OSF Ready To Unveil New Medical Facility *Open House Planned On Aug. 19*

OSF HealthCare Medical Group had served the community for nearly 30 years at 105 John St. in Dwight. On Aug. 19, they will celebrate their new \$2.8 million, 7,800-square-foot facility at 107 Watters Drive with an open house.

Dr. Maulin Shah, who served at the former location, and new Advanced Practice Nurse Carrie Cullick, along with office staff, will be at the open house to answer questions and give guided tours. Attendees are being asked to bring a school supply item to be donated to Dwight schools for children in need.

The new office opened to patients on July 16, said Pam Meiner, community relations coordinator with OSF HealthCare Saint James – John W. Albrecht Medical Center.

The former facility had been open for nearly three decades but in recent years was not large enough to accommodate patients' needs, particularly when it came to physical therapy services, Meiner said. The new building has dedicated space for physical therapy.

It also has x-ray technology, something the former building did not offer. There are nine exam rooms, physical therapy, expanded office hours, and early access for laboratory testing.

Patients will find everything from allergy shots, blood draws and EKGs to school and sports physicals, wellness exams and vaccinations, well baby care and well women's exams.

OSF HealthCare is a Catholic faith-based health care organization owned and operated by The Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis in Peoria. They have 13 acute care facilities and more than 150 primary care and specialist offices as well as neuroscience, pediatric, cardiovascular and home care services serving Illinois and the Upper Peninsula of



Dr. Shah graduated from Midwestern University in Downers Grove and completed his residency in family medicine at Firelands Regional Medical Center in Sandusky, Ohio. His areas of expertise include diabetes, hypertension and sports medicine.

Cullick begins on Aug. 12. She has been a nurse since 1996 with experience in surgical intensive care, post-anesthesia care, intensive care, and primary care, Meiner said. New Dwight Emmanuel Lutheran Church Minister: *'I believe God wanted me here'*

For the past 20 years, Pastor John Mueller has taught religion on more of a Monday through Friday schedule than early Sunday mornings. He spent nearly two decades teaching ethics and world religion to students at Valley Lutheran High School in Saginaw, Mich.

But when Emmanuel Lutheran Church in Dwight called upon him to serve its congregation, there was no other choice but to say yes.

"I believe God wanted me here," Mueller said.

He replaces Pastor Daniel Ognoskie, who served from 1999-2016. Emmanuel was served by a "vacancy pastor," Rev. Harvey Nicholson, from January 2016- June 2018.

Pastor Mueller arrived in June. The church is located at 325 E. Mazon Ave.

Mueller, 62, was raised Lutheran and has raised his own family in the house of God. He graduated from Jefferson High School in Cedar Rapids, then went on to earn his Bachelor's Degree with a double major in Physics and Religion from Luther College in Decorah, Ohio. He graduated from Concordia Seminary in St. Louis in 1982 with his Master of Divinity. In 2015, he earned his Doctor of Ministry from Concordia.

"A pastor at the church my family attended suggested the idea to me when I was in about seventh grade. My dad occasionally asked if I had considered being a pastor as I moved through high school," Mueller said.

"In college I discovered an interest in theology, and that I was not really interested in the corporate world," Mueller said.

"When I visited the seminary and spoke to the registrar in early August he told me to be there when classes began about three weeks later -- and I hadn't yet submitted an application. So God's hand was in all of those events, to lead me in this direction."

His first assignment was at Trinity Lutheran Church in Sturgis, Mich., from 1982-88. He then spent 11 years at Good Shepherd Lutheran Church in Caseville, Mich., before teaching the 330 students at Valley Lutheran. Outside the classroom, he organized chapel and the student council and coached softball.

Now in Dwight, Mueller and his wife of 38 years, Kathrin, have quickly settled in. "My wife and I enjoy being here," he said.

He and Kathrin have four children and 10 grandchildren. Faith seems to run in their blood.

His son, Stephen Mueller, is pastor at Concordia Lutheran Church in Geneseo. His daughter Becky, who is trained as a Lutheran teacher, is married to Christopher Amen, the pastor at St. Peter's Lutheran Church in Arlington, Wis.

Another son-in-law, Erik Sorenson, is pastor at St. Peter Evangelical Lutheran Church in Waymansville, Ind. Wife Michelle is trained as a director of Christian education.

Mueller's daughter Bethany and husband Shaun give to the community as well. She is a case worker for the state of Missouri and he is a supervisor at a group home.

Mueller has served in circuit and district pastoral advisory roles for the Michigan district of the church. He loves photography, woodworking and gardening.

He also hopes to introduce Bible class during the week, and offer outreach programs, such as to those who are caregivers to elderly parent. He wants to bring more biblical education to Emmanuel Lutheran, and wants to encourage more members to invite family and friends who don't know the teachings of Jesus.

Active Shooter Scenario Studied at Dwight High School

More than 40 educators and law enforcement officials attended a training session Wednesday and Thursday of last week in Dwight High School to prepare for an active shooter situation. Two industries were also represented.

The training session, known as ALICE, an acronym for Alert - Lockdown - Inform - Counter - and Evacuate, was coordinated by Gary Beier, Dwight Schools Resource Officer.

Edward Dorff, a former U. S. Marine and an educator for 34 years in Wisconsin, was instructor for the training sessions.

Classroom sessions and active training took place over two days, with Dwight participants being Detective Beier; police officer, Mike Nolan; police chief, Tim Henson; high school principal, Dan Kaiser; Dwight grade school assistant principal, Julie Schultz; and Logan Murray, tech coordinator at both Dwight schools.

Participants in the training sessions were almost equally divided between educators and law enforcement officials. The Herscher area was represented with 10 attendees.

Beier was the “bad guy” in the active training sessions, during which the others worked to apply either the Lockdown, Evacuate, or Counter measures.

Most Livingston County schools have had training sessions with the ALICE program.

Several Grundy County schools are preparing to take the sessions, according to Beier.



How Can You Help Your Kids Pay for College?

It's still summer, but we're getting close to a new school year. One day, though, "back-to-school" will mean "off to college" for your children. Will you be financially prepared to help your kids cope with the costs of higher education?

Your first step, of course, is to know what you're up against, so here are some numbers: For the 2017-18 academic year, college costs (tuition, fees, room and board) were, on average, nearly \$21,000 for in-state students at four-year, public schools and nearly \$47,000 for students attending private colleges or universities, according to the College Board. And you can probably expect even bigger price tags in the years to come.

To help prepare for these costs, you might want to consider putting your money in a vehicle specifically designed to help build assets for college, such as a 529 education savings plan. All withdrawals from 529 plans are free from federal income taxes as long as the beneficiary you've named uses the money for qualified college, trade school or graduate school expenses. Withdrawals for expenses other than qualified education expenditures may be subject to federal, state and penalty taxes on the earnings portion of your plan. (However, tax issues for 529 savings plans can be complex, so please consult your tax advisor before investing.)

You can generally invest in the 529 savings plan offered by any state, but if you invest in your own state's plan, you may be able to claim a tax deduction or receive a tax credit.

By starting your 529 plan early, when your children are just a few years old, the investments within the plan have more time for potential growth. Plus, you can make smaller contributions each year, rather than come up with big lump sums later on.

A 529 plan is not the only education-savings tool you can use, but it has proven effective for many people. Yet you may also want to consider ways to keep college costs down in the first place.

For one thing, your children may be eligible for various forms of financial aid. Some types of aid depend on your family's income, but others, such as merit-based scholarships, are open to everyone. But you don't have to wait until you get an offer from a school's financial aid office – you can explore some opportunities on your own. For example, many local and national civic and religious groups offer scholarships to promising young people, and your own employer may even provide some types of grants or assistance. Plus, your state also may offer other benefits, such as financial aid or scholarship funds. It can certainly take some digging to find these funding sources, but the effort can be worthwhile.

Here's another option for reducing college costs: Consider sending your child to a local community college for two years to get many of the "general" requirements out of the way before transferring to a four-year school for a bachelor's degree. Community colleges are typically quite affordable, and many of them offer high-quality programs.

A college degree is costly, but many people feel it's still a great investment in their children's future. And by taking the appropriate steps, you can help launch that investment.

2 Arrested in Pontiac For Cocaine Possession

On July 23, the Dwight Narcotics Unit, along with the Livingston County Pro-Active Unit, conducted a narcotics investigation that resulted in a search warrant located at 927 E. Water St. in Pontiac.

During the investigation, Facionda I. Washington, 27, of Pontiac, and Alicia S. Wallace, 28, of Pontiac, were arrested on four counts of Unlawful Delivery of a Controlled Substance (cocaine).

During the search warrant, several drug dealing items were seized, including

electronic scales, baggies, cocaine, cannabis, U.S. currency, and numerous drug paraphernalia items.

Both subjects were transported to the Livingston County Jail awaiting bond hearings.

Agencies that assisted with the investigation were the Pontiac Police Department, Livingston County Sheriff's Police, Dwight Police Department, Pontiac TRT Unit, Livingston County K-9 Unit, and the Livingston County State's Attorney's Office.

St. Pat’s 150th Celebrations

Parishioners at St. Patrick Catholic Church in Dwight have worked tirelessly over the last year researching, planning and getting ready for this weekend: It’s sesquicentennial, 150 years of faith.

With a blessing from Pope Francis, the church and Father Chris Haake have events scheduled Thursday through Sunday.

The church was appointed on Aug. 9, 1868, thanks to Richard P. Morgan, one of Dwight’s founding fathers, who donated land for a much-needed Roman Catholic church for early settlers who wanted a home to worship. St. Pat’s has seen three churches since then, their current location in a red brick building built in 1970 on West Mazon Avenue. More than 250 families are served there.

Everyone is invited to celebrate with the church. Here is a list of events.

Thursday Aug. 9, the official date of St. Pat’s inception, there will be a spiritual evening of music and adoration at the church at 6:30 p.m. Music will be led by Michael James Mette and his family, the MJM7 Band.

7 p.m. Saturday Aug. 11 will have family entertainment and an ice cream social

in the parish hall. The program includes highlights from the church’s history, interviews with longtime parishioners Peggy Fogarty, Theresa McNamara and Tom Tock, and concludes with singing by Mary Pfeifer. Photos chronicling the history of the parish will be on display.

10:30 a.m. Aug. 12 will be the anniversary Mass with Bishop Daniel Jenky and Father Chris Haake. A sesquicentennial book with history and photos will be handed out. A parish picnic in Renfrew Park in Dwight begins at 1 p.m. for parishioners and guests.

Village of Dwight Electric Aggregation Program

Following the passage of a March 2012 voter referendum, the Village of Dwight contracted to procure lower-cost electric supply for residents and small businesses.

The village recently renewed the program and contracted with lowest bidder Dynegey Energy at the low fixed rate of 6.813¢ per kWh for a 36-month term ending October 2021. This new rate is **lower than** the Village’s last aggregation program rate of 6.838¢.

Meanwhile, the ComEd rate has risen a

half cent per kWh this year.

There is no enrollment fee to join, and no early termination fee should ratepayers decide to leave the program.

ComEd supply rate, October 2018 to May 2019: 7.941¢ per kWh.

Dwight rate, October 2018 to October 2021: 6.813¢ per kWh.

A notice of the program will be mailed to residents and small business owners in August.





Lights, Camera, Action for HBO’s New Series

Actors, producers and crew members pulled into town this week to film in several locations in Dwight and Odell for HBO’s new series “Lovecraft Country.”

Dwight Township High School was the staging point for 120 cast and crew members, said Superintendent Rich Jancek. It was just a few weeks ago that he was contacted by an assistant location director to use the school’s facilities, he said with excitement in his eyes.

“Actors are rolling in right now,” he said Monday afternoon.

The series is based on Matt Ruff’s 2016 novel of the same name. Set in the 1950s, it follows Army veteran Atticus Black as he joins up with his friend Letitia to embark on a road trip across Jim Crow America in search of his missing father. This begins a struggle to survive and overcome the racist terrors of white America.

The HBO version of the drama horror series stars up-and-coming 28-year-old actor Jonathan Majors as Atticus and Jurnee Smollett-Bell as Letitia. The series is being produced by Academy Award-winner Jordan Peele through his company Monkey Paw Productions. Peele’s 2017 directorial debut, the horror film “Get Out,” earned critical

acclaim and was a box office success. He received numerous accolades, including an Oscar for Best Original Screenplay, along with nominations for Best Picture and Best Director.

Equipment began arriving in the parking lot of the high school over the weekend. By Monday afternoon, there were a dozen trailers, security and even a mobile kitchen. Jancek said the actors will be staying on site, and will use the cafeteria for meals.

Jancek said they are filming in 15 separate locations for the series, among them the historic gas station on Old Route 66 in Odell, and a rural farmhouse a few miles outside Dwight. He said producers liked the exterior of the farmhouse, but wanted to give the interior a 1950s look. They’ve been renovating it over the last several weeks, and once filming is complete, crews will return the interior to how the owners originally had it.

On Monday, Jancek had his eyes peeled for a producer, hoping they would allow Dwight drama students and teachers to observe the filming up close.

He was also keeping an eye out for one of his favorite producers. “I wouldn’t mind getting my picture taken with Jordan Peele,” he quipped.

Sunday Night Baseball

Last night I was taking in the Sunday Night Baseball game between the Boston Red Sox and the New York Yankees. These two teams always seem to end up on Sunday night, and this Sunday night was no different.

The game itself ended up being a very long, but very great game, it went into extra innings, and lasted until almost midnight. It involved the Yankees closer Aroldis Chapman blowing the save in the 9th inning, which brought back a very bad flashback of the Cubs almost losing the world series in 2016 with him doing a similar thing.

Have this be on record as me supporting the extra inning, guy on base rule, so in 20 years, when it's common practice and enjoyed, I was here in full agreement of that.

Coach Paul Olsen's final Viking outfit also earned All-Academic Team honors. With a team



DTHS Honor Student Attends Congress, Forms New Program

Honor student Andrew Myzia attended The Congress of Future Science and Technology Leaders in Boston, MA June 29 – July 1.

The Congress is an honors-only program for high school students who are passionate about science, technology, engineering or mathematics (STEM). The purpose of this event is to honor, inspire, motivate and direct the top students in the country, who aspire to be scientists and technologists, to stay true to their dream, and, after the event, to provide a path, plan and resources to help them reach their goal.

Myzia was nominated by Dr. John C. Mather, winner of the Nobel Prize in Physics and Science Director of the National Academy of Future Scientists and Technologists, to represent Dwight Township High School.

During the three-day Congress, Myzia joined students from across the country to hear Nobel Laureates and National Medal of Science recipients talk about leading scientific research, was given advice from deans of the world's top tech universities, and was inspired by fellow teen science prodigies. He also learned about cutting-edge advances and the future of science and technology.

While at the Congress, Myzia was inspired to not only reach out to our community, but help fellow students in the process. With that in mind, Myzia has founded a local organization called "S.T.E.M.M."

These will be held once a month with different S.T.E.M.M. topics being presented. 

Area Veterans to Take Land of Lincoln Honor Flight Aug. 21

When the next Land of Lincoln Honor Flight takes off from Springfield's Abraham Lincoln Capital Airport on Aug. 21, there will be a veteran representing Dwight on the flight.

Ronald Barnett served in "The Forgotten War" - Korea. He was a Marine, and will join 52 other veterans on the trip to Washington, D.C.

Joan Bortoloni, president of the non-profit Land of Lincoln Honor Flight, said this is the fourth trip this year thanks to generous donors in their central and mid-Southern Illinois division. The flights are completely free to veterans, and on the Aug. 21 flight will be one World War II veteran, 19 Korean War veterans and 65 Vietnam War-era veterans - all excited to visit and reflect with their

comrades at their national memorials. These veterans represent all branches of military service: nine Air Force, 49 Army, eight Marine, 18 Navy and one Coast Guard.

"It's our turn to pay them back," Bortoloni said. "They've paid enough."

Each veteran is accompanied by a guardian. They will arrive at the airport at 4:15 a.m., representing 40 Illinois cities and communities.

Once they arrive at Ronald Reagan National Airport, the veterans will board three luxury motor coaches and be escorted to the World War II, Korean and Vietnam War memorials, as well as Arlington National Cemetery for the Changing of the Guard ceremony at the Tomb of the Unknowns. Other stops include the Lincoln

Memorial, the National Air & Space Museum in Chantilly, Va., and the U.S. Air Force Memorial.

They return to Springfield around 9:30 p.m. and with each flight the general public, along with friends and family, are encouraged to "pack the 'port" to welcome the heroes home. People arrive early, often wearing red, white and blue and carrying balloons and posters. "Words of thanks, handshakes, hugs and kisses are also allowed," Bortoloni said.

Veteran applications continue to be accepted with flight priority given in the following order: World War II (enlisted by 12/31/1946), then Korean War Era (01/01/1947 to 12/31/1957), followed by the Vietnam War Era (01/01/1958 to

05/07/1975). Any certified terminally ill veteran should contact Land of Lincoln Honor Flight directly. Veteran or guardian applications can be found at LandofLincolnHonorFlight.org and clicking on Applications tab.

There are two more chartered flights scheduled this year, costing about \$65,000 to put a flight in the air, Bortoloni said, which is why they rely so heavily on donations. Guardians pay \$475, and they are always looking for volunteers - "the chance to spend the day with a hero," she said.

Third Man Arrested in Gardner Bank Robbery

A third man has been arrested in the robbery of a Gardner bank.

Joshua Parsons, 28, of Gardner, was taken into custody on Aug. 3 after Grundy County Sheriff's Office detectives obtained an arrest warrant.

He was charged with robbery, burglary and theft and remains in custody at the Grundy County Jail.

According to a press release from Sheriff Kevin Callahan, Parsons played a pivotal role in the robbery but did not elaborate.

Two other men, Corey S. Canterbury, 22, of Gardner, and Daytona Fisher, 22, of Braceville, were arrested July 26, the day after the robbery. It took place July 25 just before 4 p.m. when investigators said Canterbury entered First Midwest Bank in Gardner, demanded money and fled on a black motorcycle wearing a black helmet and pink backpack, Callahan previously reported.

Canterbury did not display a weapon. Prosecutors say Fisher provided Canterbury with the motorcycle and helmet, according to published reports.
