The Dwight Grade School has a garden where fresh produce is grown and is enjoyed in the classroom as well as in the cafeteria.


helping to harvest the large assortment of veggies, including tomatoes, peppers, popcorn, sweet corn, celery, green beans, and pumpkins.

Dwight Village Officials Respond to Community Safety Concerns

Community Reacts to Gang Threat

Community members gathered at the August 24 meeting of the Dwight Village Board of Trustees asking for answers from Village officials regarding recent rumored gang-related activity in the village and looking for reassurance regarding the safety of the community.

Dwight's Chief of Police Tim Henson addressed questions regarding rumored gang activity in the village and two separate stabbing incidents.

"The first stabbing that took place was gang related," confirmed Chief Henson. "Although things are still under investigation, we do not believe that the second stabbing was gang related or that it has any relationship to what took place on Thursday [August 20]."

Henson went on to make a clarification regarding the victim in the August 20 incident.

"I just want to make it very clear that on [August 20], our subject that was arrested was a known gang member," stated Henson. "However, the victim had absolutely no affiliation or

had anything to do with gangs."

The victim of the August 20th stabbing was Kevin OelschLAGER, 22, of Dwight.

Henson updated those in attendance with what he could share at that point regarding the incidents.

"We have identified members of the Latin Kings gang in town along with their associates," stated Henson. "We did arrest two of them on [August 20] - one juvenile who was in direct connection with the stabbing here in town on that night and, when we did a subsequent search warrant to where we believed, after he did the stabbing, he went, we made another arrest of a gang member at that location for possession of a controlled substance along with possession of drug paraphernalia and a Class 3 felony for putting up and barricading the door with 2 x 4s and metal braces."

At press time, Henson reported that one of those arrested in the August 20 incident was currently incarcerated in Livingston County jail while the juvenile had been sentenced to home confinement and was being electronically monitored by an ankle bracelet.

Community members expressed concerns to the Board and Chief Henson and made requests such as additional officers on duty at night, an increased police presence in downtown establishments especially as bars are closing, and asked questions about what is being done to increase protection of the community.

Chief Henson talked extensively about police actions including performing saturated patrols, increased police overtime, the increased use of non-uniformed officers, a \$3 million radio system upgrade allowing information sharing between various law enforcement agencies and jurisdictions, and how the Village has called on additional resources, such as the Illinois State Police along with the Livingston and Grundy County Sheriff's

Gardner Village Board Meets

The Gardner Village Board met in regular session on August 24, all members were present with the exception of Commissioner Dick Hileman.

Resident Ida Schopp addressed the board, reporting she was invited to the Events Committee meeting held recently. Schopp commended Chairman James Riley, who also serves as a Village Commissioner, on forming and chairing the meeting. Schopp commented the committee has the potential to do great things for the Village and encouraged the board to work with and support them.

The board discussed and approved allowing Scapegoats Car Club using the downtown parking lot for a Cruise-In, to be held on Friday, September 4. The event would not charge admission but would accept

free-will donations.

Village Attorney Scott Belt reported two summonses were served for property ordinance violations and court dates have been set. The contract for the Village's purchase of the Nielsen Grain Elevator has been received by Gibbs Nielsen, however Belt had not received a response prior to the meeting.

Belt presented the Board with a draft written agreement received from the legal counsel of Bookwalter Woods, regarding the exploration of extending utilities to the development north of the Village on Carbon Hill Road. The agreement references the Village Code and the submission of a deposit of \$3,000 to begin the engineering process which must be paid by Bookwalter Woods. Belt commented the initial process involves engineering work, the ultimate process would include legal

and property issues as well. Village Engineer Guy Christensen commented one of the first items would be to determine the capacity of the current water and sewer system to include any expansion required into the cost of the project.

Commissioner Terry Jensen reviewed photos of the sidewalk on North Center Street that appears to need repair. Mayor Mike Serena noted the Village has several sidewalks in need of repair and this will be added to the list. Jensen has also been contacted by the Grundy County Emergency Management Agency seeking confirmation of ownership of the siren at the dining car. Commissioner Riley noted the flags downtown are in need of replacement and he will work with Public Works to complete replacement in the coming weeks.

The board adjourned at 7:25 p.m.

Dwight Fire Protection District Purchases Used Aerial Ladder Truck

A community risk assessment completed by fire department administration in 2014 revealed that the organization was missing several key pieces of firefighting equipment. The assessment displayed the critical need for an aerial ladder truck and taller ground ladders. At the time of completion, the fire department did not have an aerial ladder truck in its fleet and only had the ability to reach about 20 feet above grade with the ladders carried on the fire engines.

Without longer ground ladders and an aerial ladder device, the firefighter's capabilities were drastically limited when it came to conducting search and rescue through exterior windows as well as roof ventilation operations. The department's complement of ground ladders and fire apparatus was inadequate when it came to the area of reaching the roofs and windows of many of the buildings in the downtown area, the Fox Center, the ALDI warehouse, and the RR Donnelley facility on Route 47. Due to the design of the our existing fire engines, there was no way to retrofit the vehicles to carry longer ladders needed to address this problem.

The fire department began looking for solutions to this issue while trying to remain fiscally responsible. There were several options

available. The first would have been to purchase a new ladder truck that was equipped with the appropriate ground ladders needed. A new "stock demo" truck would have cost over \$750,000 without any additional equipment. Adding ground ladders and equipment would have taken the cost to over \$825,000. The second option was to look for a quality "used" ladder truck that was already equipped with ground ladders needed to address our issues. The third option was to remain status quo and rely on towns like Pontiac and Morris to provide a ladder truck when needed.

Buying a new unit was ruled out due to the large amount of debt that would be assumed by the Fire District. Relying on other towns was ruled out as there was no guarantee that the vehicles would be available if they were being used in their own towns. Additionally, the response time for ladders coming from these departments could be in excess of 15-20 minutes, which was deemed too long to be effective if a quick rescue was required.

The department had been working to purchase a used aerial ladder from the Village of Oak Brook for several months but their ladder truck was sold to another department before we had secured the funds to purchase it.

Not long after, the fire department located a used ladder truck that was being

sold by the Paxton fire department. The vehicle is a 1988 Grumman AerialCat that has a 95' aerial ladder equipped with a waterway and pump as well as an entire complement of ground ladders capable of reaching areas up to 35' above grade. The truck had less than 27,000 miles on it and less than 4,000 hours of use. It was in very good condition. The price of the vehicle was \$22,900 and was negotiated down to \$18,900. Due to the fire department's limited budget, the department did not have the money needed to purchase this used vehicle.

Had the department not addressed this issue by purchasing a ladder truck, the ISO rating would have gone up – which could have resulted in an increase in insurance premiums for some home and business owners.

We have been able to address a critical issue for the safety of our citizens and our firefighters, improved our fire suppression and rescue capabilities, and eliminated the chance of our ISO rating going up due to the lack of required equipment.

All of this was made possible by building and utilizing corporate partnerships. Our use of "outside the box" thinking allowed us to remain fiscally responsible by employing alternative funding methods to find an effective and affordable solution to a very expensive problem that has saved the district and its residents at least \$750,000.

We would like to thank everyone involved in the project. Firefighters are currently in the process of receiving extensive training on the vehicles and once complete, the vehicle will be placed in full service.

Crash on I-55 Claims Life of Truck Driver

Grundy County Coroner John W. Callahan's office, along with Illinois State Police, are investigating a traffic crash that occurred on Interstate 55 near the 230 mile post shortly after 8:00 p.m. on September 24. The crash claimed the life of a truck driver David Lee Conway, 37 of Warrenton, MO. He was a driver for 5 Star Logistics.

Coroner Callahan stated preliminary investigation indicates two tractor trailer units were southbound on I-55 when the incident

occurred. One unit overturned and remained in the southbound lanes. The other unit's tractor came apart and the driver was ejected while still seat-belted in. The remaining part of his tractor trailer continued into the west ditch. The driver was found in his seat among the wreckage on I-55 and was pronounced dead by Coroner Callahan at 8:55 p.m. Both units caught fire and burned.


The Illinois State Police reconstruction division along with Callahan's office continue to investigate.






Earl McCoy Celebrates 35 Years with RR Donnelley

A family dinner and portrait is planned for later this year.





Police, as well as being in contact with gang specialists and other local agencies.

Officials responded to questions around whether current police surveillance at Dwight's PharmaCann operation was taking away from Village police resources clarifying that officers at the operation are volunteering for overtime patrol duty at the facility during their personal off hours and are paid by PharmaCann for the temporary service until the facility construction and fence is complete.

Ideas around what the public can do to help the police were discussed such as neighborhood watch pro-

grams, leaving outside lights on, being aware, and, very importantly, notifying police of any suspicious activity.

"I think that it takes an entire village to assist the police department and part of that is, see it, hear it, report it," said Henson.

Anyone seeing anything they feel is suspicious should call 911 or 815-844-0911, make a report, and let the police investigate to determine if there is a valid concern.

"I want to reassure our community of Dwight that we do have a safe community, we are going to continue to have a safe community, and we are all going to work together like we have in the past to keep our community place to live."

Henson encouraged people to go about their daily lives.

"If 4,300 people decide we are going to live in fear," said Henson, "...then these people win because that's what they want to do. They want to put the fear of God in everybody here; that we are going to change our lives and change what we do on a daily basis because of this."

Second Stabbing Not Gang Related, Chief Henson Assures

On Sunday, August 23, Dwight Police Department received a call at 4:35 a.m. Two officers from Dwight P.D. responded, finding a male subject, age 29, in the alley behind 119 E. Chippewa, Dwight.

Upon arriving, the male subject, identified as Donnie Crouch, was found on the ground, bleeding from the abdomen.

Crouch reportedly told the officers that he went out in the alley behind the residence to have a cigarette, when two, unknown, male subjects jumped him, stabbing him in the stomach twice.

Crouch was then driven to Morris Hospital by a friend who was at the residence. Upon arriving, Crouch decided that he no longer needed medical treatment. Crouch has not complied with attempts at further investigation into the incident made by Dwight Police.

However, according to Chief Henson, the incident involving Crouch has been found to be unrelated to the stabbing which had occurred earlier in the week, and is not believed to be gang related.




They will have to be, as the RVC seems to be a solid conference again this year, which GSW's Coach says should make for an interesting season.





From early on, it appeared the Dwight Trojans were going to sail to a season-starting victory against Seneca, as Austin Kavanaugh connected with Michael Bennett on a 60-yard TD pass to make it 6-0 before a minute had passed.







Village of Dwight Prepares for Harvest Days 2015

August 24 Village Board Actions

As fall rapidly approaches, committees planning for this year's Harvest Days celebration took various requests to the Dwight Village Board of Trustees for approval at the board's August 24 session.

Alpine Amusements will, once again, provide carnival attractions from September 17 – 20 setting up in the 100 block area of East Chippewa Street. Carnival area street closures are approved to begin at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, September 15, including Park Street and E. Chippewa from Prairie to Franklin Street. Beginning Thursday, September 17 at 5 p.m., East Main Street will be closed when the carnival is operating through Sunday, September 20, as is the north-bound lane of Franklin from Delaware to East Main Street. All of the above streets will be reopened for normal traffic on Monday, September 21.

For a third year, the Village Board authorized Harvest Days to sell wrist bands for use Friday and Saturday nights of the event. From 5 to 11 p.m., patrons with wrist bands will be allowed to purchase alcohol inside one of the downtown bars, in a plastic cup not to exceed 12 ounces, and then take the beverage outside into a designated and monitored area. The Harvest Days committee is responsible for ensuring the wrist band purchaser is of legal drinking age, while the bar owner will assume the responsibility of confirming the legal age of patrons purchasing alcohol regardless of wearing a wristband.

The designated street area for wrist band use begins on East Main Street 100 feet northeast of the intersection with Chippewa Street and extending to the intersection with Franklin Street. It will also include the portion of Franklin Street from its intersection with East Main Street to its intersection with Delaware Street. This year, the boundaries will be extended east on Delaware Street to include Cherry Red Roasters and its new beer garden. The far south end of East Main Street will be off limits to keep the carnival area alcohol-free. Numerous identifiable volunteers will

be in the downtown area to ensure all rules and regulations are followed. Any unwelcomed behavior could mean rescinding the ordinance which allows the wrist band / street alcohol privilege. All proceeds from the wrist band sales go to Harvest Days to help offset the cost of the event and for providing downtown entertainment.

2015 Dwight Harvest Days is slated to run from September 17 through September 20.

In other actions related to the upcoming Dwight Harvest Days celebration, the board approved several street closures.

To accommodate flea market, craft and food booths, the East Main Street parking plaza will be closed at 7 a.m. Monday, September 14 through Sunday, September 20 at 6 p.m.

Beginning Friday, September 18 at noon through Sunday, September 20 at 6 p.m., the following will be closed: East Main Street; West Main Street (One lane of traffic will be open through the weekend on West Main Street to allow access for First National Bank drive-thru and ATM customers); West Main Street Fox Center parking lot; and Franklin Street from E. Chippewa to East Main Street.

Parade Street closures will take place on Sunday, September 20 from Noon to 4 p.m. for Washington Street from William Street to Mazon Avenue; Mazon Avenue from Dairy Queen to St. Louis Street; Chicago Street from Mazon Avenue to Philmar Street; Philmar Street from Chicago Street to Franklin Street; and Franklin Street from Philmar to DTHS.

Renfrew Park Car Show street closures are from 7 a.m. – 6 p.m. on Sunday, September 20. Streets impacted are Franklin Street from Waupansie to North Street; North Street from Prairie to Franklin Street.

In other matters, concerned community members addressed the board regarding recent gang activity in the village. See related story on page 1. In his report to the board, Mayor Jared Anderson made a statement regarding this overall village safety con-

cern.

"We have the resources available and we are branching out, reaching out, to other agencies to expand on the expertise that we do have so we can do the best to ensure the health and welfare of the Village of Dwight," said Anderson.

In another safety concern, Mayor Anderson also reminded everyone that school is back in session and drivers should be aware of school zone speed limits, be proactive, pay attention and be extra cautious before school and after 3 p.m.

Finally in his report, Anderson reported on an August 22nd visit to Dwight by Governor Bruce Rauner. Rauner made a planned stop in Dwight during a charity motorcycle run to benefit veterans. Also on August 22nd, State Representative John Anthony was in Dwight and toured the grounds at the former Dwight Correctional Center along with Mayor Anderson and former DCC Warden Lynn Cahill Masching.

Dwight Economic Alliance CEO Janice Lauritzen reported that Dwight's Farmers Market will continue through September 9 with the change to Wednesday evenings getting a "pretty good response." She also stated that tourism numbers remain high at the historic Route 66 gas station.

Lauritzen also reported that the DEA is working on a broker mailing that will be sent out in early September. The mailing is a flyer that will be sent to approximately 325 – 350 brokers in the Chicagoland area with a list of the available buildings in Dwight for rent or sale for businesses that might be interested in locating in the Village.

In public comment, village officials responded to questions about the new depot which is being constructed as part of the Higher Speed Rail project. The maintenance of the building and grounds will be the future responsibility of the Village with no reimbursement agreement. The building will have programmable locks. The new facility will not be open 24 hours a day and will not be manned.

Also in the public forum, concerns regarding aban-

doned and unkept properties, damaged sidewalks, standing water, and street and stop signs blocked from view by overhanging branches or vines were brought to the board's attention. Village crews are working to address the blocked sign situation; however, concerns can be reported to the village to be sure these are addressed.

In other business, the board:

- approved the resignation of Dave Kinkade from the Plan Commission.

- approved a Knights of Columbus Tootsie Roll bucket brigade request for September 11 and 12 at the intersection of Route 17 & 47.

- approved a Lions Club Candy Day bucket brigade request for October 9 from 7 a.m. – 5 p.m. and October 10 from 7 a.m. – Noon at the intersection of Route 17 & 47.

- approved a Zoning Board of Appeals recommendation for a Zoning Variance to allow the construction of a garage/storage building within the side yard of property at 200 Julie Drive.

- approved Sound Amplification Permits for the East Main Street/downtown area and Renfrew Park for various times during the Harvest Days weekend.

- approved the use of motorized golf carts in the downtown area and along the parade route throughout the Harvest Days celebration.

- approved the Harvest Days Parade Resolution for Sunday, September 20, Noon – 4 p.m., for submission to IDOT.

- referred a Dwight Industrial Park, 1200 E. Mazon Avenue, resubdivision request to the Plan Commission.

- referred a Faletti annexation request for 406 N. Union Street to the Plan Commission.

- appointed Morris-based Chamlin & Associates as the new Village Engineering Firm.



Radio Personality Speaks to Dwight Rotary

Lee Ann Oliver, Advertising Director for WCSJ/WJD, Morris radio stations, addressed Dwight Rotary members August 26. They discussed the advantages of using local radio and other traditional forms of meeting to promote businesses in the age of internet and social media.

"We are lucky to still have local radio and newspapers in this area because a lot of communities don't have that anymore," Oliver explained. She stated that their news segments still include local information such as obituaries and police reports, that area people want to hear."

Radio, she pointed out, can be a very effective method of advertising. "Most people don't realize how intrusive it is. It is a frequency medium, meaning you hear the message six or seven times, and you remember it." She said this happens even if people are not paying close attention. If a radio is on while people are working, for example, they still hear the messages subliminally and tend to remember them.

However, traditional media sources have taken advantage of new forms of media and technology. For

example, her station's, "The Trading Post," a highly rated program in which people can buy and sell items on air, now uses texting as a way for users to get their items on air. They can text a message to the on-air personality to read over the airwaves.

Her station also utilizes social media, such as Facebook, to get messages to the public. She used the example of a Facebook post teasing a more complete story to be broadcast in the near future. She mentioned that people tend to flock to media sources' Facebook pages in times of crisis. When the Diamond tornado hit in 2013, her station's page received 8,000-9,000 views. A recent post about a Bears donation to the Coal City tornado victims received over 100,000 likes. "You also can drive your Facebook page through radio," Oliver said. "You just want to send the same message through all media."

The Rotary will host guest speaker Adam Dontz, CEO of the Greater Livingston County Economic Development Council, on Wednesday, September 9. Dontz will provide an update on the activities and programs of the GLCEDC.

September is Campus Fire Safety Month

As college students return to campuses across the nation, the nonprofit Illinois Fire Safety Alliance (IFSA) recommends parents discuss the importance of fire safety with their children for the time they are away from home.

September is designated as national "Campus Fire Safety Month," since the beginning of the school year is typically the worst time for campus-related fires. For each of the last ten years, Illinois governors have issued proclamations to recognize the importance of "Campus Fire Safety Month."

According to The Center for Campus Fire Safety, from 2000 to 2015, 89 fires killed 126 people on college campuses, in Greek housing, or in off-campus housing within three miles of campuses. The National Fire Protection Association reports that U.S. fire departments responded to an estimated annual average of 3,870 structure fires in dormitories and Greek housing from 2009 to 2013. Fires are most common in the evening hours and on weekends. Cooking equipment accounts for 86% of those structure fires.

The IFSA offers the following fire prevention safety tips to students and parents:

- **Check for working smoke alarms and fire sprinklers.** They should be in living spaces, as well as community areas (lobbies, hallways, bathrooms, etc.). If you are not sure if they are present, ask a school official to point them out.
- **Determine a fire escape plan.** Find out where one is posted and review it. If no plan is posted, create one. There should be two routes of escape.
- **Practice fire drills twice per year.** On-campus already should require drills, but a plan also should be established for off-campus and Greek housing.
- **Keep exits clear.** Make sure there is a safe path of escape.
- **Practice kitchen fire safety.** Do not cook when tired or leave cooking unattended. Unplug appliances in case of a fire. Do not use water to put out grease fires.
- **Do not use candles.** Battery-operated flameless candles are better alternatives.
- **Do not overload electrical outlets/extension cords.** Circuits can overheat and catch fire.
- **Turn off electronics and appliances.** When leaving a room, hit the "off" switch on devices.
- **Clean clothes dryer lint.** Before and after using a clothes dryer, be sure lint trap is clear.
- **Keep smoking outside.** Also, dispose of smoking materials in ashtrays, not garbage receptacles.
