Education Fee - \$50.00, Textbook Rental - \$45.00, Activity Fee (required by all students) - \$15.00, participation fee - athletics, cheerleading, band, and flag corps - \$30.00 per sport, \$60 per student, \$90 max per family, P.E. Uniforms - \$16.00.

Fees are due at registration.

Students may also be required to pay other fees for consumable workbooks or project fees for supplies and materials depending upon courses for which they are enrolled.

Students will be required to supply the following information on registration day: name of Health Insurance; parent's place of employment and phone numbers; family physician and phone number; adult to contact in case of emergency (if parents cannot be reached); e-mail.

State law requires students entering ninth grade and students new to the district (at any grade level) to present evidence of physical examinations and immunization records, within the past year. Students entering ninth grade will be required to show proof of two rubella and mumps vaccines. Most students have had these vaccines in combination with the measles vaccine in the MMR. Ninth grade students shall also show proof of having two doses of the Varicella vaccine, or a health care provider's indication of a past case of chicken pox.

As in the past, all students in grades six through 12 shall have proof of Tdap vaccine.

Students failing to present evidence of physical examinations and immunizations will not be allowed to enter school until this requirement has been met. Physical exam forms are available in the high school office.

Incoming seniors: all students entering 12th grade (seniors) for the 2015-16 school year will be required to show proof of meningococcal conjugate vaccine (MCV) upon school entry. This is a new law to prevent your student from a severe form of bacterial meningitis. Some students have already received a meningitis vaccine. If the vaccine was received after age 16, only one vaccine is required. If vaccine was received prior to age 16, two vaccines are required.
