## Wilder Twins Retain Sense of Humor Through 92 Years

Most people in Dwight are familiar with Ron Wilder, who works in insurance and real estate for McArdle Insurance Agency in downtown Dwight.

But some may not be aware of his clone, or should I say, twin brother, Don, of Arizona, who has just as much of a sardonic wit as his Dwight "younger" brother.

They both graduated from DTHS during the heart of World War II, but each took a different path to serve their country.

Don served in the U.S. Marines in the Pacific Theater, taking on the Japanese Imperial Army on the islands of Tarawa and Saipan.

Both men still continue to work as insurance and real estate agents, but Don chose to move out of the area to Paradise Valley, Arizona because of his wife Peg. She was an RN for the Veterans Administration. They moved to Arizona in 1965. Peg passed away in January 2015.

Dwight native David Voigts will be walking across the United States with a sandwich board on his back to raise public awareness of non-consensual human experimentation by the government, which he says continues to this day.

Similar to the Central

Intelligence Agency's experiments in the 1950s with mind control known under MKULTRA, Voigts, a former Lieutenant in the U.S. Navy's control systems engineering program, said he was experimented on by the government testing human-machine interface, allowing the military to totally control a person's mind and body

wirelessly.  
He said the program was referred to as the "Voice of God" or "Hand of God" weapons, which when used with a psychological warfare campaign, are called "Perception warfare" or "No-Touch Torture" weapons.

This allows the human targeted individual to be sent real "pain" signals, to hear voices, to see things, smell things, etc. that are not there, but "implanted" in the mind electronically as if they are real.

In warfare, the application could disrupt and stop enemy combatants before the battle begins.

"There's a long history of non-consensual human experimentation on our country," Voigts said. He cited atomic radiation experiments on children with developmental disabilities and testing of LSD on unwitting U.S. citizens during the MKULTRA program.

He said the electronic "wireless torture" is only authorized to be used on enemy combatants and key support personnel in a declared war abroad, not on innocent U.S. civilians.

"You can't use them on civilians in your own country in revenge and silencing campaigns," Voigts said. "That's illegal and unconstitutional."

The Livingston County Coroner's Office announced a 20-year-old Plainfield woman died in an accident on Interstate 55 north of Pontiac.

The accident was at 1:48 p.m. Thursday, May 5.

She was the driver of a southbound 2000 silver Honda "that crossed the median into the northbound lanes making contact with two other vehicles," said Danny Watson, Livingston County Coroner in a news release.

The driver was pronounced dead at the scene and the name was being withheld pending notification of next of kin.

The crash is being investigated by the Illinois State Police District 6, and an Illinois State Police accident reconstructionist.



### Gas Drops to \$2.21

The average price of regular unleaded gasoline in the U.S. dropped to \$2.21 a gallon this week.

"It would be a mistake to read too much into the temporary 'plateau' for fuel prices that's evident right now..." said Gregg Laskoski, senior petroleum analyst for GasBuddy.

"Prices at the pump should remain fairly flat this week, particularly with thunderstorms and flash flooding reducing demand," as rough weather moves across many of the Central Plains and Southern states.

The area prices are either flat or lower compared to last week. The Paper publishes last week's and this week's lowest averages as of Mondays each week for the towns listed below.



## Scott House to Oughton Estate

**Note:** *The Paper* continues its articles about the Keeley Institute culminating with the Dwight July 14-17 Alcohol and Drug History Society Conference.

In 1895 John R. Oughton announced that the Keeley Club House would become his personal residence.

The current residence and all of the outbuildings were moved to an Oughton farm in order to provide grounds for a beautiful park setting. Belle Oughton was given the honor of naming the new residence and chose "The Manse" which means a place of abode.

Julian Barnes, a prominent Joliet architect, was hired and drew plans for the transformation. Only the very best materials were used for the most elegant of designs. The April 6, 1895 issue of the *Dwight Star* reported that improvements would cost more than \$20,000 and be a great addition to the beauty of Dwight. The stone work contract was awarded to Saunders Brothers of Ottawa.

H. Andrews & Company installed the interior wood finish. When entering through the front entrance one would see a large reception room or hall. This area, as well as the staircase,

upstairs hall, conservatory, dining and billiard rooms were all finished in antique oak. The parlor, east of the hall was finished in curly birch and the library, directly behind the reception room, in mahogany. Across the hall was the music room finished in bird's eye maple with an elegant Becker piano made of matching wood. The Oughton's den, behind the library, was finished in Pollard oak. All these rooms, with the exception of the parlor, were laid with a double border and plain centers. The centers were all quarter-sawn oak.

The master suite located to the front of the home on the second floor consisted of a bedroom, dressing room, sitting room and bathroom. The entire suite was finished with quarter-sawn sycamore. Two bedrooms for the Oughton sons were located on the west side of the floor with several guest rooms on the east side. A total of 20 rooms plus several bathrooms and closets occupied the first two floors.

The basement was divided into five large rooms and included a bowling alley, dance hall and engine, vegetable and storage rooms. The residence was heated by hot water with a Burney heater furnished by Hoffman, Russell & Company. For the lighting, the home

was wired for electricity. Handsome fixtures, made by Wilmarth of Chicago, matched the colonial style of architecture.

The outside of the residence gives a very beautiful appearance with colonial piazzas, carriage arch and approaches. The house also features large windows and a slate roof.

The Saunder Brothers were also hired to construct a barn measuring 50' X 80' with the same slate roof as the residence. The first floor consisted of five box stalls, harness and carriage rooms and a carriage wash room. The upper floor had large lofts and bins for grain and hay as well as room for hostler.

The grounds consisted of 30 acres with about 15 acres landscaped. The plans were drawn by Elliott & Company of Pittsburgh, Pennsylvania. They were the largest landscapers in the country at the time. The plan included flower beds, walks, summer houses and driveways. An artificial lake was dug south of the residence with a windmill for the water supply. The windmill stood 65 feet high and contained a 150 barrel tank to supply water to the residence and grounds.

The entire estate reflected Mr. Oughton's success with the Keeley Institute.

## Tri-Point Now Estimates It Needs to Borrow \$400,000 FY 2016

The good news is Tri-Point schools will not need to borrow a full \$900,000 in tax anticipation warrants.

The bad news is that between delays in state aid due to state fiscal budget woes and "pro-rating" annual state aid payments (read reducing), Tri-Point now estimates that by the end of June it will have to borrow roughly \$400,000, less than half the original estimate.

At a finance committee meeting May 4 in Kempston, Superintendent Jeff Bryan outlined for school board members the reasons for the cash flow issues at Tri-Point.

"We don't have to borrow money yet," Bryan told *The Paper* last week.

"We thought we would have to [use tax anticipation warrants] to finish April payroll," Bryan said.

He said the district is now projecting it will have enough funds for the second

April payroll payments and for the first May payment.

By the last May payroll payment, the district will have to borrow against its tax anticipation warrants to meet its payroll.

Bryan again stressed this is a cash flow issue and outlined the main causes are delays in state funding to schools and reductions in state funding.

By the end of June, the district is anticipating early tax revenue to come in to make up for any shortfalls remaining in the budget for fiscal year 2015-16.

In addition to reviewing district finances, the committee discussed the upcoming negotiations with the teacher's union, the Tri-

Point Education Association.

The new two-year contract will include the year when funds will begin to come in from the wind turbines, 2018.

But the district still has to get through the 2016-17 school year before they see any turbine revenue.

"The teachers know we are not flush with money," Bryan said. "We hope to bridge that gap between 2017 and 2018 with the new contract."

There are roughly 60 certified and non-certified staff members in the union and the district covers the communities of Cullom, Kempston, Cabery, Stelle and Piper City.

The girls all got to try on Firefighter Perez's coat, giggling as they realized just how heavy it was and how difficult it was to attempt to walk in it. They also got to try on the firefighter helmets. Even the lightest one was too heavy for them.

Next, they all were allowed to look inside the trucks. A few got into role playing and became firefighters who were heading out on a call. They each had their own plastic helmets on and for a little bit, felt like real firefighters ready to save the town.

The icing on the cake was when Deputy Chief Kelson loaned each Daisy a yellow coat to wear with their hats. Then he split them into two groups and took each group on a drive in the fire engine.





Perhaps most alarming is the fact that nearly 16 million children in America are struggling with hunger. Additionally, close to five million seniors face choices between paying rent, utilities, and having nutritious food.

To participate in the annual Stamp Out Hunger food drive, residents are encouraged to leave a sturdy bag containing nonperishable food items such as canned soup, canned vegetables, peanut butter, pasta, rice, or cereal next to their mailbox prior to the time of regular mail delivery on May 14. Letter carriers will collect these food donations as they deliver the mail and take them to local food banks.


