Fall Benchmark Testing

Fall benchmark testing (MAP & FastBridge) have been completed. Please see the attached documents with school-wide averages and grade-level performance. These reports include data from all students including those with individualized education plans (IEPs) working independently with no support.

FastBridge was adopted this year taking the place of AimsWeb. National normative data standard percentile ranges would expect 15% of students to be in the red and/or at risk category. Reports are attached by grade levels with very favorable results.

FastBridge earlyMath (K-1st): 75% low risk, 15% some risk and 10% high risk

FastBridge eMath (2nd-8th): 16% College Pathway, 35% low risk, 35% some risk and 14% high risk

FastBridge earlyReading (K-1st): 63% low risk, 27% some risk and 10% high risk

FastBridge eReading: 24% College Pathway, 32% low risk, 27% some risk and 17% high risk

MAP reports are consistent with the FastBridge data as well which is exactly what we want to see in order to have a better picture of student performance.

MAP Math: K and 1st grade reports show high achievement; 3rd grade is just short of the high achievement range by one percent. All other grades are in the average achievement range.

MAP Reading: 1st grade reports show high achievement with all other grades are in the average achievement range.

As stated last year, we will continue to strive to see above average growth and achievement for our students when we review Winter data.
