Cullom Historical Museum to Open During Cullom Homecoming

The Cullom Historical Society will open its doors to the public for the first time during this year's 124th Annual Homecoming Aug. 11 to 13 in Cullom.

The society is in its second year, renting the location of the former Leiser Department Store, 123 W. Hack Street in downtown Cullom.

The building is currently owned by Daryl Holt of Dwight.

Cullom Historical Society President Sandra Gunther said the society members were hoping for a gift of a building for housing their museum treasures, but they were able to get a reasonable rent rate from Holt.

Plus the building itself

has Cullom history, run by the brother of the man who started Leiser Furniture in Herscher, still in operation today.

"Last year we had a display in the window for the Homecoming celebration," Gunther said. She sent out letters to area people seeking donations to pay the monthly rental for the museum.

"Amazingly enough, we got enough to carry us through one year," she said.

"I did a happy dance."

But the society is still in need of financial help, and plans to put a donation box at the front door during this year's community homecoming.

And there is more to display.

Currently, a special collection on loan from Gary Hamilton is at the museum.

"We've got stacks of stuff in the back room," she added.

The museum has a

Special School section, a wall dedicated to Leiser Department Store, a bedroom area, a dining room area.

The museum is full of family items unique to the Cullom area, and historical memorabilia from several periods of history, mostly in the 20th Century.

The museum also features railroad memorabilia, and donations from the Dean Makinson Estate. (continued on page 3)

Economic Recovery Strategy – Dwight is Well Positioned for Growth


A Village of Dwight Economic Recovery Strategy has been developed and finalized. At its July 25 session, the Dwight Village Board of Trustees accepted the strategy prepared and presented by Teska Associates.

In 2015, the Village of Dwight received a 50/50 grant from the U.S. Department of Commerce's Economic Development Administration to assist in developing an economic recovery strategy. As stated in the report, one of the key factors for the Village receiving this grant was the March 2013 closure of the Dwight Correctional Center which had employed 382 full- and part-time correctional staff plus many additional jobs in support-related industries.

Despite this setback, the Village's location, transportation access, and community spirit are cited as strong positives for Dwight that can aid in economic recovery.

The report states that Dwight is well positioned for economic development, including access to major markets like Chicago, Indianapolis and St. Louis and regional markets like Joliet, Peoria, Bloomington/Normal and Champaign/Urbana.

Two-thirds of the U.S. popu-



The table to the right compares the property tax rate in Dwight with that of many surrounding communities. As this table shows, Dwight's property tax rate is generally in the middle of surrounding communities, providing neither a significant competitive advantage nor disadvantage.

lation can be reached within a one-day drive of Dwight.

The report was put together following an in-depth study of various aspects of the community and surrounding area. It provides a comprehensive detailed report including sections focusing on the Village profile, community input, retail, industrial, residential, tourism, an incentive analysis, development opportunities and an implementation plan.

Cost of the study and resulting 60-page Economic Recovery Strategy was \$33,500 with the Village assuming half of the cost. The report will be

used as an economic development guide for the community and will be forwarded to the Economic Development Strategy Council in Chicago.

In other business, following a July 25 Properties Committee meeting, the board acted on committee recommendations including starting the bidding process to get street repair work underway. The board approved putting 39 streets,

with three alternate options for the repair work, out to bid.

House demolition bids for three Village-owned properties were reviewed by

the board with the board awarding the work to Strachan Farms with a low bid of \$28,450.00. In May, the board approved the purchase of the three vacant properties with the intent to raze the deteriorated buildings. The properties are located at 221 E. Waupansie Street, 300 Odell Road, and 305 E. Delaware Street. The purchase price for the three properties was \$39,000 along with the Village assuming demolition costs.

The board approved the hiring of Cody Mahoney as a new Public Works employee for the Village, effective August 1, contingent on passing required testing and with a six month probationary period. Mahoney hires in at Step A with a starting salary of \$36,285.00. He fills a position which recently opened following the resignation of Village Public Works employee Dean Christensen.

Village President Jared Anderson addressed public concerns that were raised when Village warning sirens were not engaged during a recent storm where National Weather Alerts were broadcast locally.

According to Anderson and EMS Director Al Metzke, over the years and due to public influence, the policy for sounding sirens changed and, for years now, weather sirens have only



Plane Crashes in Soybean Field Near Dwight

A botched landing resulted in a plane inverted in a soybean field near Dwight Aero, Wednesday, July 27.

The Dwight Fire Department responded to a 9-1-1 call made by the pilot,

a woman from Oak Lawn.

She had no passengers in the plane, suffered minor injuries and was treated and released, according to Justin Dyer, Dwight Deputy Fire Chief.

Dyer said the pilot tried to land at the Dwight Airport, went to power up again, and

did not have enough power, ending up flipping the plane over in the adjacent soybean field.

"When the plane flipped over she was trapped inside," Dyer explained, and she subsequently called 9-1-1.

relative of Fred Kingdon.

Kingdon has his own wall. He was a master of everything retail in town, including hardware, furniture, undertaking, farm machinery, horse-drawn buggies, heating and plumbing, rugs, and paints.

Another famous landmark in Cullom was a soda shop called "Keegan's," which is featured at the museum.

Cullom was founded in 1882 when the railroad came through the area.

"It had hotels and saloons, tastings bars and a Temperance Union Group," Gunther said.

Auditor General Mautino Misses Third Deadline

Illinois Auditor General Frank Mautino and his former campaign committee remained silent last week regarding certain campaign expenditures made while Mautino was an Illinois State Representative.

Mautino was appointed Auditor General of Illinois January 1, 2016.

Deadlines of July 1, July 11, and July 25 had been set for Mautino's former committee to explain questionable expenditures by the committee.

No further extensions were requested of, or given by, the Illinois Board of Elections on the 25th -- instead a public hearing date

That was on her father's side. On her mother's side, her relatives drained the swamp in Kempton, a town six miles from Cullom and part of the original three communities making up the Tri-Point school district.

The next event scheduled for the society is Oct. 1, with a Third Cemetery Walk at the museum sponsored by

the Cullom Home and Community Education Association.

Nov. 20 will include a Festival of Trees at the Cullom Beckman Memorial Library.

In December, there will be an old fashioned Christmas at the museum, with dates to be announced.

Among the officers working with Gunther are Diane Shapland, vice president; Mari Knapp, historian; Nancy Flessner, treasurer; and Judy Ehlers, secretary.

Directors include Erran Melton, Ron Shapland, and Karen Moritz.

been engaged when a tornado funnel cloud is spotted and an imminent threat to the Village of Dwight is posed.

After discussion, it was decided that there needs to be continuity between National Weather Service Warnings and the sounding of Village sirens which could include sounding sirens when a National Weather Service warning is issued regardless of an actual tornado spotting. The Village will look at making changes to its current weather siren policy. Metzke did recommend that all residents take advantage of the Code Red signup on the Village of Dwight website to ensure that residents receive warnings via phone.

Also in his report to the Board, Anderson commented on the recent Keeley Institute event in Dwight saying that visitors attending were impressed with Dwight and that Keeley Day organ-

izers are looking at continuing to hold this event in Dwight in the future. Anderson said the event made a wonderful impression of Dwight on people from all over the world.

"It was Dwight Historical Society that did all of the planning and executing of the plan," said Janice Lauritzen, giving credit to local organizers. "They put a lot of time and effort into it and they did a really nice job. There were a lot of volunteers that helped for the weekend – it was a joint effort. 

Ransom Residents Not Allowed to Keep Live Chickens at Their Home

After a six-month process including a jury trial last week, Randy Stillwell was told the same thing the Ransom Village Board said at a public meeting Jan 13: that residents are not allowed to house live hens at their homes.

Stillwell, who also sits on the board, was told by the La Salle County Judge Daniel Bute in his case July 26 that Stillwell must have his chickens removed by Aug. 31 and comply with the village ordinance, echoing comments made to Stillwell at the Jan. 13 village board meeting by Ransom Mayor Matt Hauser.

Stillwell was also on the Ransom village board when the ordinance was passed banning the housing of hens

at homes back in 1997. At that time, Stillwell said he was told his were "grandfathered" in.

However, according to Village Attorney Sheryl Churney, there is no record in the minutes concerning grandfathering in his chickens.

At the trial July 25, the Ransom village clerk said there was no definitive decisions to allow Stillwell to keep his chickens or not.

"The main argument he had against the village ordinance was he was grandfathered in," said Attorney Cara Luckey-Reynolds, who represented the Village as legal counsel at the trial.

"Nothing in the ordinance proves the grandfather provision," added Churney. "And there is nothing in the minutes."

"Mr. Stillwell was unable to present any witnesses," to support his assertion the chickens were grandfathered in, Churney added.

Trouble is, he has had them in town at his home since prior to the adoption of the ordinance nearly two decades ago.

The trial lasted one day and the jury returned a verdict the next day before 1 p.m.

And when the issue was brought up at the close of 2015, the village learned two other families had chickens at their residence.

All were sent letters, but the other families have since removed the chickens to comply with the ordinance.

Stillwell's was the only case that went to trial.

Doten was preceded in death by his parents, Lloyd and Margaret; his brother, Marshall; his aunt, Lillian Dines; and his ex-wife, May. Lloyd Doten Bush was born April 22, 1925 in DeKalb County, Illinois, son of Lloyd W. and Margaret Braucher Bush. He attended Dwight Township High School, enjoying success as a quarterback on the football team; point guard on the basketball team; and as a drummer in the swing band.

Doten graduated early from high school in January, 1943, so he could follow his older brother, Marshall, into the US Navy's V-12 officer training program at Purdue University in West Lafayette, Indiana. While at Purdue, Doten met his future wife, May Jack, a cheerleader for the Purdue football

team. May, and Doten's classmates in the V-12 program, including lifelong friends, Milt Lauenstein and Virgil Trice, helped Doten cope with the tragic loss of his older brother, Marshall, to a swimming accident at the Purdue natatorium in 1944.

Doten graduated with a Chemical Engineering degree from Purdue in October, 1945, and was commissioned shortly thereafter as an ensign in the US Navy.

After his hitch in the Navy, Doten began work as a Chemical Engineer at Marathon Paper Corporation in Appleton, Wisconsin. Doten and May Jack were married in 1947 and lived for short periods on the Gold Coast of Chicago, Denver, and the plains of West Texas.

In 1948 Doten returned with May to his hometown of Dwight, Illinois to manage a part of the family business. While looking after the feed mill and chicken hatchery operations, Doten renewed friendships with his high school friends and became a valued community leader in Dwight. Doten and May welcomed their two children, Belinda and Bob, during this period in Dwight.

When the feed business dwindled in the late 1950s as family farms were consolidated into corporate farms, Doten and May relocated to Denver, where Doten established his career as a marketing rep for data processing systems, and later as a management consultant.

In Denver, Doten was active in the Unitarian Church, where he valued his friendships with Reverend Dick Henry and future Governor Dick Lamm.

Career opportunities for Doten took the family to the Milwaukee area and residence in Thiensville, Wisconsin for nine years. With the children graduated from high school, Doten and May moved back to Colorado,

where Doten worked in a small business with his friend, Bob Striebe. Doten finished his working career in commercial real estate and management consulting for small businesses in Boulder County.

Doten and May worked hard to provide enrichment opportunities for their children, including musicals performed at Cheesman Park in Denver; garden plots at the Denver Botanical Gardens; skiing at what was then the rustle mining town of Breckenridge; and Cub Scouts and Girl Scouts.

They were active in school activities – Doten served one year as President of the Teller Elementary School PTA. Doten, May and Doten's parents encouraged the Bush children to continue a family tradition of scholarly, intellectual, athletic, and artistic pursuits.

Throughout his lifetime, Doten never hesitated to step forward to help those in need. During his retirement years, May's father, George Jack, was welcomed to live in the Bush household. Many family members and friends can tell stories of how Grandpa Doten helped bail them out of dire situations or to discover career opportunities.

Doten's golden years, over thirty of them, were focused on a loving relationship with his partner, Peggy Sanford. Doten and Peggy enjoyed many contented years in Longmont until poor health forced Doten to relocate, in 2011, near his children in Canon City. Doten lived with the friendly and caring residents at the Royal Gorge Manor until his passing.



Village of Gardner Passes Appropriation Ordinance

by Don Phillips

Gardner Commissioner Richard Hileman presented the budget and appropriation ordinance at the council's July 25 meeting, highlighting the changes for the new fiscal year.

The appropriation was passed unanimously and will be on file by July 31.

The total appropriation is \$6,957,700 compared to the previous appropriation of \$6,942,450.

Hileman advised the village has made numerous repairs to one of the pumps and after several repairs, Hileman discussed some of the charges with the vendor, resulting in a bill reduction of over \$3,000.

Hileman was contacted last week by a company seek-

ing to install several communications towers under a franchise agreement with the village and asked Scott Belt to review the information.

The Gardner Village Board was asked by this reporter for Depot Street to be closed for the Morris Tractor Adventure to be held on Sept. 16 through 18.

He told the village board he is drawing the map for the event and would like to include Gardner as a stop, possibly for lunch on Sept. 17.

The Heritage Tractor Adventure visited the village in 2013 when Phillips drew the map for that event. The MTA is being organized by many of the same people who organized the HTA but is not affiliated with the Heritage Corridor.

A motion to allow the tractor adventure to have the street closed off in Gardner was passed unanimously.

Bill Pohl, representing the Braidwood Council of Knights of Columbus, requested permission for the KC's to sell Tootsie Rolls Sept. 16 through 18, the same weekend as the Morris Tractor Adventure.

A motion was made and passed unanimously.

In other business:


- heard from Commissioner James Riley he sent a letter regarding property clean-up, which was completed.

- was asked by Riley to complete sidewalk repairs on Center Street at an estimated cost of \$1,500 from an outside contractor. The motion was stalled based on a tie

vote with Jensen supporting Riley's motion and Hileman and Serena opposing. Serena told *The Paper* the next day that the work would be done in-house instead of having it contracted out.

Engineer Guy Christensen advised the bonds worth \$100,000 are in place for the installation of the pedestrian crossings at the Union Pacific railroad crossings. Bonds guarantee the work in case something goes against the plan.
