## Dwight Artist's Lincoln Portrait To Be Unveiled On Building

An original Abraham Lincoln portrait by Dwight artist Cat Clausen that was sold to a patron in Springfield a few years ago will now be a mural on a building — a much bigger version of course.

And the man who bought the painting doesn't even know it. But now he likely will, since the mural will be unveiled at 5 p.m. today (May 17) at the five-story building, 421 E. Capitol.

A reception will follow at Hoogland Arts, 420 S. 6th St., Springfield.

"They are going to have some guys on the roof pull up a tarp," Clausen told *The Paper* last week.

The Lincoln portrait will be 18 feet, eight inches high

by 14 feet wide, printed on a laminated vinyl decal, similar to those decals used on race cars. The original was 48 inches high, Clausen said.

The building is "metal-clad" so such a sign is made for this type of surface.

She said it will last 20 years, and can be retouched after that, if needed. It will be on the north side of the building, "so it won't be blasted by the sun," Clausen explained.

The reproduction will be in black and white and will have her signature on it.

There will be a quote by Abraham Lincoln beneath the portrait:

*"In times like the present, men should utter nothing for which they would not willingly be responsible through time and eternity."*

"Jesse White owns the building," said Clausen, referring to the Illinois Secretary of State.

How this all happened is a rather twisted tale of chance, and Clausen finds it humorous that the actual owner of the original painting is not aware of this mural.

She said three years ago, Clausen was doing an art show, and this particular painting of Lincoln was on display for sale.

It was seen by a man named Dennis Bringuet of Springfield, who happens to own and operate Ace Sign Company of Springfield, a multi-generational sign company that makes signs nationwide.

"He said 'I'd like to put this on a building,'" Clausen

### Herscher Greenhouse Utilization

The Tri-Point School board will be appointing Superintendent Jeff Bryan to advocate a 1,640-foot wind turbine setback for the north-eastern portion of Livingston County.

There will be a public hearing held at 7 p.m., Thursday, June 8 at the historic county courthouse, 112 W. Madison, Pontiac.

The meeting is open to the public.

The County Board, meanwhile, has enacted an ordinance for a wind turbine setback of 3,250 feet for the county.

The hearing June 8 will be for those townships that

voted to go with a smaller setback of 1,600 feet. The townships of Nevada, Dwight, Round Grove, Odell, Union, Broughton, and Sullivan all voted yes on the 1,600-foot setback for wind turbines.

Tri-Point has property in Sullivan, Broughton and Round Grove townships.

In addition to an existing wind farm in the Tri-Point School district, there is one in the Odell Grade School district.

In *The Paper's* readership area, Saunemin and Sunbury townships voted against the shorter setbacks.

The referendum was held Tuesday, Nov. 8.

Superintendent Jeff

Bryan told *The Paper* last week that he will be advocating for a 1,640-foot setback because that is what manufacturers of wind turbines are recommending.

Bryan said the next logical place for a wind farm is Broughton Township, which is near where the current wind farm in the Odell area is located.

The hearing will establish an amendment to the county ordinance to allow the Northeast portion of Livingston County the setback of roughly 1,600 feet.

### Herscher Unit 2 Makes Decisions On Teacher's Union Requests

The Herscher Unit 2 school board giveth and taketh away.

Of four memorandums of understanding between the school's teacher's union and the board, one was approved and three were not approved at the BOE's Monday, May 8 meeting.

For overtime and summer school pay, the board will keep the pay at \$30 an hour and \$250 prep pay. The union was requesting that teachers be paid 10% of their salary.

For the middle school athletic director, no additional pay will be provided for the addition of seventh and eighth grade baseball.

However, the board agreed to the zero hour instruction request, which means that teachers who work in early bird classes are released from duty one hour early.

But the school district's high school athletic director stipend will remain at roughly \$10,000 despite a request to raise it.

The school board also passed a resolution to reprimand Bruce Richardson, Limestone grade music teacher, for "unprofessional and inappropriate" behavior. The tenured teacher could be fired if he does not comply with the resolution.

The board also was happy to give its "blessing" to a community group that wishes to form a junior high athletic booster organization.

- hired Michelle Armstrong as school district transportation administrator as of July 1.
- hired Chris Stutz as part-time secretary at Limestone Middle School.
- hired Dennis Denault as bus mechanic.
- hired Craig Bisailon as Limestone eighth grade baseball coach.
- hired Mike Cann as Limestone eighth grade softball coach.
- hired Kevin Downey as high school sophomore girls basketball coach.
- hired Kathy Astrella as high school cheerleading coach.
- hired Elizabeth Webb as high school volunteer assistant cheerleading coach.
- learned the status of the

This week is to honor the members of Dwight EMS, who are ready to provide lifesaving care to those in need, 24 hours a day, seven days a week.

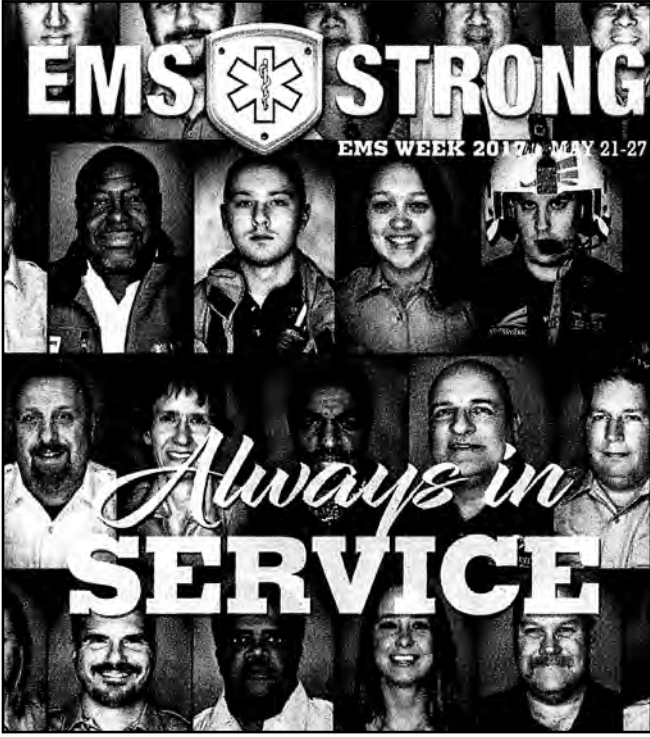

**Is Your Portfolio “Healthy”?**

May is National Physical Fitness and Sports Month. If you can exercise regularly, you’ll help yourself feel better, control your weight and even reduce the chances of developing certain diseases. But why not extend the concept of “fitness” to other areas of your life – such as your investment portfolio?

And to help maintain a healthy portfolio, you can draw on some of the same principles that apply to keeping your body in good shape.

Consider, for example, one of the things that happen when you exercise – namely, your body uses more oxygen. 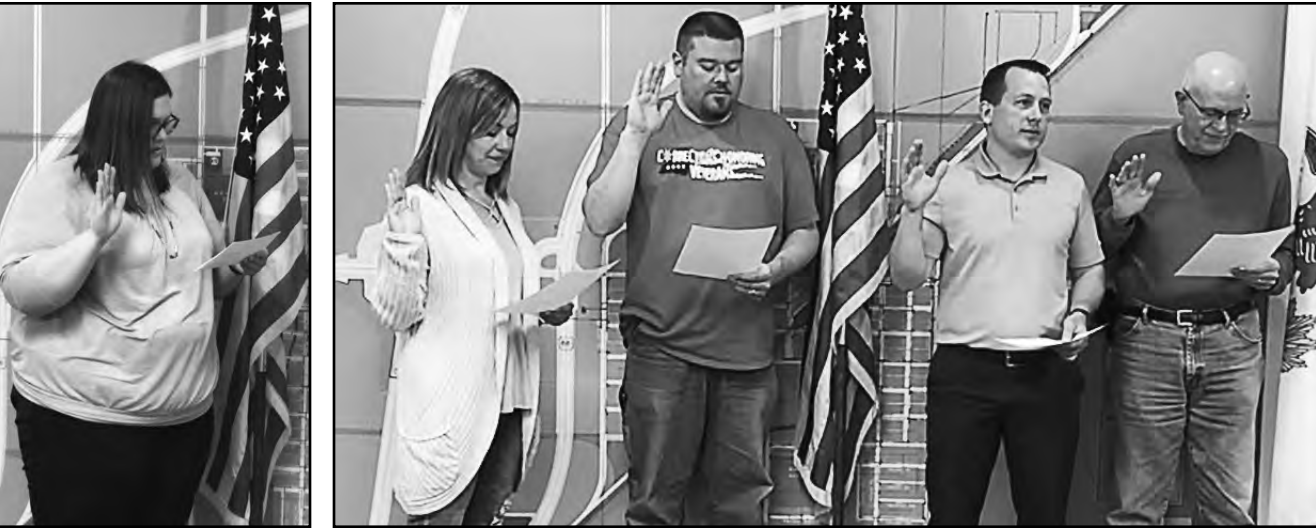

Moving to other business, the board approved an event request. The Dwight Economic Alliance will hold its annual Let’s Buzz the Gut Cruise Night on June 24.

The event will be held on East Main Street and occupy the roadway and the parking area on both sides of the park. Chippewa Street may also be used between East Main and Franklin Streets. East Main Street will close at noon that day. The event will include food vendors and static displays with music, door prizes and awards.

In reports to the board, Mayor Anderson reported that Governor Bruce Rauner’s motorcycle ride fund raiser will start from Dwight’s Ambler Becker station this year with the ride ending at the governor’s mansion in Springfield. The event is slated for September.

The Red Carpet Corridor weekend was a success. Organizers told Mayor Anderson this was the 11th year for the event and the best year so far. For Dwight, over 500 visitors to its historic Becker Ambler Station signed the guest book on Saturday of the weekend.

In public comment, it was asked if a postal mail box could be placed at the north end of West Main Street to allow for a driver’s side mail drop. Mayor Anderson indicated that it

could be requested but was not sure how the post office would accommodate pickup times at that location. It was pointed out that there is a drive-up postal box at the First National Bank that allows for mail drop on a vehicle’s driver’s side.

Questions were presented around the Wilmac Street bid process and its status. Per Village Administrator Kevin McNamara, of the five streets in the bid package, it is expected that plans for two of the streets will be submitted by the end of this month, with other three by end of June. The package will be put out for bid at that time. It was also noted that it is not unusual for primary and alternate bids to be submitted on street repair projects.

In other business, the board approved:

- payment of bills totaling \$64,917.92.
- fund transfer of \$84,474.81 from Referendum Fund (36) to Referendum Bond Fund

(47) for paying interest on Infrastructure Bond.

- fund transfer of \$27,225.00 from Water Fund (51) to Water Bond Fund (41) for paying interest on Water Bond.
- fund transfer of \$210,544.00 from Capital Expenditures Fund (38) to the TIF Fund (19) for paying interest on TIF Bond and downtown construction projects.

- \$51,714.93 from the Sewer Fund (52) to the Sewer Replacement Reserve Fund (33) for paying interest and principal on IEPA loan.
- the 2017/18 Water/Sewer Rate Resolution (water rates will NOT increase).
- an Ordinance increasing impoundment fees from \$350 to \$500.
- appointment of Janice Lauritzen to the Historic Preservation Committee.

## Hearing Officer: Mautino ‘willfully violated’ Election Board’s Requests

The saga of Illinois Auditor General Frank Mautino’s proper or improper spending and disclosure of campaign fund spending while Mautino was a 76th District State Representative may be nearing a conclusion.

The Illinois State Board of Elections met Monday, May 15, to consider a recommendation from Philip Krasny, who presided over an April 20 hearing in Chicago concerning the alleged improper use and reporting of expenditures by Mautino and his campaign committee.

Krasny limited his report to whether or not Mautino and his committee had “willfully violated” the State Board of Elections’ requests to document the recipients of expenditures Mautino and his campaign committee made to Happy’s Super

Service in Spring Valley, and to the Spring Valley City Bank.

Krasny stated that he was not offering any decision as to whether any of Mautino’s expenditures to the service station and bank were improper, only that Mautino and his committee had “willfully violated” the board’s requests for information concerning those expenditures.

Krasny recommended to the Board of Elections that Mautino and his campaign committee be penalized for their violation of the board’s requests, and that the board continue to address the propriety of the actual expenditures made to the service station and bank.

**On Monday, May 15, the ISBE imposed a \$5,000 fine against Mautino’s campaign committee, but took no further action.**

## Rt. 66 Red Carpet Tour Events Successful For Gardner

“It was a fantastic weekend,” said Ida Schopp, who gave the Gardner Village Council a report on the Route 66 Red Carpet Corridor Weekend at its May 8 meeting.

She said the Rock-a-thon raised \$1,200 for youth in Gardner to attend Vacation Bible School.

“That was well above our goal,” Schopp said. “I want to thank everyone for contributing. So now every child can go to Bible School without paying.”

She said the Gardner Archives were open for those touring Route 66, and mothers were each handed a pink carnation.

Two door prizes (two \$25 gas cards donated by Mayor Mike Serena) were won by Don Mack and Cathy Feinman.

Schopp said the car show brought in \$116 for the Gardner food pantry plus a pickup truck full of food donations.

“Don Phillips’ music was excellent,” she said.

Dan Alexander, who coordinates the car show, said the Scapegoat Car Club was able to obtain the services of an Elvis impersonator which drew crowds. He said a person from France was in Gardner for the festivities, and one of the cars came from as far away as Bridgeville, Illinois.

Alexander added that downtown restaurants were packed and the fire department did training during the weekend, which attracted visitors to the downtown area.

The fire department training drew criticism from Councilman Terry Jensen who said in addition to extrication classes, which were authorized by Mayor Serena, the fire department burned cars, which is against Environmental Protection Agency regulations.

“There was black smoke coming out of those cars,” Jensen said.

He said if there were complaints of asthma attacks during the burning, the village could be liable.

“You cannot burn over there,” Jensen said. “This could open up the village for a huge lawsuit. What if someone had an asthma attack? They can’t burn and they knew that.”

Jensen requested the Mayor write a letter stating they did not have permission to burn the cars, to which Serena agreed.

“I had no idea there would be burning involved,” Serena stated.

After the extrication classes were done, another fire department in attendance put a small amount of paper in the back of a van. lit it on fire and put it out quickly, according to a spokesman for the Gardner Department.

“They were just trying to give new recruits experience,” using water hoses to put out a fire, the spokesman said. She said it was the wrong time and place. Those involved were reprimanded.

In other business, the board:

- heard a complaint from Sharon Pickles that the O’Hare Trucking business area is “the worst I’ve ever seen it.” Commissioner James Riley said that the village attorney Scott Belt had been instructed to write a letter to the business to get it cleaned up.

- transferred \$12,000 to the IMRF retirement fund to tide the fund over until tax money comes in later this year.

- learned that Sharon Pickles is the new head of the Senior Citizens in town.

- will be exploring an ordinance to rescind one that requires the board meetings have an attorney present at each meeting.

- heard a suggestion from Commissioner Dick Hileman that those businesses who bring in sales tax revenue should have a corresponding rebate on property taxes. This idea will be discussed further.
