

Truck Plows Into Mazon Post Office, Forcing Temporary Closure

A pickup truck smashed into the front of the Mazon Post Office, Monday, Feb. 6, thankfully with no injuries.

But the post office building did not do so well.

As of Tuesday, Feb. 7, the Mazon Postmaster was working out of the Morris Post office for local deliveries.

A notice is posted at the Mazon Post Office stating that other than mail picked up at post office boxes, there will be no changes to mail delivery. There are 354 post office box customers in Mazon.

However, customers who have post office boxes must go to the Morris Post Office to retrieve their mail.

According to Deputy

Chief Ken White of the Grundy County Sheriff's Police, the accident occurred at 12:18 p.m. A pickup truck driven by James Seerup, Mazon, age 76, with his wife Linda as passenger struck the steel post in front of the parking spaces and continued through the front wall of the post office.

"The driver was parking into a spot, and his foot slipped off the brake onto the accelerator," White explained.

There was a gas leak inside the building and the Mazon Fire Department called NICOR and evacuated the immediate vicinity.

White said within 45 minutes of NICOR's arrival, the gas leak was contained and the evacuation was called off.

"It could have been a lot

worse," White said. "There could have been injuries to the driver, passenger and patrons in the post office."

At the time of the accident, there were no patrons, but two postal employees were inside.

Jennifer Triner, the Mazon Postmaster, working out of the Morris Post Office as of Tuesday, said the postal service is still deciding what to do in terms of the repairs, temporary mail service and other concerns.

According to U.S. Post Office spokesperson Beverly Howard, the post office has still not received a full assessment of the damages, and therefore has not formulated a plan to remedy the situation.

"We're just glad nobody got hurt," Howard told *The Paper* last week.

DGS Graduation Date and Calendar Recommendations Approved
Board of Education Seats Open

The Dwight Grade School Board of Education approved calendar recommendations when the BOE met on February 8.

The DGS 8th Grade promotion ceremony date is set for Thursday, May 25, 2017. Eighth Grade students will not come to school on this day. To date, only one emergency day has been used. Pending use of any additional emergency days, the tentative last day of school for the current school year is set for Tuesday, May 30.

The DGS Board also approved the 2017-18 school calendar. The 2017-18 DGS calendar calls for the first day of student attendance to be August 21, 2017 with a regular school schedule.

Highlights from the calendar include Winter Break from December 22, 2017 – January 3, 2018 with students returning to school on January 4. Spring Break has been designated as March 26 – April 2, 2018. May 25, 2018 is the planned last day of student attendance; however, five emergency days designated as May 29, 30, 31, June 1 and 4, 2018 could impact the final day of school.

In his report to the board, Superintendent Dr. Richard Jancek informed the board that there will be two open board seats with no candidates on the April ballot. Seats held by board members Cathy Ferguson and Steve Tock will expire with neither Ferguson nor Tock seeking re-election. The district will advertise for, and

interview, interested parties to fill the two-year unexpired terms. Seats held by Bo Partney and Nick Stipanovich will also expire with both seeking reelection.

In the financial report, it was noted that the State of Illinois currently owes the District \$215,502.20 in late mandated categorical payments for the 2016-17 school year as well as \$4,984.29 for the 2015-16 school year.

Student organizers from Mrs. Laura Vigna's Fourth Grade Class gave a presentation to the board with regard to a very successful book drive. The student-run book drive collected approximately 2,000 books which were donated to Goodwill in Morris.

In other business the board:

- approved employment of Cori Paton, Classroom Aide.
- approved employment of Corilyn McCullough, Classroom Aide.
- accepted the resignation of Sarah Windham, Choir Teacher.
- accepted the resignation of Coreen Perschnick, 8th Grade Volleyball Coach.
- discussed BOE goals and initiatives.
- learned that current ECE – 8th Grade student enrollment is 558 students.

Action regarding approval of Building Administrator contracts was tabled until March.

The next meeting of the Dwight Grade School Board of Education will be Wednesday, March 8 at 6 p.m. in the DGS Library. Meetings are open to the public.

Johna Bradley, of Herscher, began her love affair with the camera at the tender age of 12 when she and a sibling started fooling around with the family video camera.

At the time, mother Vickie Denault told Johna that she "sort of has an eye for this."

Moving ahead to the present time, she is the owner/operator of a new photo studio, Johna R. Bradley Photography, at 146 E. Main Street, Dwight, opening for business in December.

Bradley is a 1994 graduate of Herscher High School, daughter of Laverne and Vickie Denault of Herscher, and attended the College of DuPage for digital photography in 2008.

In 2008 she contracted with various area fire departments to be the official photographer at fire and accident scenes. Currently she is the photographer for fire departments in Dwight, Herscher, Limestone Township, Salina Township, Reddick and Kankakee Township. Her professional fire photography business is called Second Alarm Fire Photography, and has 8,000 followers online, she said.

But the studio in Dwight will focus on pleasant subjects rather than vehicle accidents and structure fires.

She shoots families, high school seniors, children, and weddings.

Through the lens, she looks for proper angles and clarity in photos, she said.

"For kids, I look for expressions and show that in the picture," she said.

Portrait studio photography has changed since the days of negatives and camera film with the onset of digital photography.

Computer software is used to prepare images now, instead of chemicals in a darkroom.

And the customers no longer receive proof prints of photographs.

She has photos posted online for customers to choose, giving them a choice of several portrait packages with varying prices according to the number of photos in each package.

There are packages also for weddings and high school seniors.

She said the customer is given a special code, and goes online to view the selection of images, and choose which package they prefer.

Johna is a member of the Dwight Fire Department along with her husband, Steve, and their 18-year-old son, also Steve, who is known as "junior" at the Dwight Fire Department.

The Bradleys also have a five-year-old boy named Chase and a three-year-old girl named Adalynn.

Johna's portrait photography business is by appointment only.

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What's Smarter -- Paying Off Debts or Investing?

If you're just starting out in your career, you will need to be prepared to face some financial challenges along the way – but here's one that's not unpleasant: choosing what to do with some extra disposable income. When this happens, what should you do with the money? Your decisions could make a real difference in your ability to achieve your important financial goals.

Under what circumstances might you receive some "found" money? You could get a year-end bonus from your employer, or a sizable tax refund, or even an inheritance. However the money comes to you, don't let it "slip through your fingers." Instead, consider these two moves: investing the money or using it to pay off debts.


Which of these choices should you pick? There's no one "right" answer, as everyone's situation is different. But here are a few general considerations:

Distinguish between "good" and "bad" debt. Not all types of debt are created equal. Your mortgage, for example, is probably a "good" form of debt. You're using the loan for a valid purpose – i.e., living in your house – and you likely get a hefty tax deduction for the interest you pay. On the other hand, nondeductible consumer debt that carries a high interest rate might be considered "bad" debt – and this is the debt you might want to reduce or eliminate when you receive some extra money. By doing so, you can free up money to save and invest for retirement or other goals. Compare making extra mortgage payments vs. investing. Many of us get some psychological benefits by making extra house payments. Yet, when you do have some extra money, putting it toward your house may not be the best move. For one thing, as mentioned above, your mortgage can be considered a "good" type of debt, so you may not need to rush to pay it off. And from an investment standpoint, your home is somewhat "illiquid" – it's not always easy to get money out of it. If you put your extra money into traditional investments, such as stocks and bonds, you may increase your growth potential, and you may gain an income stream through interest payments and dividends.

Consider tax advantages of investing. Apart from your mortgage, your other debts likely won't provide you with any tax benefits. But you can get tax advantages by putting money into certain types of investment vehicles, such as a traditional or Roth IRA. When you invest in a traditional IRA, your contributions may be deductible, depending on your income, and your money grows on a tax-deferred basis. (Keep in mind that taxes will be due upon withdrawals, and any withdrawals you make before you reach 59½ may be subject to a 10% IRS penalty.) Roth IRA contributions are not deductible, but your earnings are distributed tax-free, provided you don't take withdrawals until you reach 59½ and you've had your account at least five years.

Clearly, you've got some things to ponder when choosing whether to use "extra" money to pay off debts or invest. Of course, it's not always an "either-or" situation; you may be able to tackle some debts and still invest for the future. In any case, use this money wisely – you weren't necessarily counting on it, but you can make it count for you.

Dispute Over Grundy County Sheriff Sgt. Insurance Costs Results in Mediation Starting Today

A dispute over how much taxpayers should be contributing to health insurance benefits for sergeants of the Grundy County Sheriff's Department has reached a stage for the County-requested mediation.

As of today, mediation talks begin between the County Board and Teamsters Union Local 700.

Under the existing collective bargaining agreement, the sergeants receive insurance through the Teamsters. The county pays \$1,092 per month for each member of the unit.

"However, as of Feb. 1, the Teamsters abruptly and unilaterally terminated the sergeants' coverage, leaving employees without any insurance plan," according to a news release issued by Grundy County last week.

In a news release issued the day before by the Teamsters Local 700, the union states Teamsters Local 700 filed an unfair labor practice with the Illinois Labor Relations Board against the Grundy County Sheriff and Grundy County "after the employer [Grundy County] stopped providing health insurance for the

ing, when the union refused to discuss any employee contribution for insurance," the county release states.

The original negotiations for the current contract was hammered out in 2013 with a monthly cost of \$835.

According to the county news release, in 2016, claims experience "appears to have been applied by the Fund, resulting in a proposed rate of \$2,295 per month, nearly three times the original cost of the Teamsters Local 727 Fund insurance."

"Simply stated, the Sheriff, Grundy County, and the taxpayers cannot afford the significant increases that the Teamsters have demanded," the county release stated.

"The Sheriff has been holding up negotiations for over a year and the fact that he doesn't even want to support his own people is deplorable," said Becky Strzechowski, Teamsters Local 700 president.

The county countered with "The Sheriff and County have made several offers that represent a fair deal for both the sergeants and the taxpayers of Grundy County, and look forward to resolving this contract soon."

There are 10 sergeants represented by Teamsters Local 700 in Grundy County.

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Grundy County Cop, Horrie Of Gardner, Soon To Be ‘Gone Fishing’

After three decades serving Grundy County as a Sheriff’s deputy and investigator, Lt. Todd Horrie, Gardner, is taking off his badge and gun and joking he plans to put a sign on his old desk that says “gone fishing.”

He will officially retire as a county officer in June. The fishing reference is partly true, especially since Horrie began his law enforcement career as a conservation officer for two years before being hired as a night patrol officer for the Grundy County police.

When asked what he will do after retirement, he said he really had not thought about it, but knows he will get back to his love of outdoors, hunting and going fishing, thus the story about the sign on his desk.

The sign is especially appropriate since Horrie has not missed a single day of work since he began with the county July 15, 1986.

When he started as a night deputy, he worked with another young deputy at the time, Kevin Callahan. Callahan is now his boss as Grundy County Sheriff.

“We actually worked together as patrol deputies,” Callahan said. “We kind of went through the ranks together.”

Callahan said it is important for a police officer to move into different areas to prevent burnout, and Horrie took advantage of those opportunities.

From 1986 to 1990, Horrie was a road deputy. In 1990, he started with the Metropolitan Area Narcotics Squad which serves both Grundy and Will counties.

“It was a good bunch of guys,” Horrie remembers of his time with the narcotics squad. “We got a lot of good cases. One with actual bales of marijuana.”

After leaving the narcotics squad, he went back to night road patrol until 2000 when he was promoted to night sergeant in 2009. In 2013 he was promoted to investigations and is custodian of evidence

for the county police department.

Over the years, there have been many changes in law enforcement and society which has both helped and hindered his long career as a police officer.

He said a lot more work is done with computers, the internet and people’s cell phones.

“Nowadays, we get a cell phone and we know everything about that person,” Horrie said.

He said he has access to Federal Bureau of Investigation networks, and will work with the Drug Enforcement Agency, Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco and Firearms and Explosives and other federal agencies.

He said social media actually helps in a big way with some criminals that are using it, for example, to tell friends not to tell anyone about their activities.

“We can just go on a website and find things,” Horrie said. “You can find out a lot about a person and their family online. It’s nice to have these tools.”

Society has changed a lot over that time period, he added.

Back when he attended Gardner-South Wilmington High School, teens were involved with abusing alco-

hol and some marijuana.

“Nowadays, it’s crack cocaine and heroin,” Horrie said.

“A good percentage of thefts is all heroin-related,” he said.

“A lot of times they are stealing from their own family. Then they go to the grandmother or uncle and steal items right out of their houses.”

He said he had a case in 2011 when the thief asked to stay overnight at a family member’s home, and the next day, they discovered their X-box unit was stolen.

“It’s drugs and it’s just relentless in terms of residential burglaries and theft.”

And he said it’s everywhere. No small towns like Gardner and South Wilmington are exempt from the problem.

“It doesn’t want to die,” he said of the drug epidemic.

In Grundy County, however, law enforcement is taking a pro-active stance with a mental health court and drug court, allowing those addicted to substances to receive medical assistance, rather than be sentenced to jail time.

The new court system has only just begun, so he believes it is too early to determine the impact on such crimes as residential burglary and making a dent in drug

addiction.

Horrie is a 1983 graduate of GSW High school, the son of Mary Landers of Dwight and the late Leo Robert Horrie of Gardner.

He and his wife, Karen, have two children currently attending college, Abigail, age 22, and Scott, 19.

He said he is proud that he and his two children are all regional champions from GSW. He was a member of the 1982 basketball team that won the regional. Abigail was part of the 2013 regional and sectional championship softball team. Scott was part of the 2014 baseball regional championship team.

Horrie said he has stuck with his job, with a perfect attendance record for three decades, mostly because he enjoys the people he works with and the work atmosphere.

“I agree with that,” Callahan said. “I don’t remember a day when I’ve not wanted to go to work.”

Horrie has worked with four Sheriffs over his tenure, including Callahan, Gary Phillips, James Olson, and the late Terry Marketti, also of Gardner.

“He’s a dedicated guy who comes to work every day,” Callahan said. “He hasn’t missed a day. That’s rare in law enforcement.”

Dwight Water Treatment Plant Repairs Performed

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Amtrak Has Relatively Good Financial Year

When Amtrak President Joe Boardman announced in February of last year that Amtrak’s “cash position is becoming a concern” and later that “our ticket revenue projections for FY 2016 have gotten worse in February,” it appeared America’s railroad passenger service was heading for a repeat of the disastrous year of 2015 when Amtrak suffered \$306-million in operating losses.

The 2015 loss capped 46 consecutive years of operating losses, and more than \$16-billion since 1970, when Amtrak was created as a for-profit corporation by an act of Congress.

So a loss of only \$227-million in FY2016 (Oct. 1, 2015-Sept. 30, 2016) was greeted with some enthusiasm. It was the lowest operating loss for Amtrak since

1973, and due not only to cost-cutting measures, but an overall increase in ridership that resulted in a \$12-million increase in ticket revenue over that of FY2015.

As noted in the Feb. 1 *The Paper*, Amtrak ridership in Illinois continued to suffer in fiscal year 2016, but if

construction of the high speed rail system is at least somewhat concluded by the end of 2017, as has been promised, and/or if gasoline prices increase, those ridership numbers could improve.

Dwight’s new train station is ready.

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
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





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Livingston County Pheasants Forever Banquet March 20

The Livingston County Chapter of Pheasants Forever is holding its annual fund-raising banquet Monday, March 20, at the Pontiac Elks Club, with doors opening at 5:00 p.m. and dinner beginning at 6:00 p.m.

Doug Wessels, Livingston County chapter president, stated that the banquet is the single most important fund-raising event during the year. Everyone concerned with local ring-necked pheasants and wildlife populations in general is encouraged to attend. There will be food, prizes, and fun for people of all ages.

Since its inception in 1982, Pheasants Forever's wildlife habitat projects have benefited more than ten million acres across the continent. In that time, PF has participated in over 1,400 different land acquisitions with local, state and federal natural resource agencies, and all of those projects are today open to public hunting.

Since its inception in 1986, the Livingston County PF Chapter has been respon-

sible for investing nearly \$1,220,000 in seed, equipment, trees, and education projects to increase the habitat necessary to increase local pheasant populations.

Over 90% of the funds raised go into seed and projects in Livingston Co., using the money for habitat work with farmers and landowners in the immediate area.

"We also are working to create more opportunities for the youth in the county to get involved with PF through programs geared to the younger generations," Wessels added. "This could be in the form of hunting safety courses or possibly some hunting opportunities."

REAL ID Act Legislation Supported by Secretary White Passes Senate Committee

Illinois Secretary of State Jesse White has announced that REAL ID Act legislation, which authorizes the Secretary of State's office to offer customers the option to obtain either a REAL ID-compliant driver's license/identification card (DL/ID) or a noncompliant DL/ID, passed the Senate Executive Committee.

Illinois is currently REAL ID compliant through an extension granted by the U.S. Department of Homeland Security (DHS) in recognition of the state's recent improvements to the issuance process and security upgrades to the DL/ID design.

Senate Bill 674, which now goes to the full Senate for consideration, is sponsored by state Sen. Iris Martinez (D-Chicago) and is designed to give the public the right to choose between a REAL ID-compliant card and a noncompliant card, similar to other states that have been declared REAL ID-compliant by DHS.

The documents required to obtain a REAL ID-compliant card are more extensive than those required for a noncompliant card, such as showing identity and establishing legal presence. The main documents required to satisfy these federal requirements are U.S. passports, certified copies of birth certificates or federally-mandated immigration documents. The requirements to present these additional documents will apply to new applicants and to customers who have a current noncompliant DL/ID and choose to obtain a REAL ID-compliant card.

If customers do not wish to obtain the REAL ID-compliant card, they do not need to take in additional documentation. Noncompliant cards will be marked "Not for Federal Identification." According to the Transportation Safety Administration (TSA), individuals with noncompliant DL/IDs will be required to present an alternative to a

REAL ID-compliant DL/ID, such as a U.S. passport, which itself is considered REAL ID-compliant, to board an airplane or gain access to a military or federal facility.

Several states that have achieved full REAL ID compliance offer the public the choice between REAL ID-compliant and noncompliant cards. In Wisconsin, only 22 percent of citizens have chosen to apply for the REAL ID-compliant card. According to Wisconsin officials, many citizens who do not fly or have a reason to visit federal facilities or military bases have opted for the noncompliant card. This is also true in other states, such as Arizona, Nevada and West Virginia, that offer the two options.

The REAL ID Act is a federal mandate by DHS that sets standards for state-issued DL/IDs and prohibits federal agencies from accepting DL/IDs from states that do not meet the standards. Last summer, DHS acknowledged that the changes Illinois made to the issuance process and card design helped the state meet REAL ID standards. These changes produce a more secure driver's license and identification card, according to DHS.

White noted DHS has granted Illinois an extension of time through October of this year to become full REAL ID-compliant. In addition, DHS stated there will be no security changes at airports before Jan. 22, 2018. However, after this date, DHS clarified that citizens from states that are noncompliant and have not yet received an extension of time to become compliant will not be allowed to board airplanes unless they present an alternative acceptable document such as a U.S. passport. If necessary, Illinois still has the option of applying for another compliance extension for 2018.

According to DHS documents, the Secretary of State has satisfied approximately 90 percent of the REAL ID requirements. The office is currently working on the remaining ten percent that includes: procuring the funding to remodel and reconfigure the state's Driver Services facilities, moving the camera function to the front of the process and initiating an electronic verification procedure with the federal government to verify required identity documents, such as a birth certificate or a U.S. passport.

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I’m The Victim of a Violent Crime and I Could Use Your Help

Hi, I'm Dave Voigts. I'm a former naval officer and graduate of the United States Naval Academy. I've been doing public outreach to raise awareness of an unethical government program for a couple of years now. This program is similar to non-consensual human experiments such as the Tuskegee Experiment, Atomic Radiation Experiments on children with developmental disabilities, or the MKULTRA program—where citizens were surreptitiously dosed with LSD. Also, this program uses public harassment campaigns. There are at least 10,000 US citizens who are victims. There are many tens of thousands of victims abroad. The victims have been seeking assistance for decades, and the crimes committed against them are horrific.

A television program recently aired that describes the program well. Leah Remini was the lead actress in the CBS comedy King of Queens. She has produced and starred in a documentary series titled Leah Remini: Scientology and the Aftermath. Season 1 episodes are available On Demand and through Amazon Video. The most relevant episode is episode 2, titled Fair Game. This episode describes the organized harassment campaigns used on critics and former members of the Church of Scientology. Both victims and perpetrators describe how the harassment program works.

The episode introduces Mike Rinder, the former international spokesman for the church. In the opening minutes of the show he admits “Part of my job was to discredit and destroy critics who spoke out against the church. If someone was an enemy and needed to be silenced or destroyed it was my job, and I did it.” The show also introduces some of the reporters who wrote critical stories about the church. The show details the intimidation and smear tactics used to silence those reporters.

An example is the BBC reporter John Sweeney. He was portrayed as a ‘bald lunatic’ and alcoholic. Flyers were circulated in his neighborhood, he was picketed, and a technique called ‘gas-lighting’ was used to make him doubt his own sanity. Also, the program details the coercive situations the perpetrators were placed in. The program explains how Rinder was kept in a sort of church prison for two years, and part of his release required silencing Sweeney. There’s a video clip of Mike Rinder denying his own abuse to Sweeney. The episode then flash-forwards to an admission by Rinder that Sweeney was indeed a target for discrediting and that Rinder had been abused by the church.

I can tell you that these same tactics are used on thousands of Americans in various revenge and silencing campaigns. These tactics are criminal, and entire communities are fooled into participating. Furthermore, these harassment programs use a weapon that is both classified and illegal. For a detailed explanation of the weapon and tactics I recommend the books Project: Soul Catcher and How to Tame a Demon by Dr. Robert Duncan. Both titles are available through Amazon and other booksellers.

I heard about this program in the early 2000’s. It sounded odd at first, but after hearing the same story several times from different sources, I started to investigate. I learned that this is an off the shelf process that can be hired out and is illegal. I came up with a plan to get into the program so that I could learn enough to help expose and shut it down. Through the targeting process, I found something like 50 books written by victims. There are countless TV interviews and quite a few full television shows about the program. I’ve listened to hundreds of radio interviews on the topic as well.

As I wrote in a previous ad there have been several mass shootings caused by this program. In four of the cases there are emails, YouTube videos, and blog posts by the shooter discussing their harassment. You could watch one now by searching YouTube for “My Experience as A Targeted Individual” parts 1-3. The harassment Myron May describes is identical to the harassment portrayed in the Fair Game television episode. Also, The Kansas City Star, New York Times, and CNN all reported similar information when the last shooter Gavin Long went on a rampage in Baton Rouge.

The Fair Game episode discussed some of the community discrediting materials. It showed critical websites, blogs, flyers etc. about the targets. Also, there’s a scene discussing how a garbage man came to the target’s door and explained that he had been paid to deliver garbage to a private investigator. When confronted the private investigator claimed the target was under investigation for selling drugs. There is video of the interaction.

I would like to reiterate that I am a victim of one of these campaigns. I experienced the harassment described in the Fair Game episode. Additionally, I experience the torture described in the books Project: Soul Catcher and How to Tame a Demon. Going into the program, I knew quite a few of the pieces-parts and I was able to provide some useful input as to how my campaign would progress. I’ve published that information previously, and the effort may yield a path to success. Right now, I could use some help in recovering discrediting materials. If you know of any discrediting websites, flyers, videos, etc. or if you’ve heard of anyone from out of town trying to discredit me, please let me know. I can be reached through Facebook or at 815-830-5664. As stated before, there are tens of thousands of people in this program. These folks are counting on me, and you could help them by passing along information to me. Thank you for your time and assistance.

Oh and if you have time, take a look at the Kendrick Johnson gym mat death. Here’s the CNN video <http://www.cnn.com/2013/10/09/us/georgia-gym-mat-death/>. That should seem sufficiently weird. I believe that we can get more information about that case. I know the family has been waiting for a break in the case. Submit a news tip to CNN or any local news outlet. I'd be happy to pass along what I know.

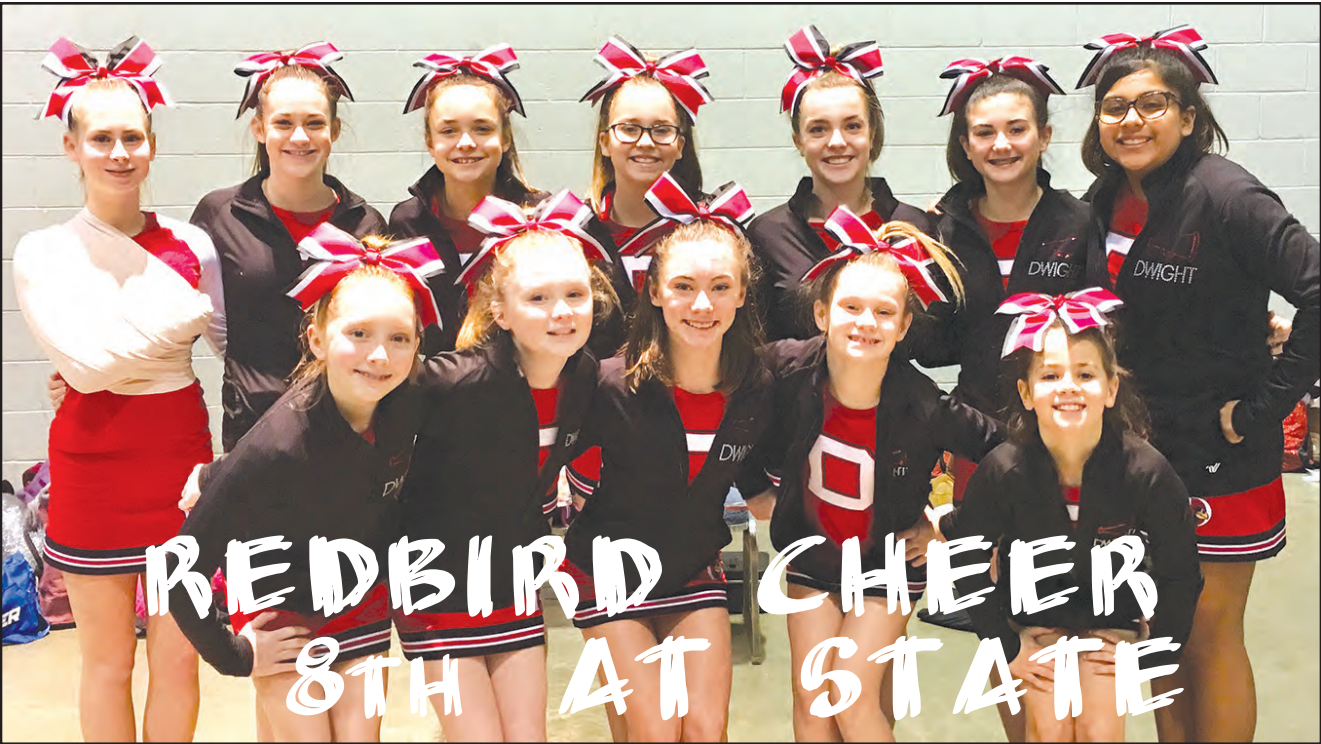

The Paper of Dwight is entering its final years as a teenager.

The Paper turned 18 years old today, with its first publication dated Feb. 15, 1999.

Mark and Mary Boma had a unique idea with their concept of a free circulation newspaper that is not just a shopper packed with advertising and nothing else.

The idea is to link the 20 towns (Herscher was added a few years after The Paper began publishing, reaching the current 21 towns).

The very name, The Paper, is to invoke the idea of not just one town’s newspaper.

Both Mary and I worked previously for her father and mother, Tom and Louise Tock, when they owned and operated Star Newspapers, a chain of five weekly newspapers covering basically the same territory as The Paper does now.

So the territory was known to Mary, and later myself when I joined as editor for three years (2003 to 2006).

Herscher was added to the circulation after I joined the team.

In the year 2005, the Bomas purchased the building that formerly housed Star Newspapers, 204 E. Chippewa, remodeled it and so Mary and I are again working in the same building together.

Prior to that, The Paper offices were on the top floor of the Keeley Building, 310 S. Prairie Ave., owned by Mary’s brother, Steve Tock.

At that time, the newspaper makeup was done with the old-fashioned cut and paste from type produced on MacIntosh computers.

The physical page paste-ups were transported via automobile to Morris, where they were photographed, and turned into press plates to be printed.

And the inserting of the newspaper advertising circulars was done by staff in a “garage” owned by Irv Masching (which got a little chilly in winter).

In 2005, Morris required The Paper to be paginated on the computer, eliminating the need for paper paste-ups.

That remains the current method of production, except it is now printed in Kankakee.

The business model developed by Mark and Mary Boma has stood the test of time. The Paper to tie those 21 towns together, and covering stories no one else even knows about.

The Paper has broken many stories that are later picked up by the surrounding daily newspapers.

And the advertisers have continued to support the publication over the years, allowing us to bring readers the news.

Congratulations, boss, on a great idea, and a great publication.

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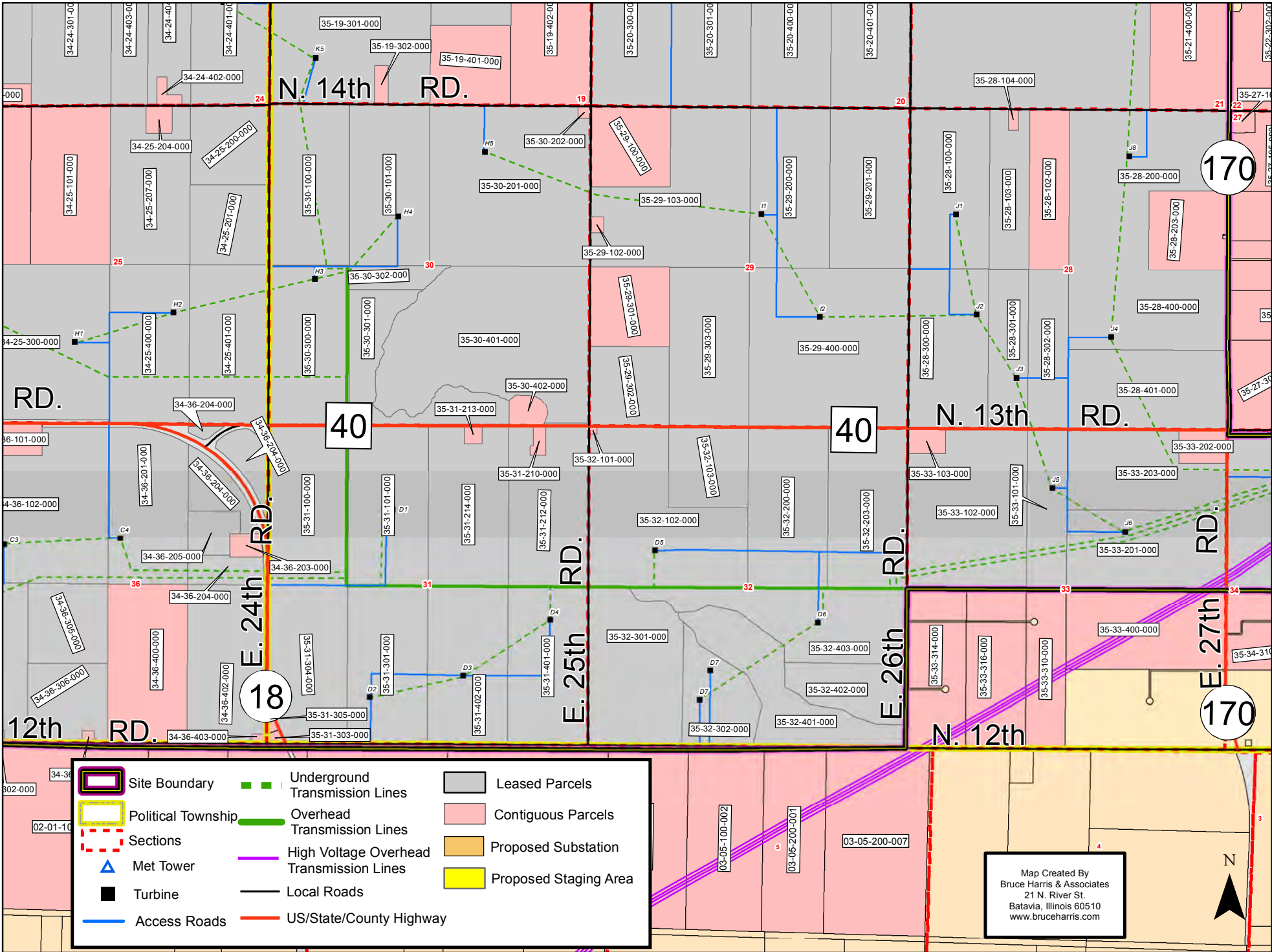
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Otter Creek Wind Farm - Overhead Transmission Map

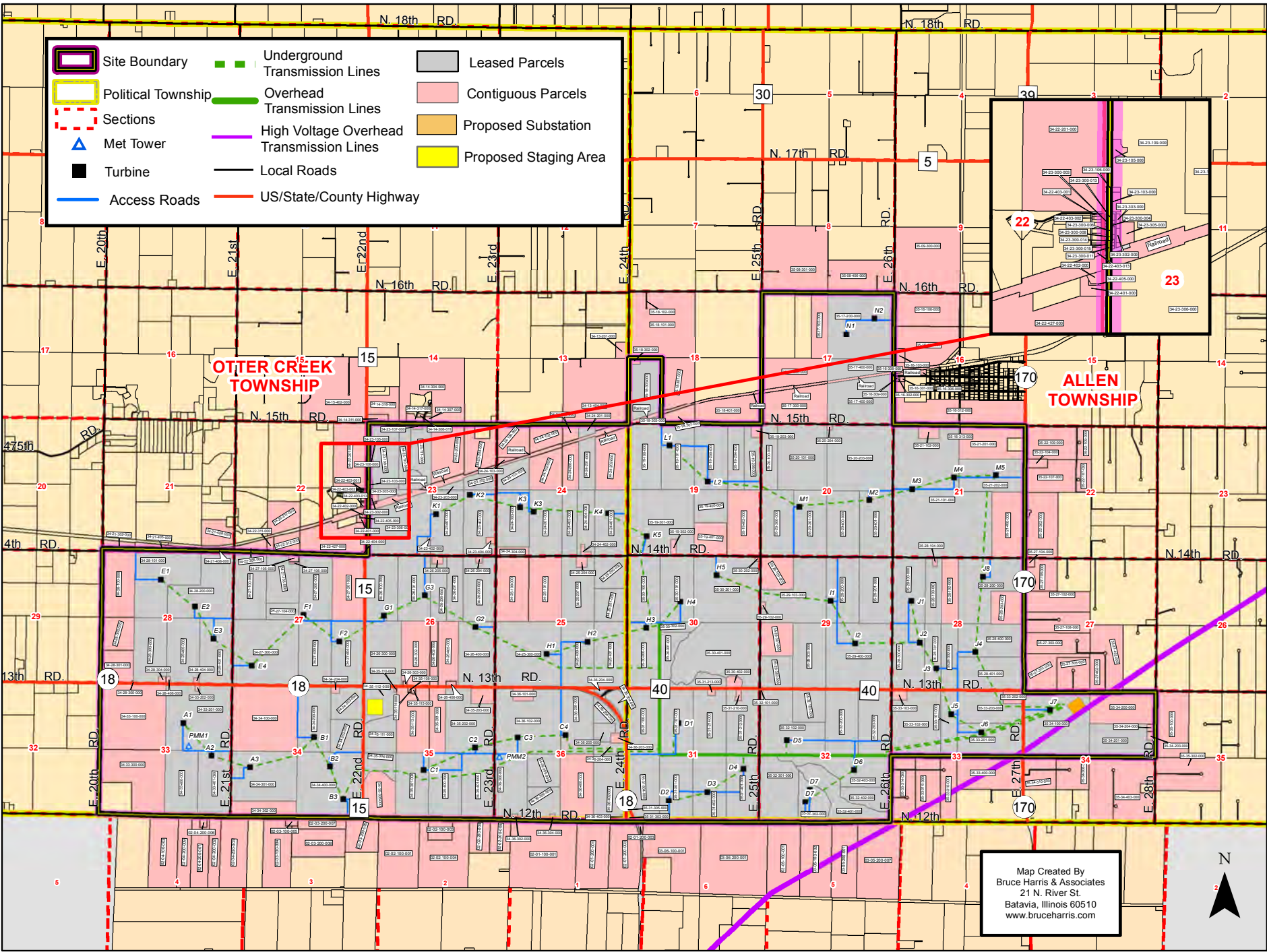
