Illinois Gambling Payout Machines Burglarized in Dwight, Emington

Illinois Gaming Board payout machines were burglarized at the Victory Lanes Bowling Alley in Dwight in the wee hours of the morning sometime March 23.

In addition, Sunday, March 20, the payout machine was burglarized at Roadrunner's Family Restaurant in Emington.

Dwight Police Chief Tim Henson said his department received a call at 8 a.m. March 23 that indicated the door windows were broken at the Victory Lanes Bowling Alley, 410 E. Mazon Ave.

"They smashed out the doors on the south side of Victory Lanes," Henson told *The Paper*.

After gaining entry, the burglar or burglars broke into the Illinois Gaming Board payout machine, a part of the video gaming sys-

tem for electronic gambling machines at the business.

The burglars "pried open the payout machine box for the Illinois Gaming Board," Henson said.

"There was a large substantial loss for the Illinois Gaming Board," Henson explained.

In addition to taking cash out of the payout machine, burglars also stole a safe and took gift certificates from the bowling alley, Henson said.

"We have no idea how big the safe was," but he added that it was small enough to carry away.

"The amount of the gaming board losses and losses to the bowling alley was valued at more than \$10,000," Henson added.

Meantime, a similar crime was carried out overnight Sunday, March 20, against the Roadrunner's Family Restaurant.

"We received a call at 10 a.m., March 21," said Livingston County Sheriff's Lt. Mike Glowacki.

He said the outer door was pried open and the payout machine was burglarized.

The incident was not known until Monday morning when someone came in to clean.

Again, like in Dwight, the amount of cash stolen is unknown.

Investigating the crimes are the Illinois State Police, Livingston County Sheriff's Department, Illinois State Gaming Board, and Dwight Police Department.

"We are asking for anybody who has information to call the Police Department at (815) 584-3132 or if you don't want to reveal your identity, call the crime tip hotline at (815) 584-1975," Henson said.

Kinsman Woman Captures First Place in National Floral Expo

When Kaitlyn Harlow, of Kinsman, decided to enter The Great Lakes Floral Expo, a national professional florist contest held in Grand Rapids, Michigan on March 4, she had no idea she would come home with a first place.

"I thought there's no way I was going to win," she told *The Paper* last week.

She entered in the "Memorial for a Gardener" themed contest, pitted against professional florists, mostly based in Michigan. This theme was for the Professional Division of Blooming Memorials at the contest.

To create her winning design, she melded flower and vegetable gardeners into one concept.

Memorial to her meant a "tripod" held wreath.

She recalled the tools often used at her grandfather's farm, the bright flow-

ers her grandmother would plant on the edge of the family garden.

The design includes orange, red, and yellow circus roses, purple radicchio cabbage, green kale, orange tulips, asparagus, purple mums, brussels sprouts and parsley and bright orange carrots to dangle as a ribbon.

At the event the third place and second place winners were announced, and her "heart sank" as she believed she did not win.

Then the announcement came that the first place winner was Kaitlyn Harlow of Joliet Junior College, and she said she and her teacher "screamed like blooming idiots." Pun intended.

Harlow, who currently resides in her grandmother's home in rural Kinsman, was the adjunct floral teacher at JJC. She attended JJC under the direction of Donna Theimer, American Institute of Floral Design, who attended with Harlow.

Harlow has an associates in Floral Design and Interior Plant Scapes from JJC and a bachelor of education and a minor in horticulture from Kansas State University.

"I just find arranging flowers effortless and the key is don't over-think," she said in a news release issued to *The Paper*.

"But I tell you, there was no other arrangement like mine at the contest," she continued. "Dang, Maybe I should have over thought a little," she joked.

The criteria for the category was to have at least three years professional experience, and create a design using two design techniques.

She decided to use techniques she learned under the direction of Donna Theimer.

"Donna has been an incredible mentor, and encouraged me to enter into this show, with our floral design students," Harlow said.

Burglars Strike Rural Mazon, Gardner

Burglars struck south of Mazon, and west of Gardner overnight between Monday, March 21, and Tuesday, March 22, according to the Grundy County Sheriff's Department.

Although several garages and sheds were broken into and vehicles were moved or stolen, the result of the crime spree was the theft of a car radio, pickup truck and \$200 in cash from another garaged-vehicle.

"It's not like this was an experienced burglary ring," said Kevin Callahan, Grundy County Sheriff. "I don't think we're dealing with rocket scientists."

Police involvement began at 4:00 a.m. March 22 when a car was reported burning on Old Mazon Road about 1/2 mile south of Grinter Road.

Callahan said it turns out the vehicle was reported stolen in Will County on

March 19.

Meantime, at 4:45 a.m., a resident saw an all-terrain vehicle in the middle of the road at Dwight and Prairie Roads.

"The homeowner who owned the ATV reported someone entered his shed, rooting through a vehicle found \$200 in cash," Callahan said.

Shortly thereafter, a car which had its keys left in the ignition, was reported missing. The car was recovered between Old Mazon Road and the Grinter Road, with a missing radio.

Another report was made of a shed entered at which beer was taken out of the fridge and poured into a pail. The pail full of beer was inexplicably left in the roadway. A house across the street from the pail had a pick-up truck stolen from its garage.

"These guys were driving down in a stolen car, looking into sheds for vehicles with

keys left in the ignition," Callahan said.

He said he is not sure which home was struck first or which direction the burglars went or came from.

"They torched the stolen vehicle," Callahan explained. "They did not want to leave it." He said the vehicle may have had evidence such as finger prints left behind.

Callahan added there was a similar string of burglaries in the area a year ago, with burglars breaking into sheds looking for ATVs, and towing the ATVs away in a trailer. This is likely a different group of thieves, he said.


As of deadline, no arrests have been made and the stolen pickup truck and radio remain missing.

"It's just a matter of time before it [the truck] turns up," Callahan said. "This involved a lot of running around and a lot of crazy activity."

Dwight's Full Year, 4th Quarter Sales Tax Results Arrive

 The Illinois Department of Revenue recently released sales tax information for the 4th quarter and for the entire year of 2015.

Dwight finished 2015 with annual sales tax receipts of \$604,161, a decrease of \$40,747 from the village's annual sales tax receipts for 2014. The 2014 total was \$644,908.

The Grundy County portion of Dwight produced about 28.1% of the total Dwight sales tax in 2015 — \$169,816. The Grundy County amount for 2014 was \$190,908, or 29.6% of the total.

The category of *Automotive & Filling Stations* was again the top sales tax producer for Dwight during 2015, with receipts of \$179,166 from the Livingston County portion of the village. The corresponding number for Livingston

in 2014 was \$192,839. The Department of Revenue does not report figures for the above category in the Grundy County portion of Dwight.

Drinking & Eating Places provided another significant part of Dwight's sales tax revenue during 2015. They earned the village \$81,307 during 2015 (Livingston \$44,156, Grundy \$37,151).

The comparable figure in 2014 was \$85,270 (Livingston \$47,276, Grundy \$37,994).

Fourth Quarter Results

Fourth quarter 2015 sales tax receipts for Dwight were \$152,343, reflecting a \$9,443 decrease from the \$161,786 received by the village in the 4th quarter of 2014.

The Grundy County part of Dwight supplied \$40,893 of the 4th quarter 2015 total, or 26.8%.

Pump Prices Hit \$2.04

The price of regular unleaded gasoline in the U.S. breached the \$2 gallon for the past week, now at \$2.041, up 5.2 cents for the week.

Patrick DeHann, GasBuddy analyst, said even though crude prices dipped below \$40 barrel, consumers should not expect increases to be over.

The Paper's circulation area is maintaining below \$2 gallon, and in some cases below \$1.80.

"This year's jump thus far has seen average prices remain well below year ago levels across much of the nation," DeHaan said.



Dr. Leslie Keeley's Death

Note: This is part of a weekly series of articles about the Keeley Institute that will be appearing in The Paper until the July 14-17 Alcohol and Drug History Society conference in Dwight.

A year after marrying, Dr. Leslie Keeley and Mary built a home in 1889 at the west end of the Kepplinger Block where the United States Post Office is now.

Unable to sell the company in 1893, and with increased medical criticism, Dr. Keeley became more distant in managing the business.

He and his wife, 20 years his younger, increased their travels, and the Keeleys found California most appealing. In 1898, they bought a Los Angeles residence intending to winter there.

John Oughton was named president of the Keeley Co. and Curtis Judd continued as secretary/treasurer. The daily operation was left to a general manager, and Keeley's nephew, Milton, was head of the medical staff. By 1900, the number of franchises was reduced to 70 primarily

because in September, 1898, the U.S. Treasury ruled that all medicine bottles shipped from Dwight required a tax stamp based on their retail value.

The Keeley argued that each patient was prescribed a specific formula by a medical doctor as in any hospital. The government prevailed as the same drugs and tonics in the same doses were given out of stock bottles to every patient.

While in California, Mrs. Keeley became a member of the Christian Science Society which professes divine healing. She, therefore, delayed calling for a medical doctor when Dr. Keeley suffered a heart attack. He died at the age of 68 in their Los Angeles home on Feb. 21, 1900.

His remains were sent by rail to Dwight with Mrs. Keeley accompanied by her maids, her brother, and Milton Keeley, Dr. Keeley's nephew.

The body lay in repose at the Keeley's Dwight residence. Dr. Keeley had requested a simple funeral with no eulogy. A private service was held in their home on the morning of March 1, 1900, and at 2 p.m.

the casket was borne to the Congregational Church. Rev. John J. Montgomery, that church's pastor, traveled from LaGrange and spoke briefly of his friend's kindness. They rode a 400-mile circuit together in the late 1860s.

The funeral train with three coaches departed the C. & A. depot at 4 p.m. for Oak Lawn Cemetery. Dr. Keeley's final journey was by rail just as it had brought him to Dwight originally. The casket was placed in the mausoleum that he had built three years earlier.

A paragraph in the *Dwight Star and Herald* funeral article mourns his passing as follows:

"Many former patients came from far distant states to attend the funeral of the man whom they looked upon as their earthly savior. And so with no elegant tongue to rehearse his good deeds, recount his triumphs or tell of the thousands of troubled homes and tens of thousands of despairing hearts into which Dr. Keeley had sent the rays of hope and happiness, the sage of Dwight passed to his rest."

The week-long residency camp is structured to promote education and learning

opportunities for youth ages 14-16 in the areas of law enforcement, military, leadership, cultural diversity, personal development, physical fitness, and social and interpersonal skills. The ALYPC Cadets will be honored at a graduation ceremony July 1, and will receive a graduation certificate.

American Legion volunteers and ISP Troopers are assigned to manage the program and serve as instructors and mentors. Many of the American Legion and ISP volunteers are former graduates of the program.

"I had the pleasure of attending the graduation of the ALYPC last year," said Erica Jefferies, Director of the Illinois Department of

Veteran Affairs. She added, "It was evident that after one week, these young people had been transformed. They were disciplined, poised, and ready to take on any challenge the leadership provided. This program is one that all of our youth should have the privilege of attending."

The American Legion will accept applications until May 28. Teenagers 14-16 are encouraged to apply for and attend the 2016 ALYPC for an enriching experience.

Which IRA Is Better for Younger Workers?

If you're at the beginning of your career, you might not be thinking too much about the end of it. But even younger workers should be aware of – and saving for – their eventual retirement. And since you've got many years until you do retire, you've got a lot of options to consider – one of which is whether an IRA may be appropriate for you and, if so, what type.

Essentially, you can choose between a "traditional" IRA and a Roth IRA. (Other types of IRAs are available if you're self-employed.)

With a traditional IRA, you contribute "pretax" dollars, so your contributions are generally tax-deductible, depending on your income limits and whether you also have a 401(k) or other retirement plan at work. In 2016, you can contribute up to \$5,500 to your traditional IRA, although the limit rises once you reach 50. You can fund your IRA with many types of investments – for example, stocks, bonds, and government securities – and your earnings grow on a tax-deferred basis.

A Roth IRA has the same \$5,500 annual contribution limit and can also be funded with many types of investments. But there are some key differences. You can only contribute to a Roth IRA if your income is below a certain threshold, but that threshold is quite high, especially for younger workers starting their careers. So you'll likely be eligible. However, your contributions are never tax-deductible, so you're basically funding your Roth IRA with money on which you've already been taxed. But your earnings can grow tax free, as long as you don't start taking withdrawals until you're 59½ and you've had your account at least five years.

Assuming you can contribute to either a traditional or a Roth IRA, which should you choose? There's no one right answer for everyone, but as a younger worker, you may be able to gain two important benefits from contributing to a Roth.

First, since you're probably earning much less now than you will later in your career, you're likely in a relatively low tax bracket. Usually, the only way to get money from a traditional IRA before you retire is through a short-term loan; otherwise, you can get hit with both taxes and penalties on early withdrawals. But with a Roth IRA, you can withdraw your contributions (not the earnings) penalty free to help pay for your first house or to go back to school.

Still, as mentioned above, there's no hard-and-fast rule as to which IRA is better for younger workers. For example, if you are certain you'll be in a lower tax bracket when you retire, you might be better off by taking the yearly tax deductions from your traditional IRA and then paying taxes on the withdrawals when you retire. But that's a hard prediction for anyone to make.

Your tax advisor may be able to provide some guidance on whether a traditional or a Roth IRA is better for you – but either one can be a valuable resource for that day, many years from now, when you say "goodbye" to work and start a new phase of your life.



The A-7 Corsair II, a static display on loan to the Skinner-Trost Veterans of Foreign Wars Post #122, Cullom, is in need of a facelift.

Here is the Captain's report: According to Ron Shapland, post member, the plane was loaned to the Cullom VFW for a static display in 2008 and has been in town ever since, right along Route 116 in the center of the community.

"Some of the members want it to stay indefinitely," said Shapland. "I felt it is responsibility of the Post to maintain and take care of it. It's a nice addition to the town. But if we can't do it justice, we are better off letting it go."

Shapland told *The Paper* that the post was not maintaining it properly and it should be painted in the colors befitting a war bird.

The plane, a Ling-Temco-Vought A-7 Corsair II is a carrier-based subsonic light attack aircraft introduced to replace

the United States Navy's A-4 Skyhawk, initially entering service during the Vietnam War. The A-7 Corsair was also adopted by the United States Air Force, as well as the Air National Guard, to replace A-1 Skyraiders.

According to the plaque on the static display in Cullom, the A-7 was exported to Greece in the 1970s, and Portugal and Thailand in the late 1980s.

"The A-7 airframe design was based on the successful supersonic F-8 Crusader produced by Chance Vought," the

plaque reads. "It was one of the first combat aircraft to feature a heads-up display (HUD), an inertial navigation system (INS), and a turbofan engine."

Any tax-exempt entities can take over the aircraft from the Wright-Patterson Air Museum, or someone interested could volunteer to return the plane to its true combat colors to allow it to remain in Cullom.




