Do You Need Your
Pressure Canner Dial Gauge Tested?

To ensure safety in processing low acid food in the home canning process, the US Department of Agriculture recommends that pressure canner dial gauges be tested annually. Drusilla Banks, Nutrition and Wellness Educator, will offer free precision testing of pressure canner dial gauges at the University of Illinois Extension office located at 1650 Commerce Dr., Bourbonnais, IL. Banks will be testing gauges for accuracy during a free walk-in clinic with hours from 9 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. on June 29 and again

on July 13 from 1 to 4:30 p.m. Take in your pressure canner lid, or you may want to bring the entire canner for an evaluation.

If community residents are unable to come during the clinic hours, you may drop off your canner lid(s) at the University of Illinois Extension, Kankakee County office, during regular office hours from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. and they will contact you when your gauge has been tested. Each participant will receive a written evaluation of the test results.

LEGAL NOTICE

The Livingston County Board, at its regular meeting on June 16, 2016 adopted an Ordinance amending Livingston County hours of sale for alcoholic beverages.

Section 4-129(a) of the Code of Ordinances, Livingston County, Illinois, is hereby amended by removal of the following sentence: “The sale by such licensees of beer and alcoholic liquor shall be permitted on Sundays from 12:00 noon to 1:00 a.m. of the following day.”

The ordinance will now read as follows: “Licensees holding either a Class A or Class B license may sell beer or alcoholic liquor only from 6:00 a.m. to 1:00 a.m. of the following day except on those days when the sale of beer or alcoholic liquor is otherwise prohibited by law. However, express permission is herein granted to such licensees to transact other business and engage generally in the restaurant and food service business both during those hours described in this section, when the sale of beer and alcoholic liquor is not permitted, as well as at all other times, unless otherwise prohibited by law. All times referred to in this section are Central Standard Time or central daylight savings time.

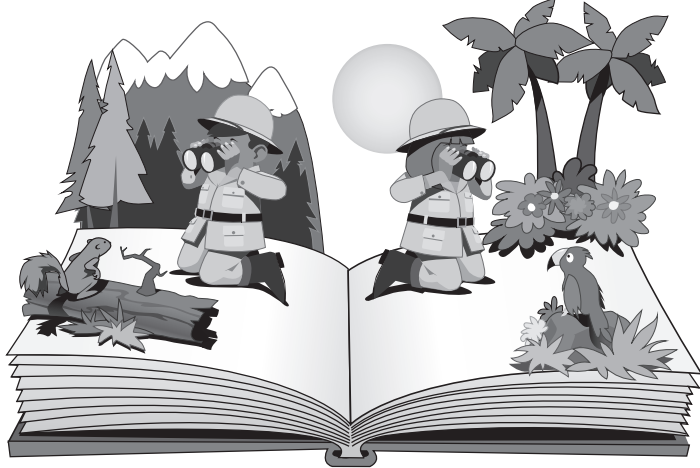

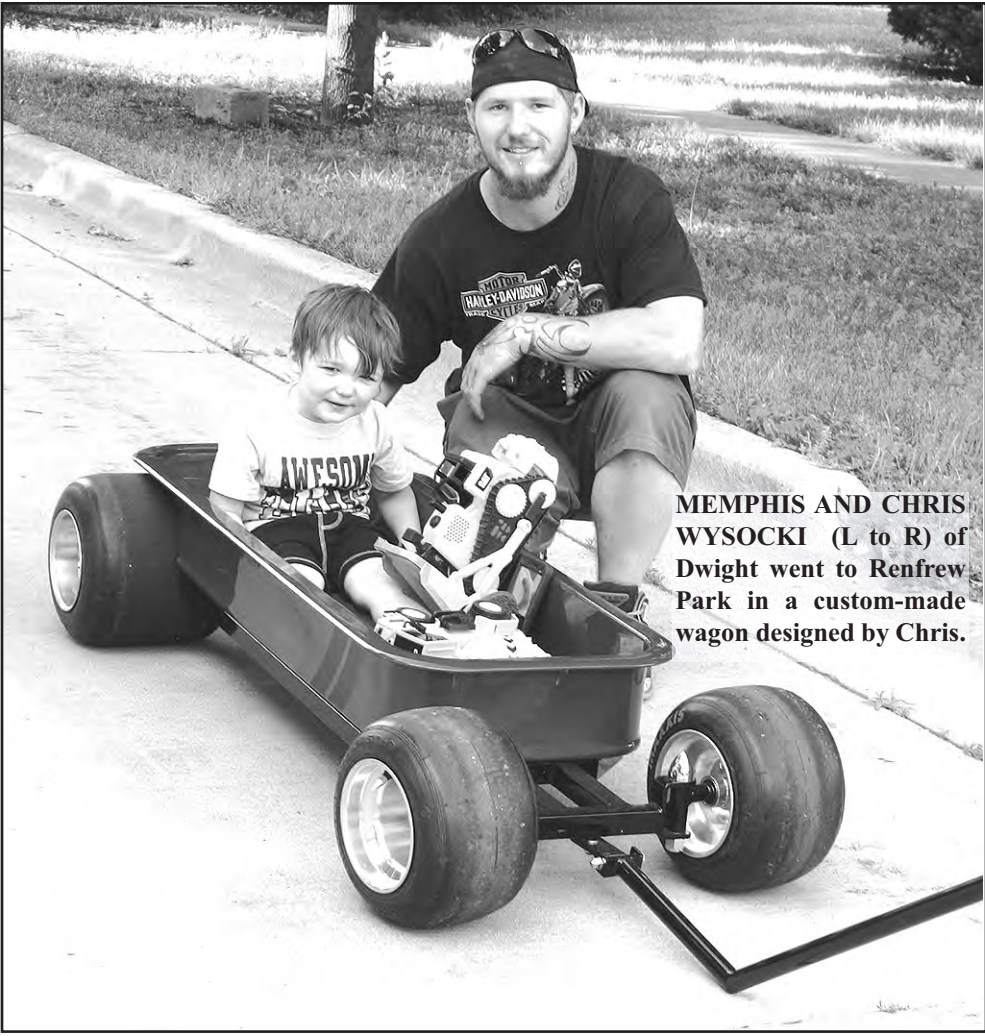

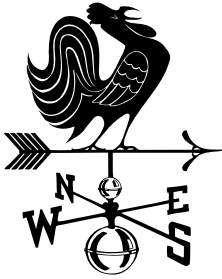
MEMPHIS AND CHRIS WYSOCKI (L to R) of Dwight went to Renfrew Park in a custom-made wagon designed by Chris.

Why should I donate double red cells?
• Red blood cells are the most transfused blood component and are frequently given to trauma and surgery patients.

• Some donors report feeling better after giving double red cells compared with other donation types because other blood components and saline are returned to the donor during the donation process.

More Taxpayers -- Similar Tax Revenue

Dwight was favored with an increase in retail sales taxpayers in the first quarter of this year compared to the same quarter of 2015 -- 127 to 115 -- but the overall revenue earned remained about the same.
Dwight received \$131,283 (\$34,951 Grundy, \$96,332 Livingston) in municipal sales tax receipts for January, February and March of this year according to the report recently released by the Illinois Department of Revenue.
The first quarter of 2015 produced \$130,405 in sales tax revenue for the Village of Dwight.
Automotive and Filling Stations was again the top retail sales category, reporting \$39,067 in sales tax from Livingston County; sales tax

for that category is not listed for the Grundy County part of Dwight. The comparable figure in the first quarter of 2015 was \$35,341.
Drinking & Eating Places provided \$18,660 (\$8,119 Grundy, \$10,541 Livingston) during the first quarter of 2016, compared to \$16,462 in the first quarter of 2015.

Gen Xers Must Juggle Both Money and Time
If you're an older member of Generation X – that is, if you were born in the early- to-mid-1960s – you may have a lot of “balls in the air.” You are saving for your own retirement – which might not be that far away – while at the same time possibly wanting to help pay for your children's college education. And you may also be assisting your aging parents in some ways. How can you manage this juggling act? To begin with, you need to emphasize your retirement. Now that you are likely in, or near, your peak earning years, you should contribute as much as you can afford to your 401(k) or other employer-sponsored retirement plan. Your plan likely offers you a range of investment options, so you can create a portfolio that's appropriate for your needs. The money in your 401(k) or similar plan can grow on a tax-deferred basis, and your contributions are typically made with pretax dollars. So, the more you put in, the lower your annual taxable income. You won't have to pay taxes until you take withdrawals, but if you do withdraw money before you reach 59½, the withdrawals may be subject to a 10% IRS penalty.
Even if you're contributing to a 401(k) or similar plan, you're probably still eligible to contribute to an IRA. Like a 401(k), a traditional IRA offers tax-deferred growth potential, while a Roth IRA can provide tax-free earnings distributions if you've had your account at least five years and don't take withdrawals until you're at least 59½. If you devote most of your investable income to your retirement plans, you may not have much left to help pay for your children's college education. But that may not be a disaster – after all, they could get scholarships and financial aid. And even if they need to take out student loans, they have a lot more years to pay them back than you have until your retirement. If you can afford to help your children, choose a smart college-savings vehicle, such as a 529 plan, which offers tax-free earnings distributions as long as the money is used exclusively for qualified higher education expenses. (If it's used for other purposes, you'll be taxed on it and also could face a penalty.)
How about your elderly parents? How can you best help them? Hopefully, they will not require any outright financial assistance from you – but that doesn't mean you can't assist them in other ways. If you haven't already done so, try to find out as much as you can about their estate plans and any arrangements they've made should they become incapacitated. Ideally, you'll want to get answers to questions such as these:
Have they named a durable power of attorney?
Have they chosen an executor for their estate?
Have they thought about how they would pay for any long-term care services they might need, such as a nursing home stay?
It may not be that easy to have these conversations, but they are important – especially if you are going to play an active role in your parents' plans.
Clearly, as a Gen Xer concerned about retirement, college-age children and aging parents, you'll have a balancing act involving both money and time. But with planning, patience and realistic expectations, you can help yourself and the ones you love.

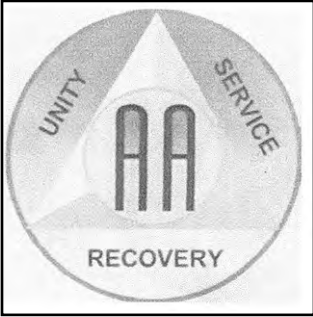
The Keeley and AA

Note: The Paper continues its articles about the Keeley Institute culminating with the Dwight July 14-17 Alcohol and Drug History Society conference.

A year after the 1900 death of Dr. Leslie E. Keeley, Charles B. Towns opened the Towns Hospital in N.Y. with financing from John D. Rockefeller. Towns claimed a 94% cure rate of drugs and alcoholic abuse using the Belliadonna poison treatment in direct competition with the gold cures. Just as newspapers in the 1890s afforded Dr. Keeley national recognition, Rockefeller used the media to decry Keeley's treatment as "quackery."

A N.Y. stock broker, William "Bill W." Wilson was one of those not cured by Towns, whose poison allegedly contained LSD. During his fourth "trip" to the hospital, Bill W. was connected to a universal higher power through "The White Light" rapture, which was typically only experienced by someone near death. He realized that spirituality was the only cure, and he divined "The Twelve Traditions" which became "The Twelve Steps" of AA today. He added a vitamin regimen creating a non-toxic treatment to rebuild both spirit and body.

Soon thereafter, Bill W. met cured alcoholic, Dr. Robert Smith, and on June 10, 1935, they formed



Alcoholics Anonymous in Akron, Ohio. Rockefeller formed a foundation in 1938 to fund AA with the proviso that it be a secret society. Unlike the defunct Keeley League, AA has no central governing board or national chairman. Each local group is autonomous.

A Peoria recovering alcoholic commuted each week-end by train to St. Louis for AA meetings. He convinced a medical doctor friend to take the Keeley cure. Upon returning home after the successful four week treatment, the two formed the Peoria chapter of AA in 1942. Dan K. heard Bill W. speak in Peoria, and with the assistance of Fred H., the Bloomington chapter was registered on April 2, 1944.

Rockefeller's foundation became the Alcoholic Foundation, and in 1946 it was the Central Services Office located in N.Y. This entity records the formation and closing of chapters and provides direction only to the local groups. No master membership list is maintained. Neither the national office nor any chapter has any commercial affiliation.

On March 2, 1946, two Chicago AA members held an "open" meeting at the Keeley Institute followed by occasional "closed" ones. Soon the Ottawa chapter sponsored regular meetings, and Manager James H. Oughton, Jr. made AA one of the therapeutic tools of the institute. The institute held its first meeting entirely run by patients under treatment in 1956 as reported to AA's General Office.

On August 10, 1958, the institute hosted on its Dwight campus the Midsummer Round-up of AA. Many Keeley patients prior to 1946 were not connected to AA, so 6,500 of them were invited. This was an all day affair with professional speakers, testimonials from members, and lunch was Bar-B-Q chicken. The event was so well attended that a Round-Up was held every summer thereafter until 1965, as the Keeley closed in June 1966. The Bloomington chapter has continued this annual event for 50 years.

Our Keeley Institute Day celebration on Sunday, July 17, includes a simulated open AA Round-Up starting at 1:00 p.m. Members from Bloomington and Peoria AA will speak on their charters' history and entertain questions. We will engage those attending who are in recovery by closing with a countdown.

Mautino Gets Extension to Amend Reports

Illinois Auditor General Frank Mautino has received a 10-day extension in which to prepare amendments to his campaign spending reports, reports that are being investigated by the Illinois State Board of Elections and also the U.S. Attorney's Office.

The investigations began when former Dwightite, now Streator resident, David

Cooke, filed a formal complaint regarding Mautino's former campaign spending. (*The Paper*, May 25, 2016 - *Auditor General Being Audited*).

Cooke's questions about some \$250,000 in payments to a Spring Valley bank and \$250,000 to a Spring Valley service station were determined by the state elections board to be on "justifiable grounds," prompting the board to set a July 1 deadline

for Mautino to answer questions about the payments.

June 13 the board extended the deadline to July 11, when it will have its next meeting.

Mautino was appointed Auditor General of Illinois last fall, and took office January 1.

Mautino has made no reply to the questions regarding his former campaign spending other than to say it was legitimate.

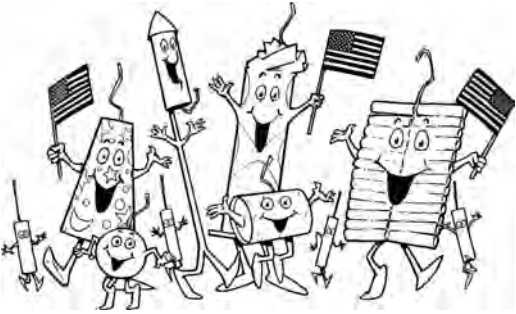





Bond Terms Being Finalized for Projects June 13 Dwight Board Actions

road improvements within Dwight’s downtown TIF Redevelopment Project area. This Series 2016B Bond carries an estimated annual payment of \$147,000 over 17 years using TIF funds.

General Obligation Bond (Alternative Revenue Source) Series 2016C in the amount not to exceed \$5,500,000 is for certain infrastructure and road improvements within the Village of Dwight. \$255,000 is the estimated ten year annual payment using monies generated from the new sales tax increase which is effective July 1.

Public comment from Dwight resident Tom Tock was in the form of general questions regarding Dwight’s total financial need for street repair, the bonds payoff terms, and what the plan is for repaving streets.

According to Mayor Jared Anderson, an earlier rough estimate of \$6.5 million was given for rough grind and overlay work only. Street work is being prioritized and the Village is looking at a mid-August start for streets that need grind and overlay work with streets needing more extensive work to rebuild taking place starting next year.

In other business, a Resolution supporting participation in the Streator Area Enterprise Zone and authorizing tax abatements for residential, commercial and industrial property improvements in the Streator Area Enterprise Zone was approved by the Board. Adam Dontz, Greater Livingston County Economic Development Council CEO, presented information regarding the details of the Resolution which would amend the Streator Area Enterprise Zone to add portions of the City of Pontiac, the City of Fairbury, the Village of Dwight, and the Village of Forrest along with additional unincorporated areas in Livingston County. The proposed expanded Enterprise Zone is an economic development tool aimed at attracting large business to the area.

Following recommendations from the Administration Committee which met on May 25, the board agreed to accept two parcels donated to the Village. One parcel is Lot 23 of Scott Subdivision which fronts IL Rt. 47. The second parcel is the Scott drainage easement that is already a permanent dedicated easement to the Village.

Acting on a second Administration meeting recommendation, the board approved entering into an agreement with Ehler’s Inc. for consulting services to develop a second Tax Increment Financing District in Dwight. The Village is considering forming an Old Route 66/Rt.17 Interchange District. Phase 1, which is a Feasibility Analysis, would cost \$12,500.00. If the analysis is successful, the entire fee for TIF District development, qualification, and adoption services without a housing impact study would cost \$29,000.00.

State Representative Tom Bennett was on hand to give an update on actions, or absence of actions, taking place in Springfield. According to Bennett, that, despite a lack of trust between parties, government officials are still working together to get some things done. But, with respect to the lack of a State Budget, little progress has been made.

“Has much changed since the last time I was here? In some ways, no,” said Bennett.

Bennett told the group that while there are “whispers” of a budget passing in

DTHS Summer Projects Set to Begin

June 15 BOE Actions

Plans for summer projects at Dwight Township High School have been finalized and are underway as the Board of Education approved several bids for related work when it met on June 15.

This summer's two major projects include parking lot improvements and new softball field dugouts and related softball field improvements.

Opperman Construction was awarded the parking lot improvement project which includes paving the west

parking lot area, with work to be completed in July. Opperman was awarded the project with a bid of \$268,476.40 which will be funded by the District's Operations and Maintenance Fund. The parking lot lighting project was awarded to Kelly Electric with a bid of \$31,850 to be paid for using Transportation Fund monies.

The softball field improvement related projects were awarded/approved as follows:

- Muffler Concrete, Inc., Softball dugout footing and flatwork, \$17,258 paid from

Fund 60 (Sales Tax).

- Vendor TBA, Softball dugout split-face block work, at a cost not to exceed \$24,999, paid from O&M Fund.
- Bradbury Tree Service, Tree removal behind softball field, \$1,500 paid from O&M Fund.
- Lovell Excavating Inc., Water line relocation, not to exceed \$2,000 paid from O&M Fund.
- Ifft Quality Fencing; Softball backstop and netting project, \$18,900 paid from Fund 60.

DTHS Maintenance (Jack Connor) will provide the softball roof and doors at a cost of \$5,500 paid from Fund 60.

It was noted that Chuck Trainor of Dwight has volunteered time and equipment for the demolition of

the old dugouts.

In other business on June 15, with the Board's earlier decision to not meet in July, several actions were approved in preparation for items that might need attention before the next regular session in August. Those actions included the authorization to pay Fiscal 2016 bills; authorization to pay July 2016 bills; authorization of Inter-Fund transfers; and the authorization for the employment of new faculty and staff members as needs arise prior to the August BOE session.

A renewal of the Prairie State Insurance Cooperative for coverage and premiums of property, liability, auto, and workman's compensation was approved by the BOE at a cost of \$70,565.00. This reflects a 4.51 percent

decrease in cost over last year. This is a one year renewal.

In his report to the BOE, Superintendent Dr. Richard Jancek reported that a test of the school's water with regard to lead or any other hazardous content came back compliant and with no concerns noted.

The Board also:

- approved student attendance for a Costa Rica trip planned for Summer 2017.
- accepted resignation of Allie Rossi as Assistant Track Coach
- accepted resignation of Christie Jones as English Teacher.
- accepted resignation of Devi Papas as Junior Class Sponsor.
- accepted the resignation of Steve Summers as Junior Class Sponsor.

- employed Amy DeMarse as Junior Class Sponsor.
- employed Stephanie Flott as Junior Class sponsor.
- employed Karen Zabel as Freshman Class Sponsor.
- approved a Military Leave of Absence for Captain Steve Summers, Illinois National Guard (July – Dec. 2016).
- approved the 2016 – 17 Student Handbooks as presented.

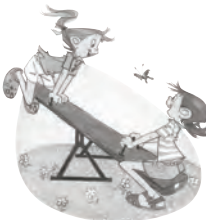

Supervised Agricultural Experience involves purchasing and reselling all natural, free range turkey products and eggs. He has an extensive, 100 percent wholesale client base in the urban areas of Chicago and Bloomington. There is a large demand for products that are perceived to be healthier and raised naturally, and that has provided him with money to attend college and pursue an agriculture degree.

Diversified Crop Production Entrepreneurship State Proficiency Winner: Jared Haberkorn is the son of Michael and Gena Haberkorn of Cullom and his FFA Advisor is Mrs. Diana Loschen. Haberkorn’s Supervised Agricultural Experience consists of 40 acres on a 50/50 crop share. In 2013, he sold 800 bales of wheat straw, raised Pioneer wheat which yielded 79 bushels per acre, 40 acres of Wyffels corn which yielded 209 bushels per acre, and 40 acres of Mycogen soybeans which yielded 54 bushels per acre. In 2015, he planted a 15-variety Mycogen corn research plot which helped him learn more about the seed industry and what it takes to have a diversified crop production program.

one woman, who insisted she did not need comforting. But after a few minutes, she burst into tears saying she was out of work and would lose her children if she did not find work. She needed the dog to release the pain, Mortensen explained.

At the Prairie Creek Library, Jeremiah was in the children’s book section allowing children to read to him, pet him. One rambunctious youth was running around the books but the dog remained calm and gentle

and allowed everyone to pet him.

Jeremiah is the latest dog to be “socialized” by Mortensen’s training, and has only been with the family a short time. The dogs who traveled by airplane to Orlando last week trained by Mortensen included Phoebe, who was with Elaine for one year, Hannah who was trained for six months, and Suzie, who was with Mortensen for two months.

Is it tough to allow the dogs to go after training?

Mortensen herself was

overwhelmed with tears remembering the 14 dogs she trained and gave back to the ministry. But she knows they are doing their “job” by performing needed comfort for people such as the Orlando shooting victims.

Elaine and her husband Alan Mortensen became involved with the ministry because Alan worked at the Dwight Women’s Correctional Facility, and the ministry needed a volunteer to help the dogs learn about the world outside the prison. So Elaine’s socialization of the

dogs includes having children read to them at the library, while getting lots of hugs and gentle petting.

Why Golden Retrievers?

“Because they are adaptable and approachable,” Mortensen explained.

Jeremiah’s vest says “Pet me please-- in training.” The children at the Prairie Creek Library obliged Jeremiah’s request.

Dwight Video Gaming Slows Again

The amount of money gambled in Dwight’s video gaming terminals during May was \$10,652 less than in April.

April was some \$56,000 less than in March.

March, with \$678,871 of

funds gambled, retains the title of “Record Month.”

The Village of Dwight received \$7,704 for its share in May, while the State of Illinois collected \$38,521 from Dwight’s 51 video gaming terminals.

The State of Illinois and Village of Dwight receive a total of 30% of the Net Terminal income monthly (State 25%, Village 5%). Gardner VGTs Show Gain

Thirteen video gaming terminals in Gardner earned the village \$1,976 in May, \$277 more than the machines earned the village during April. The State’s share from those machines in May was \$9,882.

Below are the Gardner establishments with gaming terminals (number in paren-

thesis), the amount of funds invested, funds paid out, the net terminal income, and the amounts received by the State and by Gardner.

Statewide, Illinois added 542 video gaming terminals in May, but its total video gaming revenue dropped from \$24,167,665 in April to \$23,162,815 in May.
