## Saunemin Family Barely Escapes House Fire, Pets Perish in Flames

It is a good thing Erika Peet had a baby monitor on during the night of March 1-2. Otherwise she may not have lived beyond that fatal night.

A fire broke out in their rural Saunemin home at roughly 12:30 a.m. March 2.

She awoke to hear the baby monitor buzzing static because the electricity had gone out.

She smelled smoke and rushed into the children's bedrooms, dragging the five children out, all wearing pajamas, into the 14-degree night chill.

The children range in ages from 2 to 12 years old, but she said with adrenaline, she was able to carry all of them downstairs at once.

"I would never be able to do that now," she told *The Paper* a week later.

She said she placed her children in her car, started it up to keep them warm, then ventured back into the house to save their pets.

Remaining in the house were five dogs, seven cats and two pot-bellied pigs.

As fate would have it, the fire caused the windows to blow out when she re-entered the residence and she was overcome with smoke, unable to rescue the animals.

Her children were safe.

"I got the kids," she added. "They are not replaceable."

The house is located south of Route 116 off Route 47 near Saunemin.

Erika said she thinks the fire began from an electric heater on the front porch.

"That baby monitor woke

me up," she explained. "We were all sleeping."

She said it took firefighter-

ers five hours to extinguish the blaze. She lost every

After running a custom trailer business in Morris for more than a quarter century, Morris Trailer Sales Inc. will be Morris Trailer Sales of Dwight.

"The property was sold and we are moving to this state-of-the-art facility," said Suzanne Meredith, president

and CEO of the company and resident of rural Reddick at Lake Shannon.

She joked that her cargo trailer lot will have the advantage of no more "mud" now with a paved facility.

Her trailer business has developed into a dealer for trailer manufacturers Haulmark and American Hauler of Indiana.

"We are one of the largest original cargo trailer dealers in the area," Meredith added.

"We're really excited about the move," she said. "This is a big improvement."

The cargo dealership car-

ries utility and work trailers, race car trailers, three-car haulers, aluminum and steel trailers.

The trailers can be customized for any use including vendors who sell at fairs and festivals, and even a portable dog washing business.

Many contractors order dump trailers while trailers can also be utilized for landscaping business.

"This lot will be packed," she said of the former car dealership.

Waste wood is being

transformed into useful household treasures.

John Sipple and his wife

Kellie opened Reclaimed Treasures at 111 E. Chippewa in Dwight last month, featuring custom-made wood furniture, doll furnishings, bird houses, as well as some antiques.

The business will feature an open house on March 19, during their regular Saturday hours, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. The event includes free refreshments.

The wood is all reclaimed so it does not wind up in landfills or burned, John explained.

"We use old barn wood, pallets, old dressers," he said.

He is currently working on creating a bar for wine glasses out of an old dresser.

And all the designs are custom-made by him, to a customer's specifications, or painted with desired designs, or designed by John himself.

John has a special custom doll bunk bed design with mattresses that he said sells well for people with cats too.

They also attend auctions to pick up antiques for the shop. Currently they are selling an ancient typewriter, old roll top desk, and other reclaimed treasures, like the sign says.

"I don't want it to be a thrift store," John explained. "This is hand-made stuff."

After John creates the piece, it is painted by Kellie who also mans the store during regular hours. John works at RR Donnelley during weekdays.

Regular hours are Monday, Tuesday and Thursday, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m., Wednesday, 3 to 6 p.m., and Saturday, 10 a.m. to 6 p.m.

# The Keeley League

Note: This is part of a weekly series of articles about the Keeley Institute that will be appearing in *The Paper* until the July 14-17 Alcohol and Drug History Society conference in Dwight.

The undergraduates, while slowly moving in the shot lines at The Keeley Institutes, were all equals regardless of occupation or fortune.

Many went by first name only, and the famous used picturesque nicknames.


Treatment included mandatory encouragement shared in line. Realizing this benefit, in April 1891, seven Dwight graduates met in Walter M. Weese's blacksmith's shop on E. Delaware Street and formed the Keeley Club.

They met daily at various locations as the membership grew, and finally in the Hahn residence on W. South Street purchased that summer by The Keeley. Many would greet the new arrivals stumbling off the train.

During the summer, clubs were started in other cities and the name was changed to the Bi-Chloride of Gold Club of the World. In September, 1892, a national convention was held in Dwight, and the name became The Keeley League dedicated to promoting Keeleyism.

The Keeley Co. gave financial support. However, The League had its own directors and officers. By 1894 it had 370 charters with more than 30,000 members.

The League's growth paralleled that of The Keeley franchised institutions which

also started in 1891. There were 126 in total with 118 operating at one time.

Every state had at least one of the 78 in the U.S., and others were in Canada, Mexico, Denmark, Finland, Norway, Sweden, Russia and England.

Each was individually owned and located in private mansions, commercial buildings or former hospitals and sanitariums designed to provide the same treatment and atmosphere as Dwight.

The cure was also administered in prisons, Indian reservations, soldiers' homes and two Kansas Army posts.

Six states passed laws providing funds to treat indigent drunkards.

Andrew J. Smith was elected president of the League at each of the 1893-93 national conventions, but was also the Governor of the National Home of Disabled

Soldiers in Leavenworth, Kansas.

A Congressional investigation began in 1896 as to Smith's conflict of interest by receiving salaries from both the League and the government.

He was accused of intimidating soldiers to take the cure.

Treatment began by allowing patients to drink alcohol followed immediately by the initial shot causing vomiting, and Smith was using government funds to buy the required whiskey.

Although the Congressional report released on Feb. 24, 1897 found no fault, Smith was fired.

The last convention was held in 1897, and without The Keeley's financial support following the investigation, most of The League clubs had disbanded by 1900.

thing except the pajamas on her and her children's backs.

The five children include her two natural kids, Preston, age 11, and Alyvia, two, as well as three step-children, Caleb, 12, Khole, six, and Blake, 11. Blake has since gone to live with his natural mother, while the four remaining children joined Erika at Erika's mother's home temporarily in Mazon.

Peet had no insurance, so she lost everything.

"The insurance company had just dropped us because the roof on the porch was in disrepair," she explained. She was purchasing the rural home on a time-payment plan with the owner.

To help the family, the State Bank of Saunemin has an account set up in her name where people may

donate cash.

In addition, her ex-husband and his wife, Mike and Sonya Jama, have set up a fund on:

The fund is under Sonya Jama.

Peet works at New Lenox Machinery and the family attends the Saunemin United Methodist Church.

The children attend Saunemin Grade School.

"The church and school come through a lot," said Erika's mother Kim.

"They already have 10 bags of clothing for her to pick up at the school," Kim continued.

"The church told her to write a list of things she needs," she said.

Erika and her family need everything.

She plans to move back into a house rented in Saunemin, she said.

"I love Saunemin," Erika explained. "I love the school. That's my family out there."

She was back at work at New Lenox the day after the fire and the children were back in school that day too.

She started the job a month ago.

"The job is my family also," Erika said. "They are the most wonderful people also."

This is not the first tragedy to befall the family. She recently separated from her second husband, after a car crash one year ago.

The accident was near Campus when a driver blew a stop sign and struck the Peet vehicle.

The family was hospitalized. After returning home, the Saunemin UMC helped out with cooked meals and did what they could to help out.

"God only gives you what you can handle and He must think I'm pretty awesome," Erika joked.

## DGS Offers Early Bird Registration Incentive Board Considers Building Projects

Dwight Grade School is hoping to encourage parents to take advantage of early registration for the 2016-17 school year. At the March 9 meeting of the Board of Education, the Board approved offering a money-saving incentive for students registering early.

Registration fees will be \$100 for the 2016-2017 school year. However, there will be an early bird discount offered between April 1st and May 31st. The registration costs during that early registration period will be reduced to \$70.

Through early registration, school officials are able to get a more accurate determination of staffing and other needs for the coming school year.

Recognized by the board were the DGS Pre-K / Early Childhood Education Faculty and Support Staff which received the ExceleRate Illinois Gold Circle of Quality Award. Gold Circle programs meet or exceed specific quality benchmarks on all standards.

"We have a great Pre-K program," stated Superintendent Dr. Richard Jancek, who also noted that 2016/17 will be the last year of guaranteed Pre-K funding before becoming a competitive grant again. "By having the highest rating it will be very difficult, in my opinion, for the state to come in and say we are going to cut any funding with one of the notable high quality programs in the state."

In other business, major building improvement projects are being considered by the BOE. The Board has

authorized a roof inspection taking place this week. The current roof is on the last year of its warranty and there are several roof-related issues throughout the building. The Board will consider recommendations after they receive the roof inspection report. It is anticipated that any roof improvements can be financed with existing maintenance funds.

A mechanical inspection report on the existing HVAC systems at Dwight Grade School was also reviewed by the Board. After much discussion, the Board decided to move forward with bids to replace the current boiler heating system as well as explore what the costs would be to add air conditioning to the building. The Board did not approve either project and is not committed to completing either or both of the projects. However, the Board did agree to take steps towards securing an architect and to move forward with the process to secure an Alternative Revenue Bond. If any of these projects are approved, they will be funded by County Facility Sales Tax revenues (1 cent sales tax) and not funded by local property taxes. Going forward, an estimated \$200,000 annually is projected to be received in sales tax revenue.

More information will be presented to the BOE at its April session for consideration on moving forward with any or all of the individual projects. Board President Marc Ellis clarified for public knowledge that monies used for physical building improvement projects are not tied to education or salaries.

"Fund 60 monies cannot be spent on general opera-

tions of the school," stated Ellis. "It cannot be spent on salaries; it can only be spent on capital projects and cannot be transferred to operational for normal operation or salaries."

The Board discussed new options for compensating the support staff in the future. A performance based evaluation system is being reviewed and the goal is the have it in place for the 2016-2017 school year. The Board will also consider having maximum ranges for hourly wages for each employee group. Dr. Jancek did recommend for 2016-17 a two percent salary increase at a minimum and a three percent salary increase at a maximum for all support staff. A two percent increase for support staff would cost the district approximately \$10,000. No actions were taken at this time.

After a closed session discussion, the Board approved the re-employment of non-tenured teachers and fall and winter coaches.

The board also:

- accepted the resignation of Beth Goodwin, Health Teacher, effective with the close of the 2015/16 school year (Ellis voted no).

- discussed dissolving the current Pepsi vending contract.

- approved a new concession cooler at a cost of \$1,365 paid for out of the O&M Fund.

- learned the current student enrollment (ECE - Grade 8) is 564 students.

The next regular session of the DGS BOE will be Wednesday, April 13, at 6:00 p.m. in the DGS Library. School board meetings are open to the public and all community-minded individuals with questions or concerns regarding Dwight schools are encouraged to attend and get to know their school.
