## Dwight Artist's Honest Abe Paintings Hang in White House West Wing Office

Abraham Lincoln interpreted by a Dwight artist is hanging on the office wall of Jim Walsh, justice department employee at the White House, Washington, D.C.

Catherine "Cat" Abel Clausen, of Dwight, just learned her painting which was sold in May, is at the White House.

The painting, "LINCOLN: Pixel Blue," was purchased by Gwen Walsh for her son Jim.

She credits her subconscious as her muse for the painting.

It is a "pixilated" portrait of Abraham Lincoln, based on an earlier work of Lincoln which had been published as a cover to the Springfield *Capital City Visitor Magazine* in 2009.

But the pixilated version was created under much more mystical circumstances.

"The painting was based on a dream I had in which I was asked to paint a portrait of a person who came to see me in my art sales booth at an art festival," Clausen explained.

"I told this individual I would paint his face half with ribbon strokes, like my well known Lincoln, and half-pixelated. I pointed to my well known Lincoln painting and used it as an example to explain this to the customer so he could better understand my idea."

She said at that moment she awoke from the dream, and created six pieces of Lincoln in this pixilated

fashion, one right after the other.

"The blue version is the one Jim has in his White House office," she added.

In addition to the blue pixilated original painting, Jim Walsh said he also has a print of the Portrait of Lincoln which was used for the Springfield magazine cover.

She said when she has such "directives" in a dream, she always follows through on the paintings, even if the work does not sell.

And besides being painted by Clausen of Dwight, the village of Dwight also has another connection to the painting.

Clausen was speaking in April at the Heritage Corridor/Art Institute of Chicago meeting held at the Country Mansion in Dwight. It was there that she showed all her work, including the pixilated Lincoln pieces.

Gwen Walsh was in attendance and later purchased the blue piece.

Her artist career and inspiration for doing Lincoln portraits began when she was in the third grade, she said. She saw the film "The Face of Lincoln" which shows an artist sculpted Lincoln's face and aging the face as Lincoln journeys through his life.

"My imagination was captured by the concept of creation and a passion for art was birthed," she said in a published interview.

She was born in Brawley, California, moved to Tempe, Arizona as a child, and settled in Dwight, Illinois in 1993.

She began her painting career when she arrived in Dwight.

She has a degree in visual communications (commercial art), a field in which she was employed for 10 years.

She taught herself to paint and now attends up to 17 art shows across the United States to market her original works and art prints.

She said attending the shows is the best way to sell original art, as people want to meet the artist of the work.

So, why does she paint Lincoln so much?

The film that inspired her to be an artist was partly responsible. But it wasn't until she saw a newspaper article with a photograph of Lincoln that she decided to paint him.

She painted so many Lincolns, that she was able to do an all-Lincoln show.

Her portrait which appeared on the cover of the Springfield magazine was popular in 2009 since that was the 200th birthday of Abraham Lincoln, born Feb. 12, 1809.

"He's just got the most dynamic face," she explained.

Her process of painting includes doing the eyes first.

"For me it's the way to start," she said. "Then I have an individual I can honor."


She said a portrait comes down to honoring the person the artist is painting.

She said she has read many biographies of Lincoln and she "knows him really well. When I visited his tomb, I was just in tears."

## Existing Dwight EMS Department Developed Over Four Decades

The Dwight Emergency Medical Service, which serves an 88-square-mile area including Dwight and Campus, averaged four minutes per emergency to arrive on the scene in 2014.

The EMS department made 951 calls last year, a slight increase above 2013 at 935.

The volume of calls is expected to be roughly the same this year, according to Al Metzke, Dwight EMS director, in an interview last week with *The Paper*.

The district, which extends north on 47 to Becker Road, west to Kinsman Road, south seven miles to Campus Road and east to J.R. Crop Service operation, includes a population of 7,000, and a 10-mile stretch of Interstate 55 (between mile marker 223½ and 213½).

The paid EMS department includes two advanced life support ambulances and a squad car, all housed in the headquarters at the Dwight Village Hall complex.

But the existing Dwight EMS department was developed over a 40-year period.

The village took over the ambulance department in 1973, which at the time was a volunteer department.

"We took it over when the funeral homes were running it," Metzke explained.

The EMS services were under the Dwight Police Department with the Police Chief as ambulance coordinator.

The EMS footprint was basically the same territory as the fire district but has since expanded to include the Campus area in the year 2000.

The Campus expansion for Dwight was done through a three-way agreement with the Emington-Campus Fire Protection District which covered Campus, Cullom and Saunemin.

"That's when we got

Campus," Metzke said.

It has been a decades-long haul for the EMS department to be staffed with paramedics, not just basic Emergency Medical Technicians, he said.

In 1976, the department tried to get enough people to sign up for a paramedic class but couldn't get enough people willing to commit.

That drive stopped in 1978.

"In 1985, we joined the Will Grundy EMS system, and became an intermediate level department, higher than basic," he said.

This allowed EMTs to

administer IV units, advanced airway treatment, and operate anti-shock trousers for patients. Technicians were also allowed to use defibrillators at that time as Intermediate EMTs.

Metzke was named EMS coordinator in 1993, having started with the department as a volunteer in 1974.

In 1993, the department was staffed 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. with paid personnel and staffed by volunteers from 6 p.m. to 6 a.m.

"In 1994 we went to 24-hour full time, operating out of the old Village Hall on Chippewa Street," Metzke said.

Now there are eight full-time paramedics on staff, who can perform any function that a doctor can perform out in the field, Metzke explained.

Now a second ambulance is always staffed from 7 a.m. to 3 p.m., the heaviest volume time for the department.

If all full time people are responding, part-time and off duty people respond as well.

After that, mutual aid is called in from other departments if needed.

For example, during a Tornado in Dwight in 2010, ambulances from Braidwood, Gardner, Coal City, Morris, Minooka, Pontiac and Limestone responded to provide assistance.

"What we do typically is if we have a structure fire, it requires two ambulances," Metzke said. "One for the victims of the fire, and one for the firefighters."

During a fire, a third ambulance from mutual aid will be standing by at the department in case it is needed at the fire or elsewhere.

There are times when firefighters assist EMS too. If two paramedics are required to tend to a patient in the back of an ambulance, a firefighter will drive the ambulance, he said.

He said all paramedics with Dwight are certified and have to recertify every two years.

He said "72% of the calls require advanced life support."

Typical calls are for drug overdoses, heart attacks, or a person having trouble breathing, all of which the paramedics are trained and equipped to handle.

They also do calls for sports injuries and can apply an analgesic pain reliever such as nitrous oxide.

Last year, there was a total of 365 ALS medical calls, 111 basic life support calls, and 257 people who refused treatment. The highest volume of ambulance calls went to Morris Hospital at 358, with 133 to St. James, Pontiac, and 38 to Riverside, Kankakee.



### Maximize the Benefits of Your Charitable Giving

It's certainly the season for giving — and when you make charitable gifts, you can both give and receive.

To get the most out of your gifts, your first step is to make sure you are giving to a worthy charity. That means you'll need to ask some questions. How does a group measure its effectiveness? And does it use its money wisely? Is it devoting as much of its contributions as possible to the actual work of the organization, or is it spending too much money on administrative costs? Generally, a worthwhile charity should spend at least 75% of its income on programs.

You may be able to find this type of information in a charitable group's annual report and on its website. But if you want to dig deeper, and get information from an independent source, you may want to go to the website of one of the agencies that evaluates charitable groups. On these sites, you can get a lot of information dealing with a charity's effectiveness, income, spending, mission, governance, transparency, executive salaries and other topics.

Once you've chosen a charity, or charities, you can decide how much you want to give. And your generosity will be rewarded, because your gift to a qualified charitable organization may entitle you to a deduction against your income tax, as long as you itemize deductions. A "qualified" charitable group is one that the government has classified as a tax-exempt organization. Ask your intended charity for information on its tax status. Reputable nonprofits will be more than happy to offer proof.

But what if you'd rather not simply give cash to the charitable group? What if you've owned some stocks for several years, and the stocks no longer fit your investment needs? Should you sell the stocks and then donate the proceeds to the charitable group?

You could — but you'll likely be better off, from a tax standpoint, by simply donating the appreciated stocks. If you were to sell these stocks, you'd have to pay capital gains taxes. Consequently, your gift to a charity would end up costing you more than just the loss of the asset.

But if you directly donate the appreciated stocks to the charity, you'll get an immediate tax deduction, which is normally worth the property's fair market value. And, perhaps even more importantly, you'll avoid any capital gains taxes on the donated stocks' appreciation. If you've held the stocks for a long time, and they've increased in value substantially, these capital gains taxes could be significant.

Once you've donated the appreciated stocks to the charity, it can decide whether to hold them for a while or sell them immediately. In either case, though, you'll have no capital gains tax obligation.

However, you choose to make your gift, be sure to document it. Typically, no deduction is allowed for a contribution of \$250 or more unless you have a written confirmation from the charity. Consult with your tax advisor on the specifics of the deductibility of your gifts.

Finally, whether you give cash or appreciated assets, you'll need to make your gift by Dec. 31 if you're going to deduct it on your 2015 taxes.

Charitable giving can benefit everyone. Your gift can help a group whose work you support, while at the same time providing you with potential tax advantages. That's a win-win situation.

## Village of Dwight Considers Tax Levy Increase

November 23 Board Actions

With assessed valuations estimated to be down for the fourth year in a row and with possible tax cap laws before Illinois legislatures, The Dwight Village Board of Trustees is considering a proposal to increase its portion of the tax levy for the first time in seven years. The proposal would increase the Village of Dwight's Tax Levy from \$632,000 to \$635,575 as the amount of revenue to be collected from taxable property within corporate limits of the Village and subject to taxation for the Year 2015. The proposed Tax Levy Ordinance will be voted on at the Board's December meeting. With the proposed increase being less than five percent, no public hearing is required.

In other November 23 Village Board Business, the Board approved an application to Dwight's Rent Subsidy Program. The application, submitted by Mary Boma, is for a new retail business. The business, Franklin Corner, will be located at 162 East Main Street in the former Hair Affair location and will offer the retail sale of fine art by local artisans and boutique items, as well as state and local souvenirs.

The Rent Subsidy Program was put in place as a tool to help encourage small business growth. Following the established Rent Subsidy Program guidelines, the total Village investment for Franklin Corner, before gross receipts, is \$2,681.25.

"The application met all requirements of the rent subsidy request. To try and spur growth, or give business at least a startup to, hopefully, be successful, we subsidize the rent for one year," explained Trustee Jerry Curtis regarding the program. "And, part of the gross receipts comes back to us – it's an economic development tool that we use."

### Dwight Police Arrest Man With \$20,000 in Stolen Property

The Dwight Police arrested Marvin Ray Beers Jr., 47, of Pittsburgh, Illinois, for possession of stolen property and driving on a suspended license, at 2:56 p.m. Tuesday, Nov. 24.

Also arrested was the passenger, Ashlee Nicole Perkins, 31, of Herrin.

Ashlee was arrested for unlawful possession of drug paraphernalia and possession of a controlled substance.

"Dwight police had information that Beers was coming to Dwight to sell \$20,000 worth of stolen goods," said a news release issued by the Dwight Police.

Arrangements were made with an undercover Dwight Police Officer to purchase these stolen goods for \$3,500.

The items stolen were taken during a burglary in Marion.

Dwight police recovered the stolen goods which led to the arrests.

"Both subjects are currently incarcerated at the Livingston County Jail awaiting a bond hearing," Dwight Police said last week.
